What Is A Medallion?

A medallion is what you make from a set of folds. These form a design that you can place on cards, tags, etc.

Are They Hard To Make?

No, as you will see with this guide.

What Is Layering?

This is when you place another medallion on top of another, in effect adding another layer to the effect.

As with all the Volumes, I have not placed any page numbers so that you can keep this guide as I have written it, or take the medallion pages and place them next to the relevant fold pages.

All will need to do is use your glue stick to stick the completed folds as shown in this Volume.

The problem with some medallions is that you will have to tuck the last one completed fold underneath the first one to complete the medallion. This will come with practice.

Another thing is not to worry if you have a small gap in the centre of your medallion. You can always cover it with a gem, glitter or even use the **Converter Fold** to cover it up.

When you see all those perfect medallions and folds in books, remember that they have had to fold hundreds of tiles to make them fit together like that.

I don't know about you, but I like my cards to look hand made, and that includes little imperfections.

Some of the medallions created in this guide can be quite big, so if you want a smaller version, remember to use the **Converter Fold** to allow you to take you to position **A** of most folds.

Well that's the boring bit over, lets get on with the fun bit!

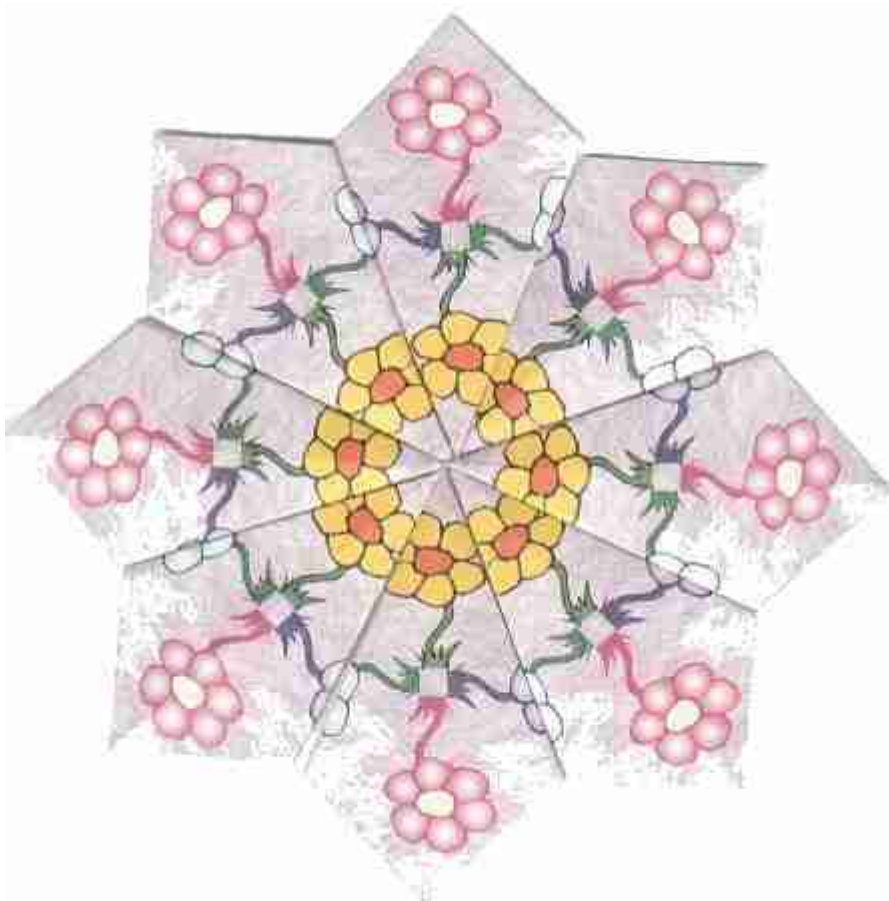

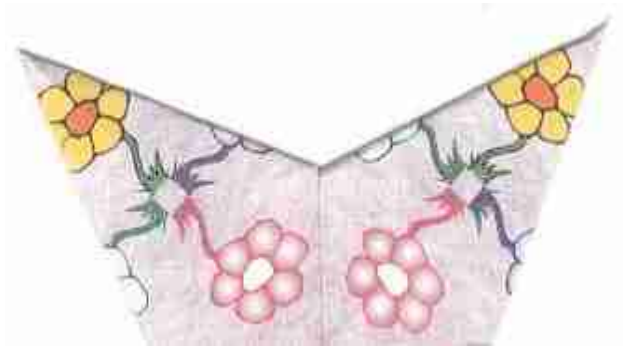

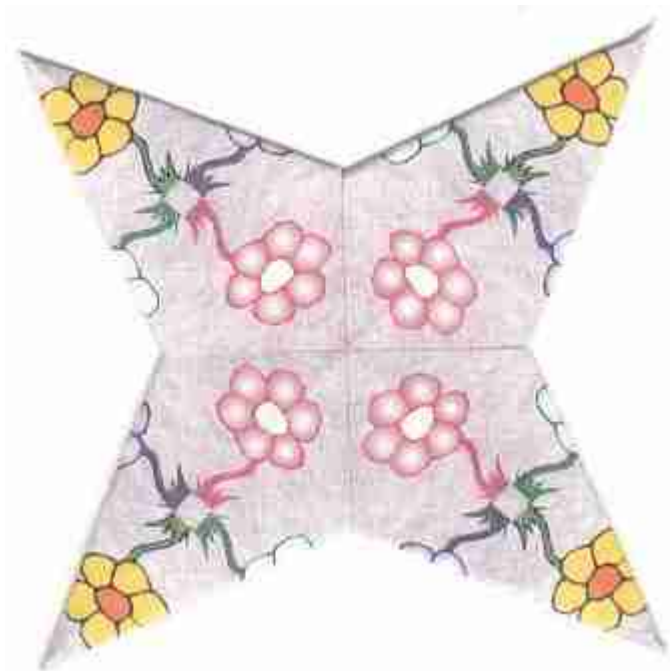
This medallion takes 8 completed folds.

