I receive this e-mail on a daily basis. Our spam appliance at work obviously filters this message out. It is interesting that once I had our spam appliance forward this message to my inbox to get a closer I discovered some unexpected things. The top portion of the message is an image. Clicking anywhere on the image will redirect you to the link provided. Also, the information below the image is hidden within the e-mail message. I can only assume it is hidden so that it can try to bypass spam filters.

This message is attempting to steal someone's identity by phishing for personal information. This e-mail is targeting anyone with a personal or commercial bank account. They use an image of a lock to project a message of safety, like they are trying to keep their customers safe. What the heck is a "client details confirmation procedure"? Upon clicking the image I received an HTTP error page due to the link not providing a legitimate page. I guess these guys shut down business and moved on to another scam.
