- Bring **pictures (photos or drawings) of scout, dad, mom, and grandparents** to be pasted onto the back of each corresponding shape.

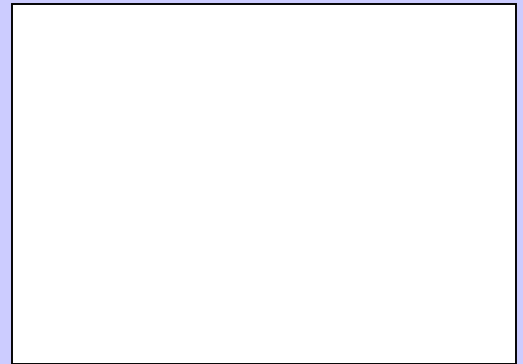

Family Tree Mobile Instructions

Date: January 6, 2003

Earns: Art pin #5, Heritages belt loop #3, Achievement #8D, Art Arrow Point #9A

Supplies: hangers, poster board/cardboard, hole punch, yarn or paperclips, pens, glue stick, generic face pictures; boys bring pictures of themselves, parents, and grandparents.

Discussion: While the boys are working on the project: Explain what a family tree is, how you are related to pas. Comment on how you can learn about history and what it was like long ago. Ask boys to share their experiences with their family.

Activity: Glue whole page of shapes onto poster board/cardboard and cut out each shape. On the reverse of each shape, glue the corresponding picture of the person. If no picture is available, have the boys can choose a generic face picture from the selection. Attach shapes to hanger as shown below.