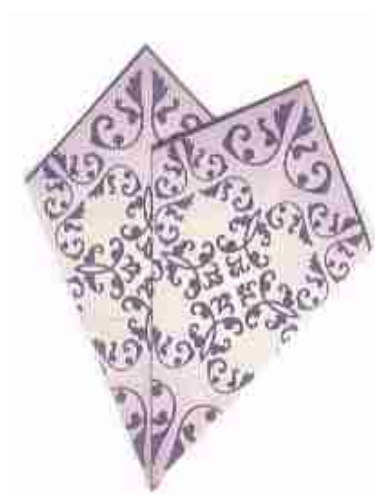

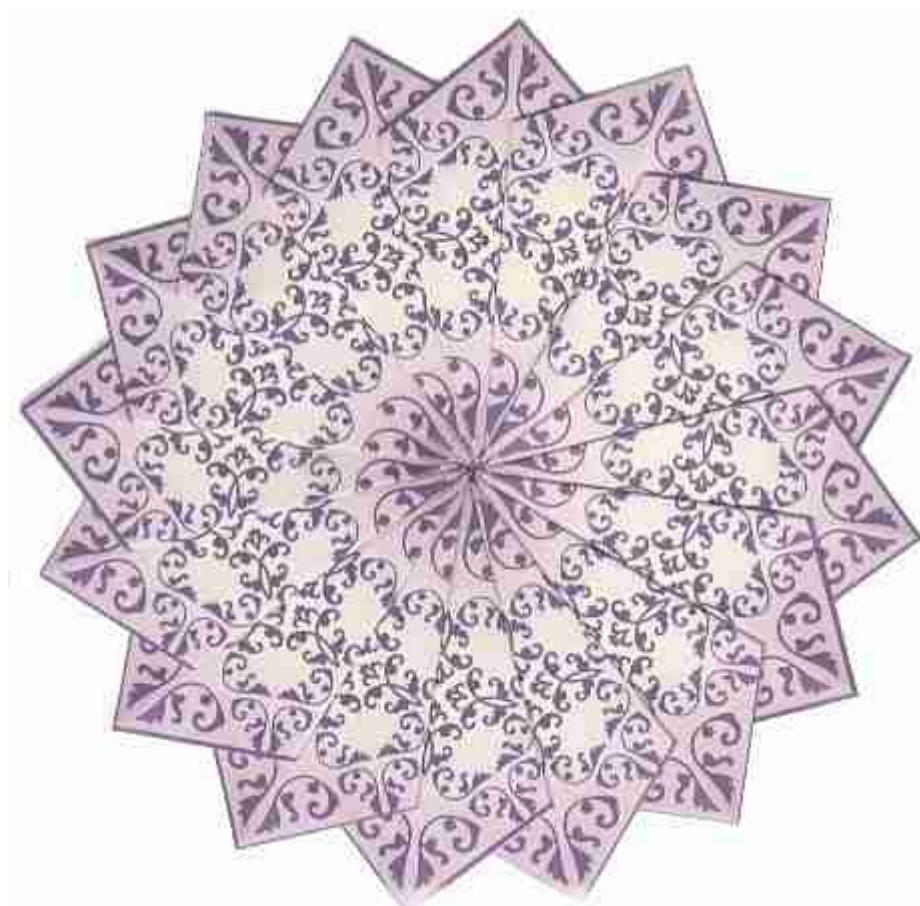

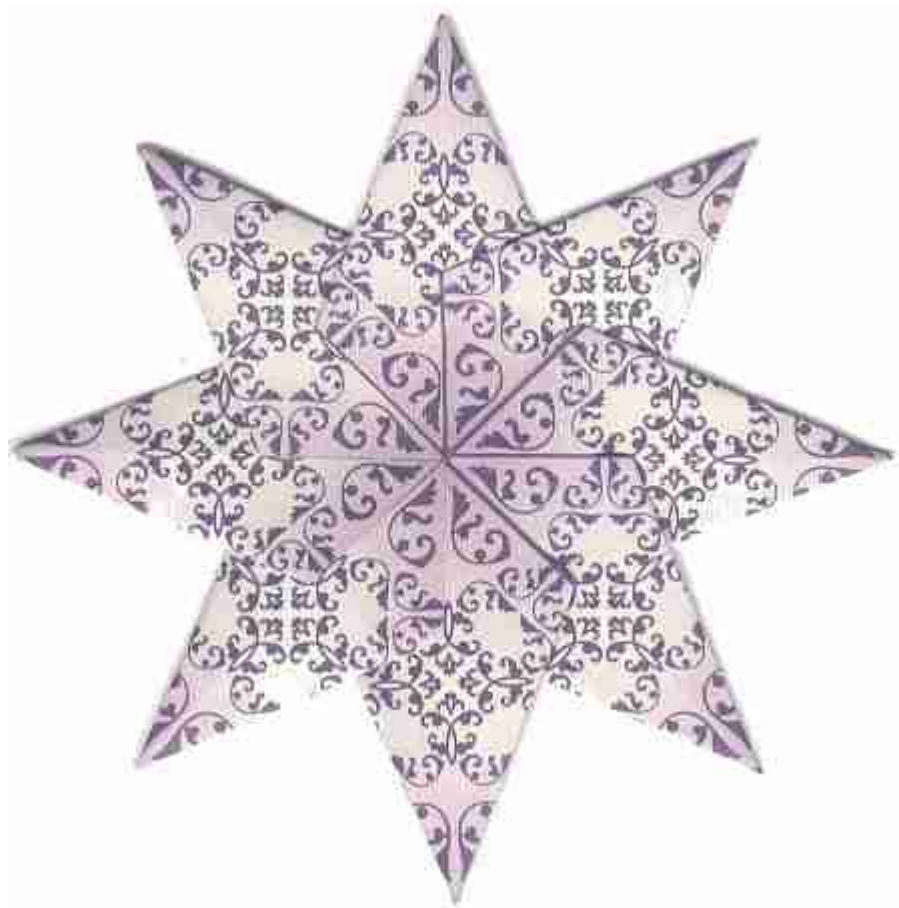

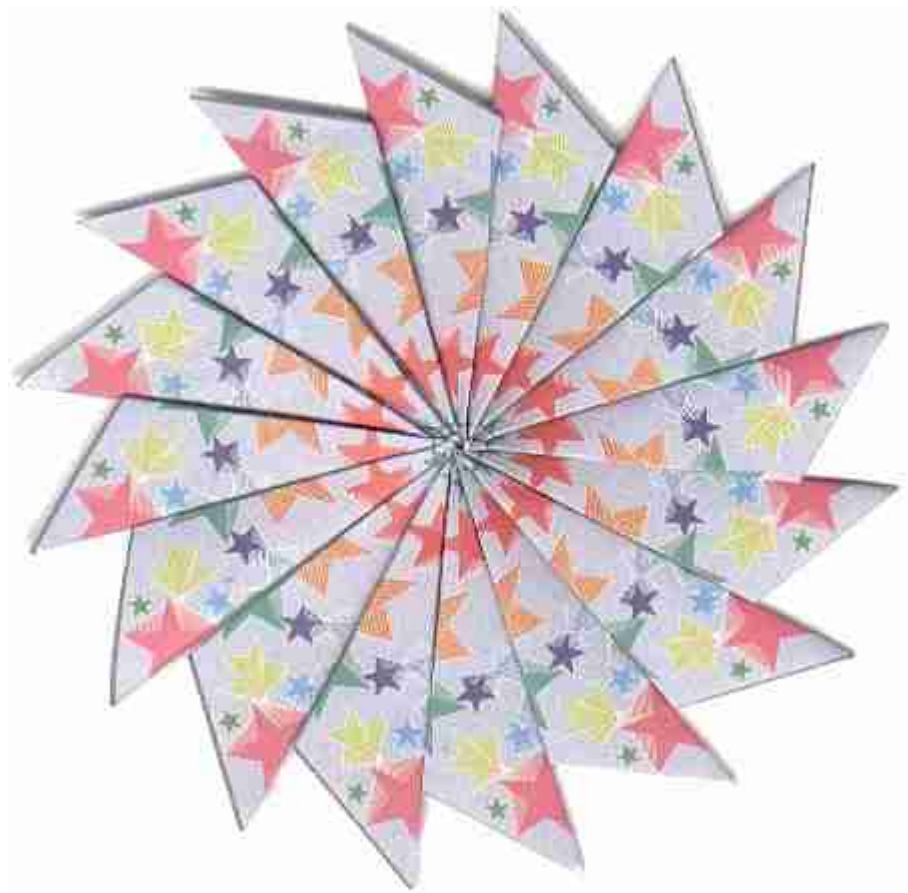

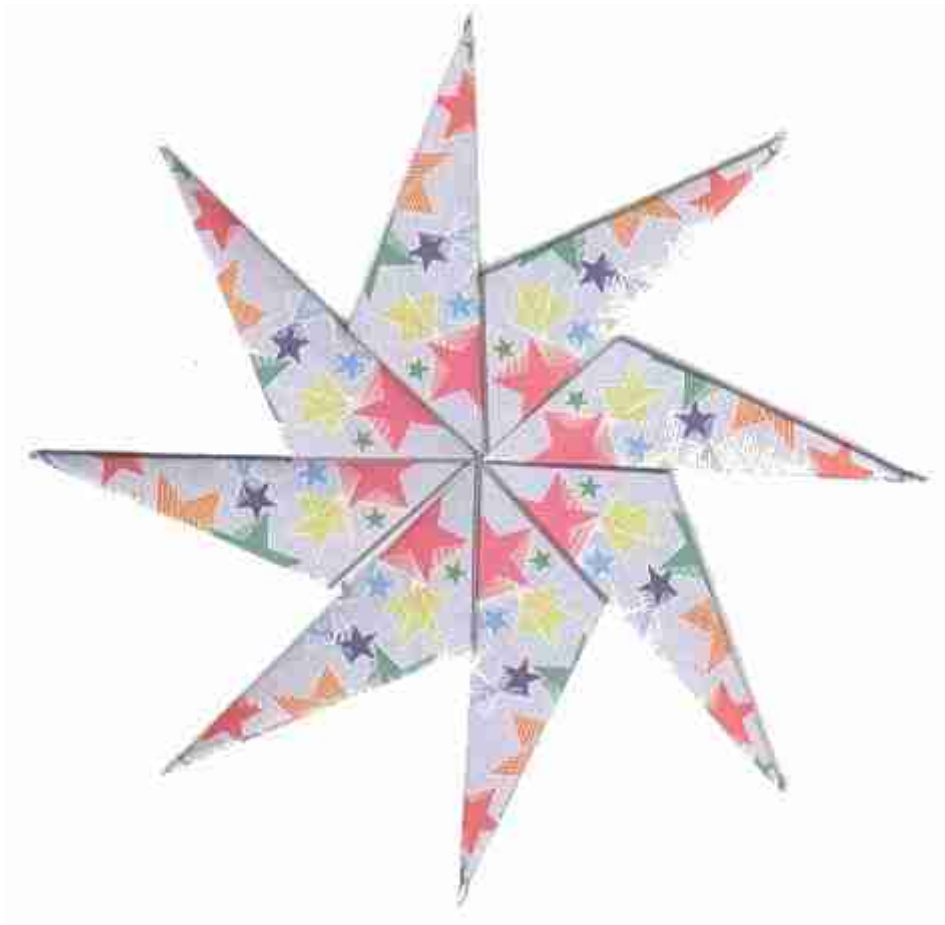

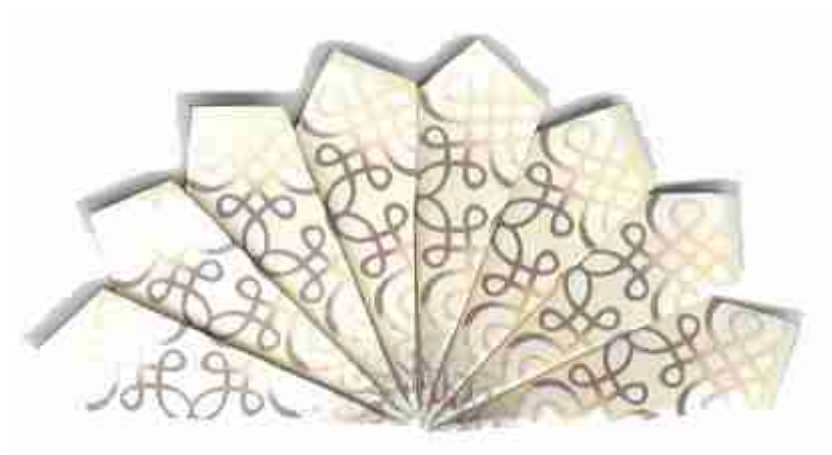

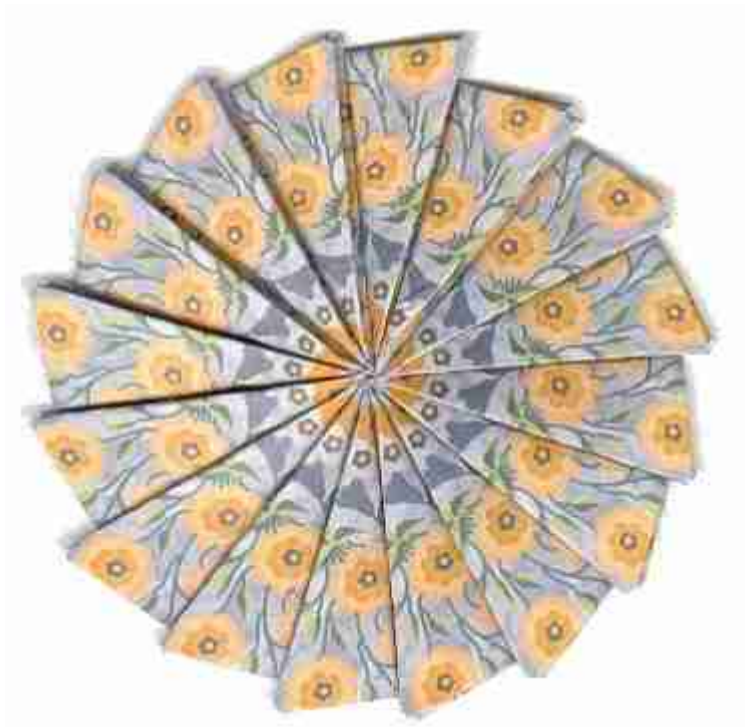

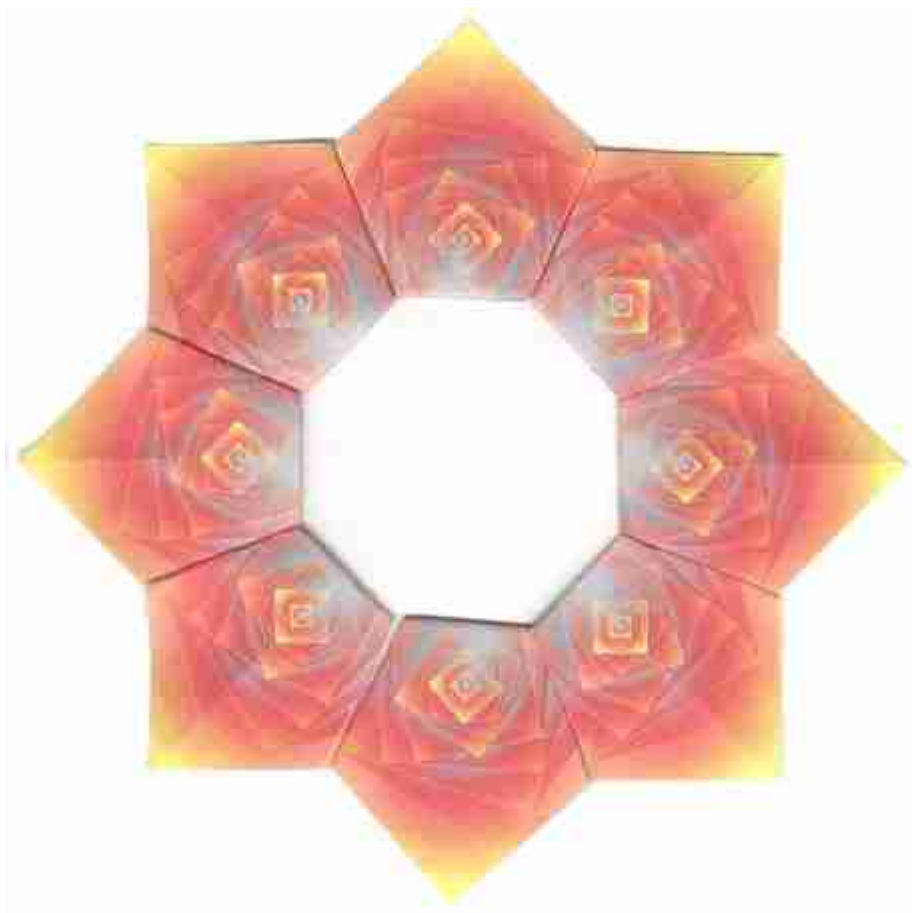

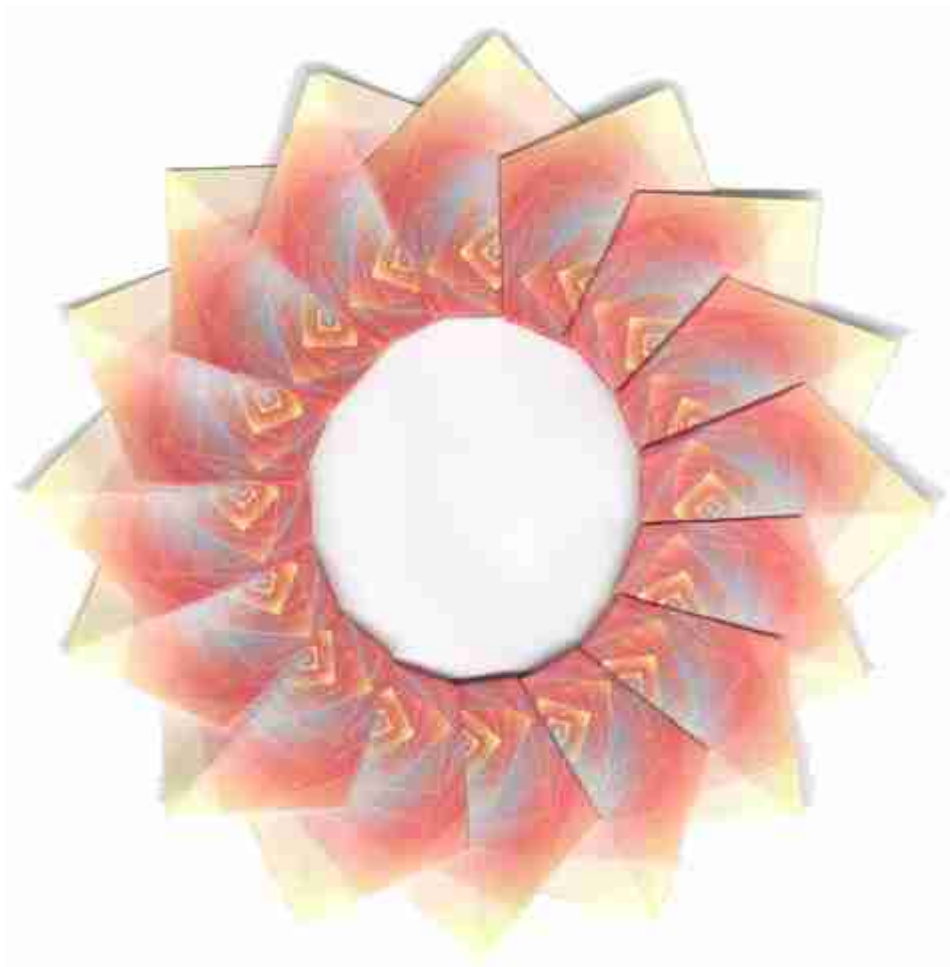

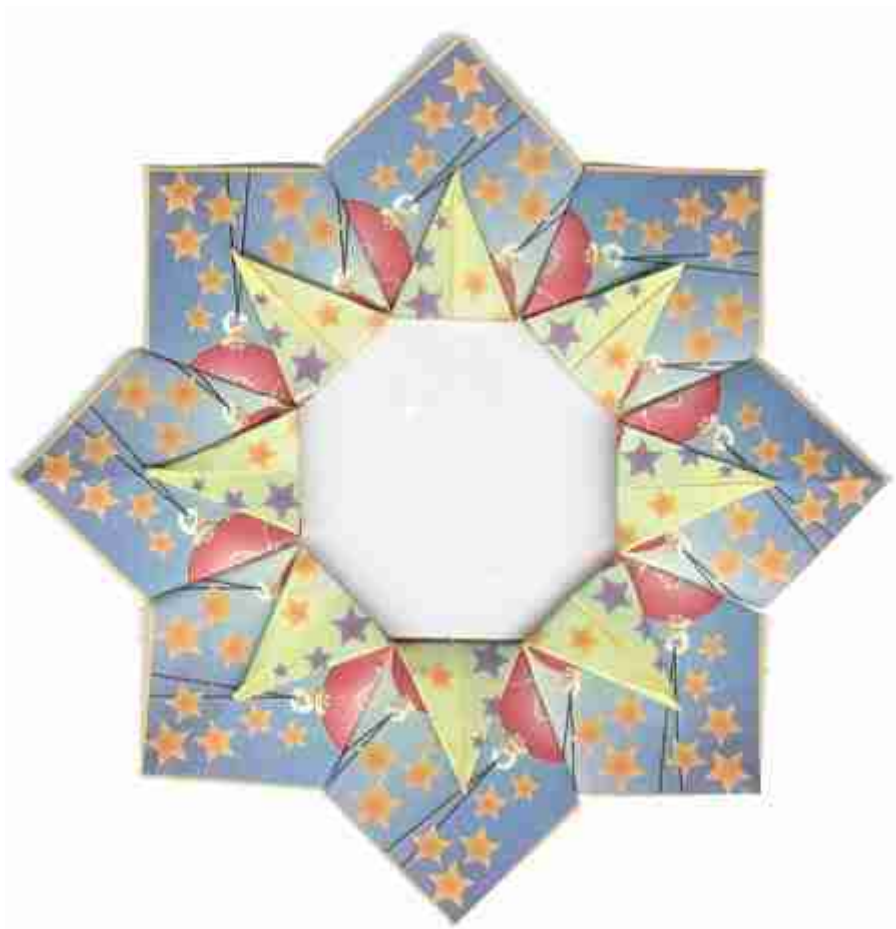

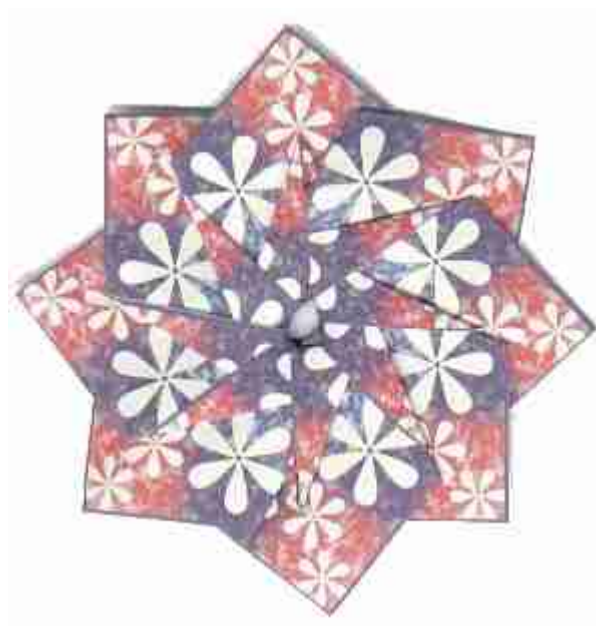

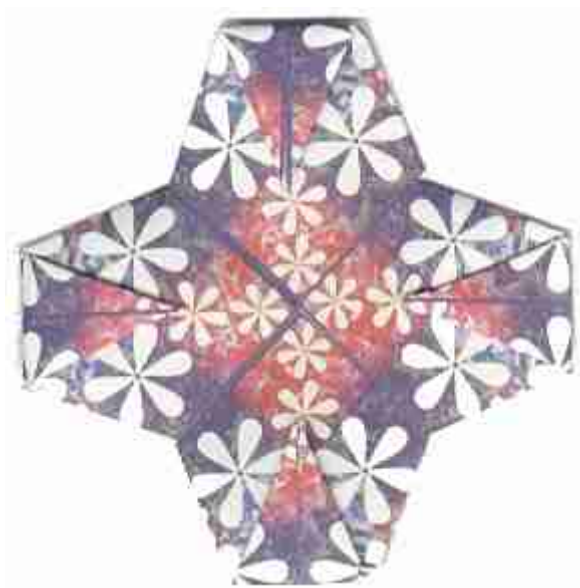

You can use this single fold to cover the middle of other medallions. This comes in handy if you have a gap in the middle of your medallion!

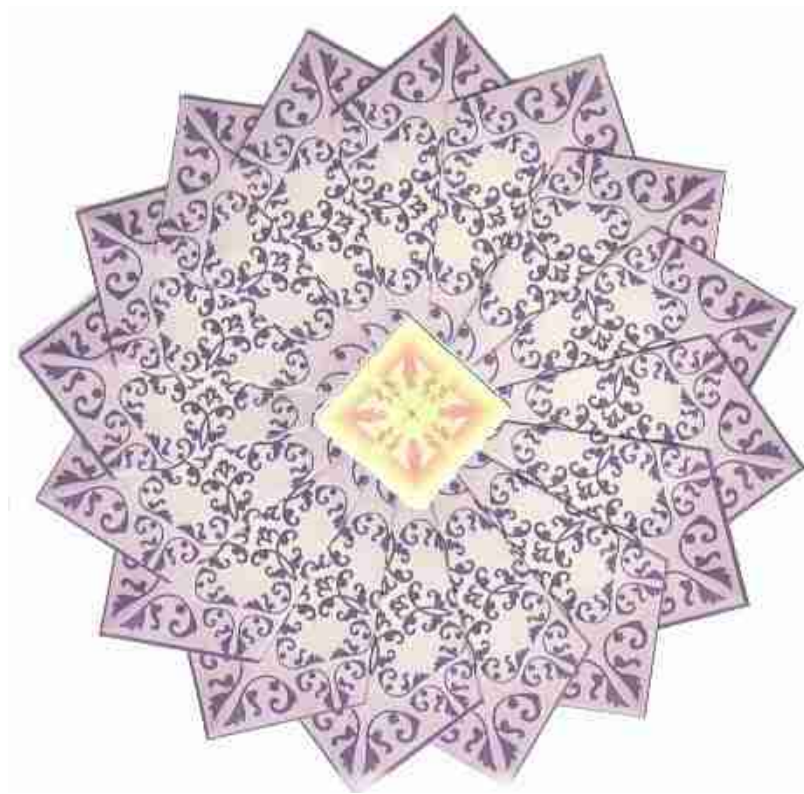

Examples of a medallions with a Converter/Basic Square Fold 01 in the centre

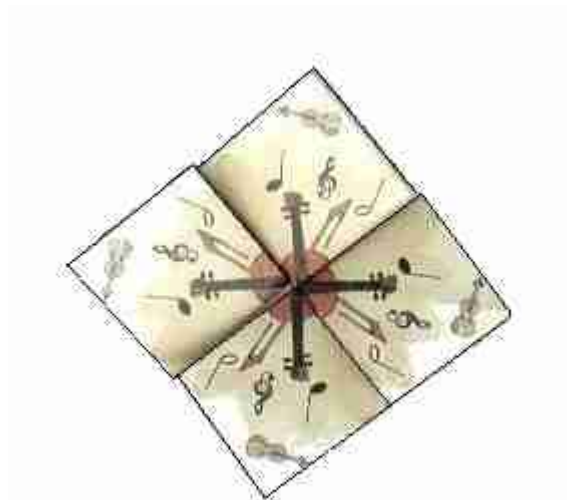

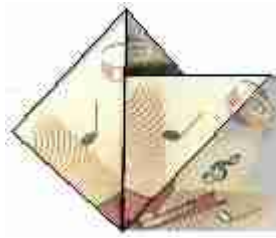

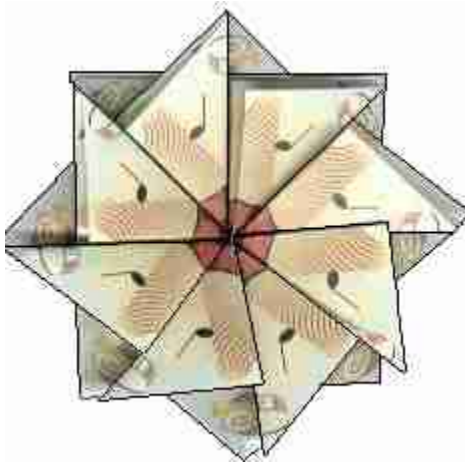

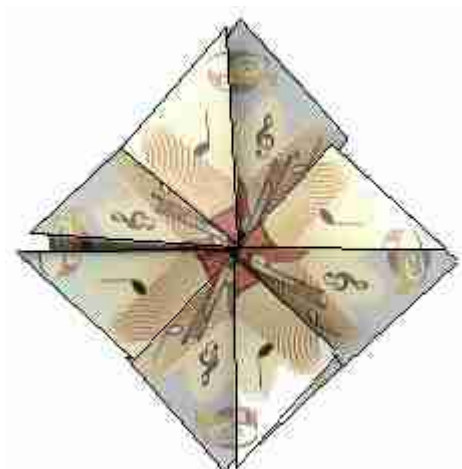

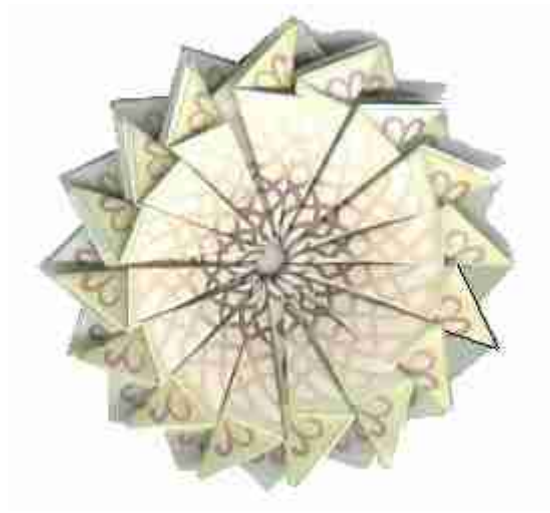

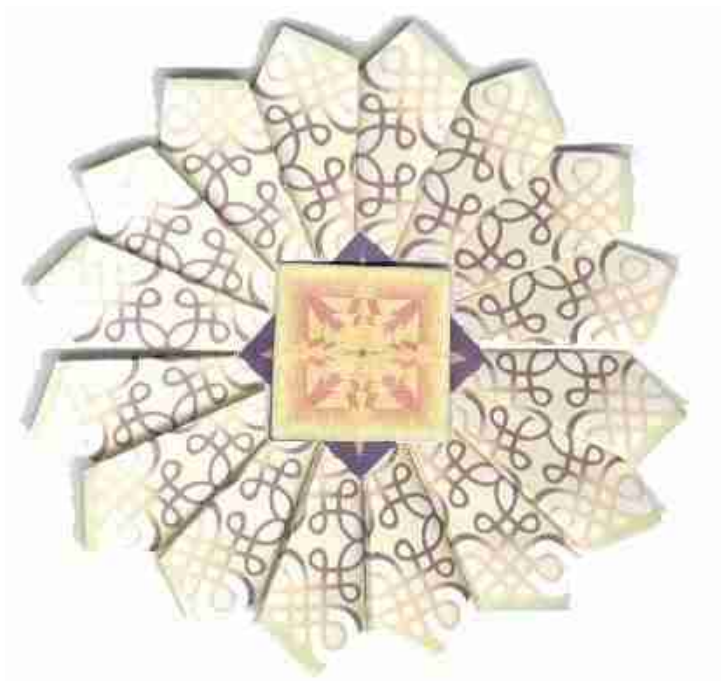

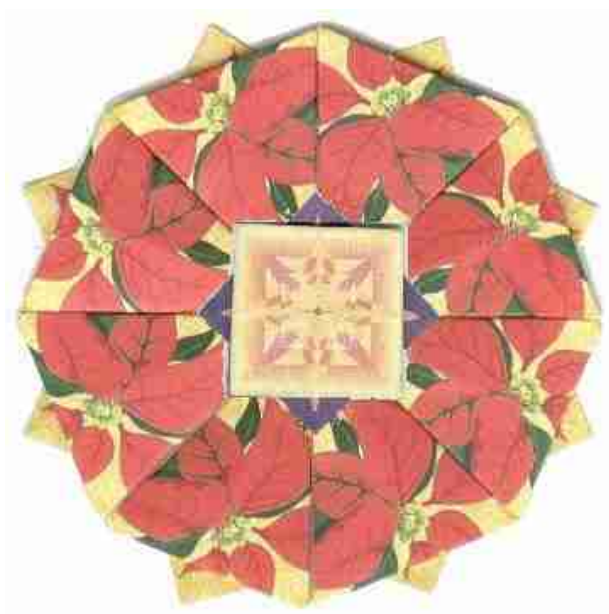
The Converter Spike Square Fold Medallions



This fold is suited to covering the middle of medallions.

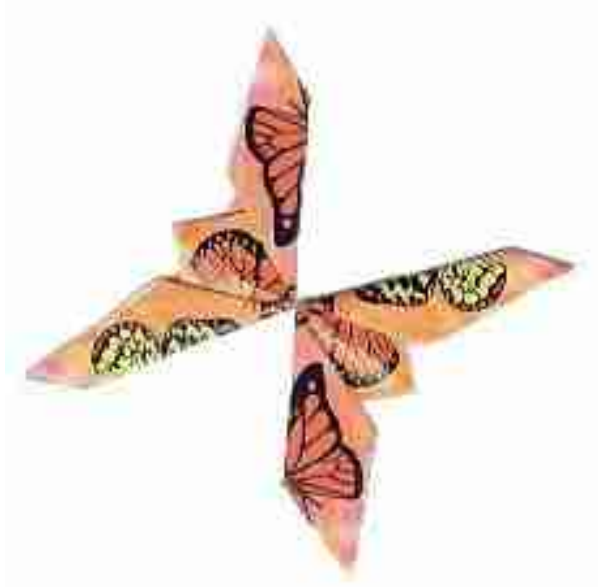


Examples of using the Converter Spike Square Fold.

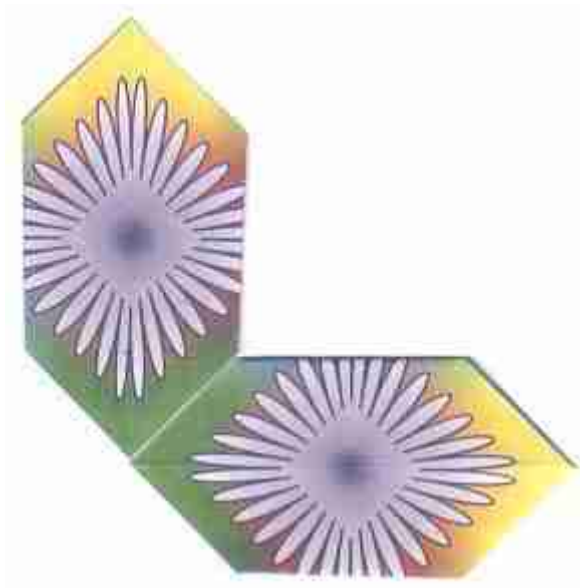
The Butterfly Fold Medallion



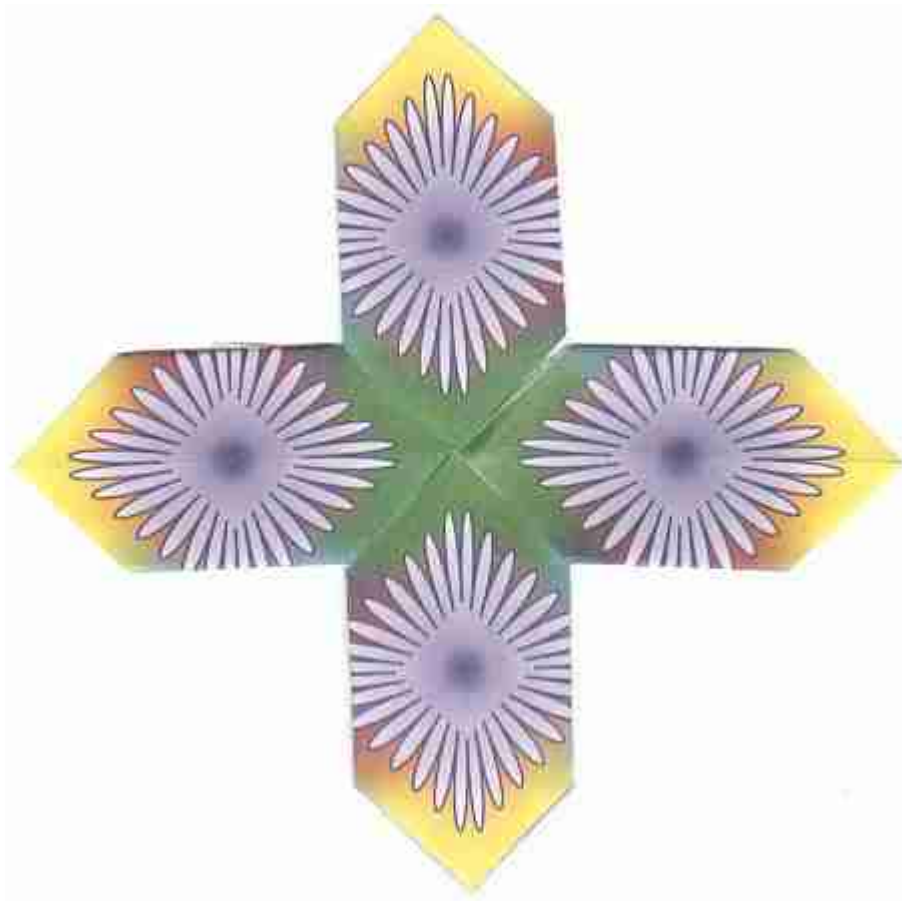

Place the completed folds as shown.



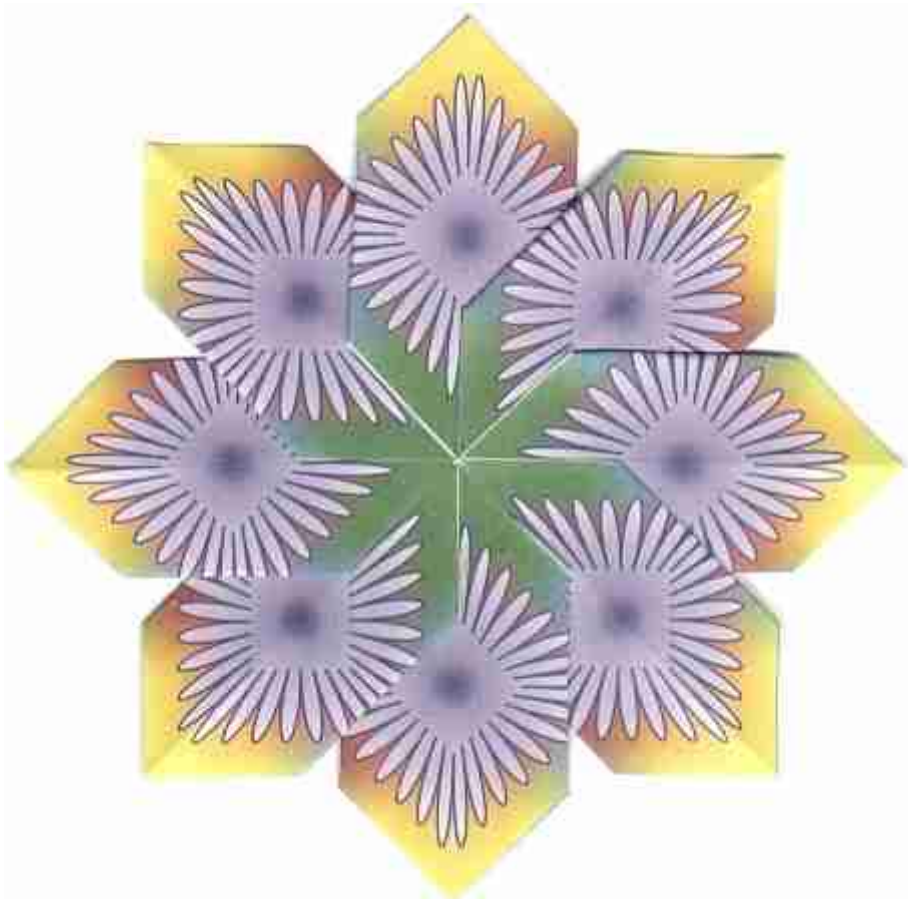
This medallion takes 4 completed folds.

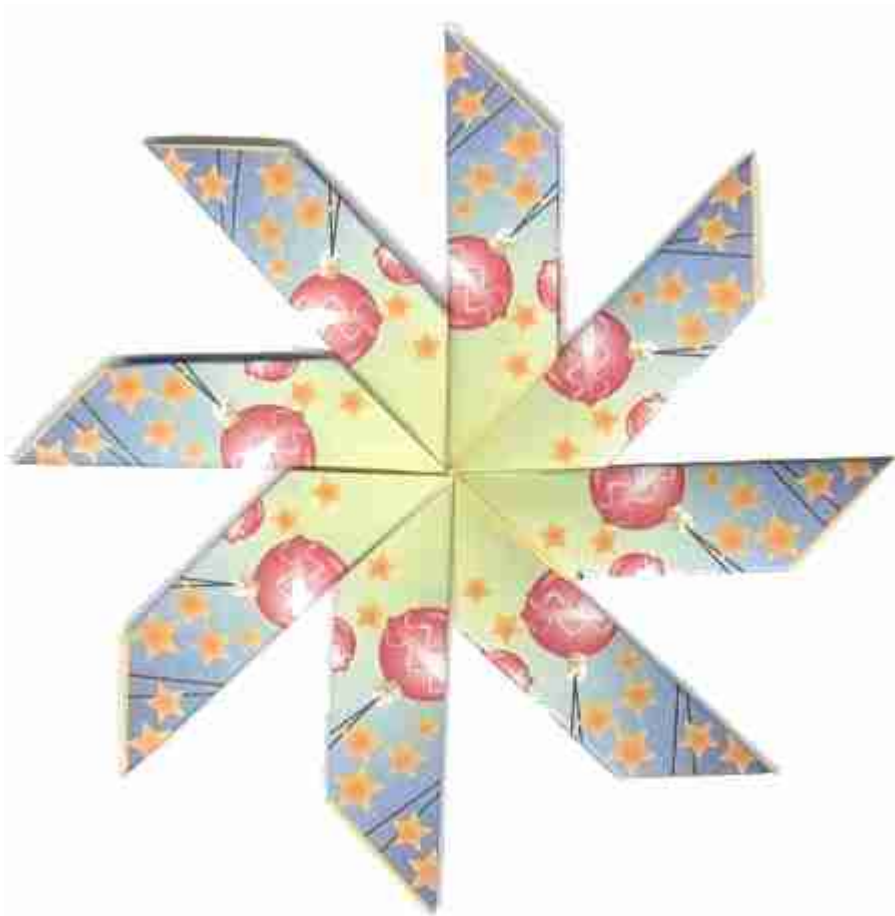

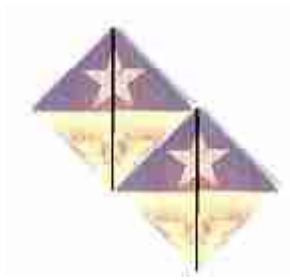

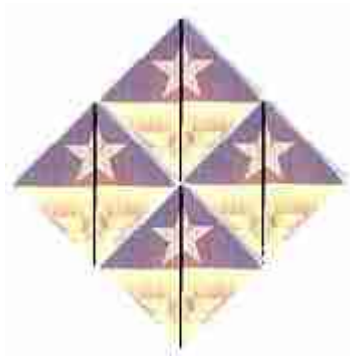

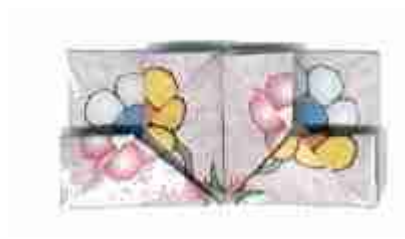

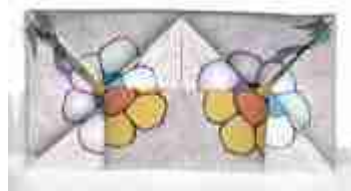
The Diamond Flap Fold Medallions



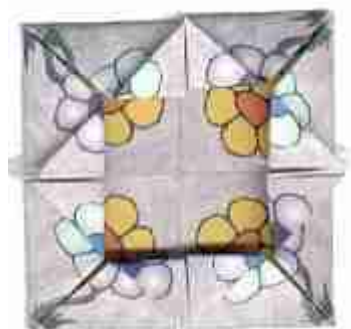

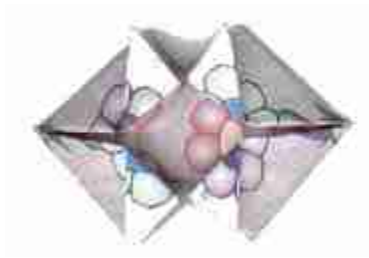

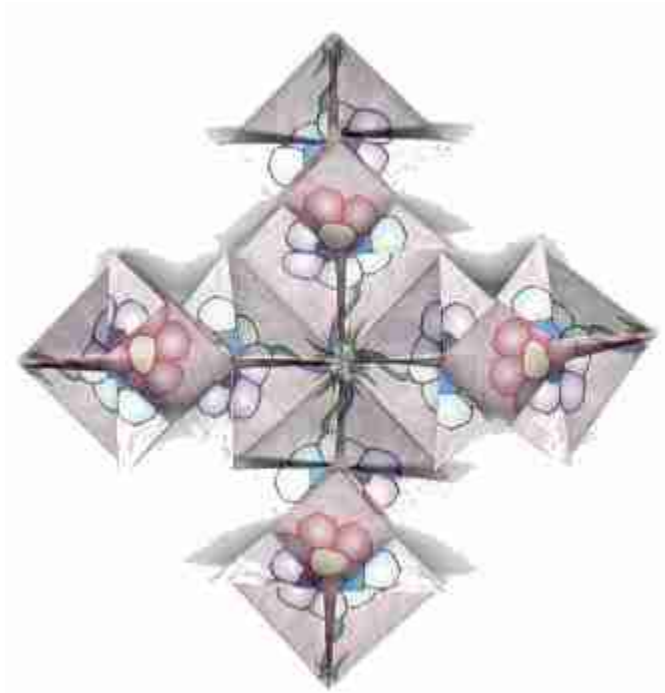

The Alternate Diamond Fold Medallion



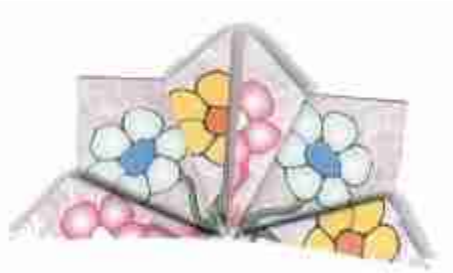
Place the completed folds as shown. Place the bottom tile over the top of the bottom left edge, so that it slides inside of the top tile.



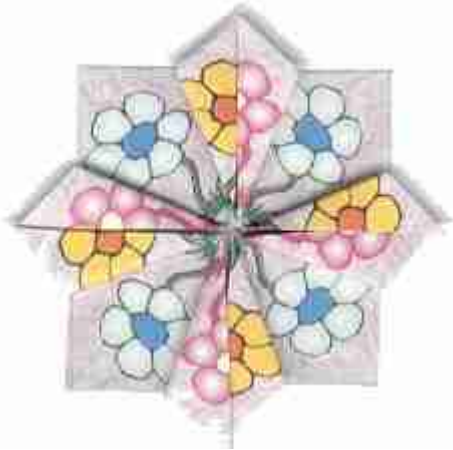

The Diamond Kite Fold Medallion



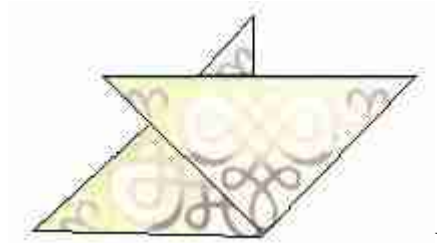
Place the completed folds as shown.

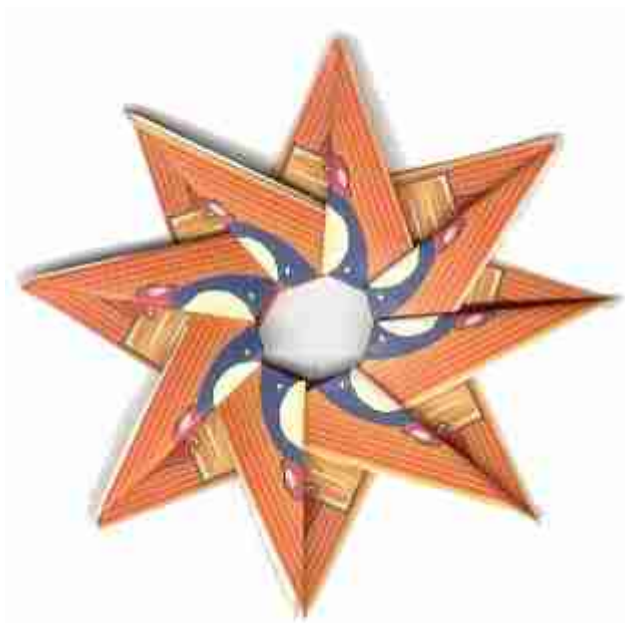

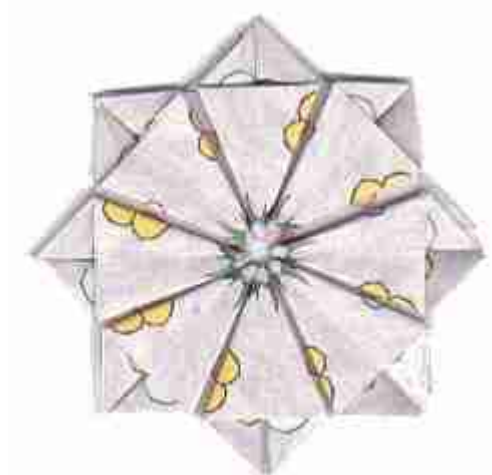

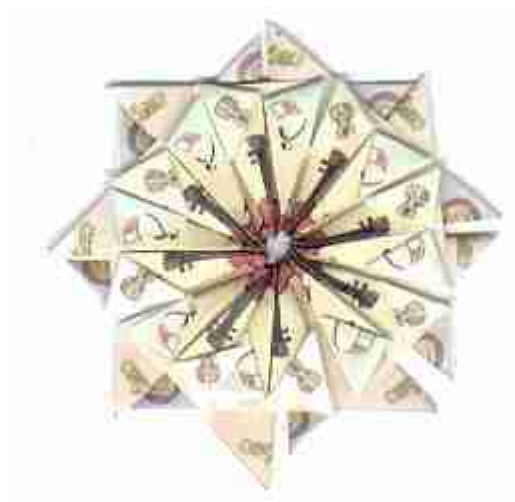

Layering Medallions

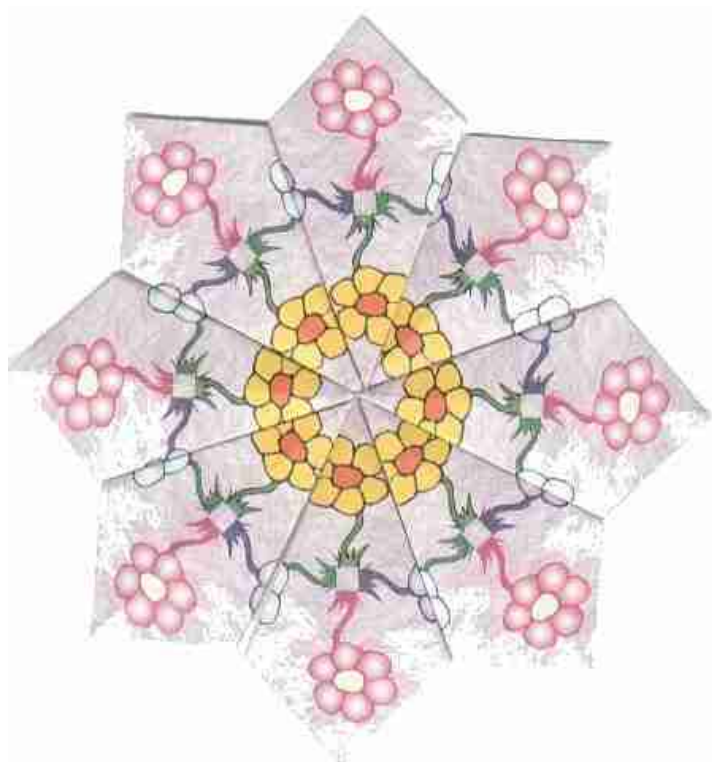
You may have seen those fancy layered cards that are used with rubber stamps, well you can achieve this effect with tea bag folded cards as well.

The only problem you will have is that you will need to make a little box for the card to go into as the more layers you add, the thicker the card will become.

All the medallions you have seen in this guide have been single layers, in other words only the single medallion.

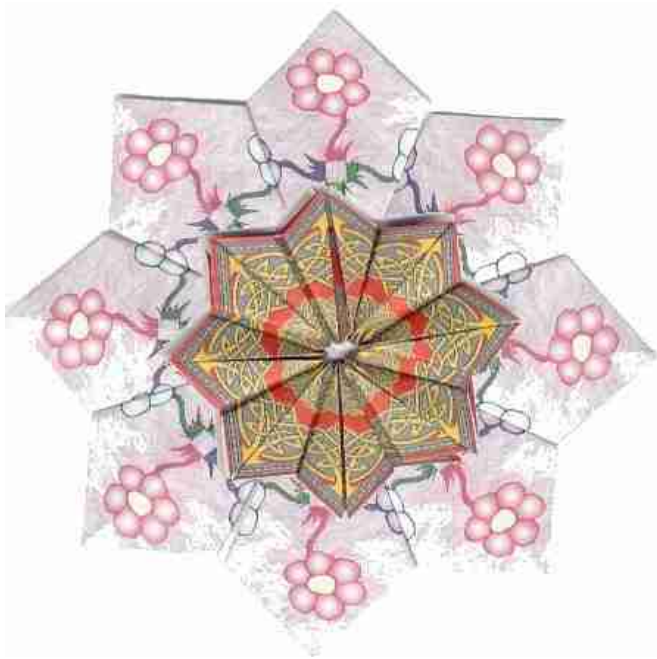
By adding another layer you can make more combinations.

I won't be doing a complete layering guide with all the previous medallions as this would make this guide too large. I will show a few examples to get you going and the rest is up to you to find!



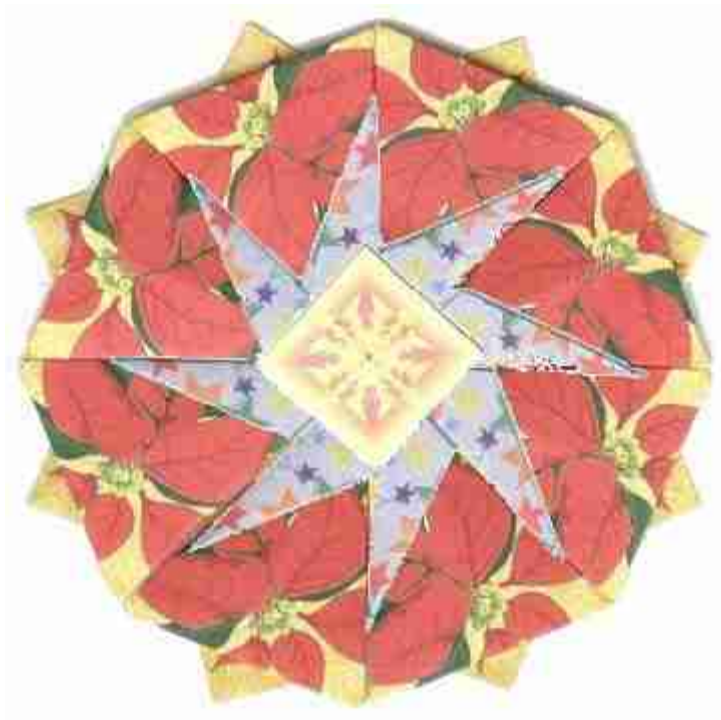
Take a Basic Kite fold medallion.

Now add a Star Fold medallion

This now becomes a double layer medallion.



This time I have created a triple layer medallion. I will leave it to you to figure out which medallions I used.

These are just a couple of examples, the more you play with the medallions the more you realise how many possible combinations there are.
