### New Events for 2005

*For the new year we have a couple of new events happening,*

*Firstly WA 1500, this is a type of service match which has been designed so that it can be shot as an international competition. It is very similar to service match and uses the same type of pistol but has 150 shots. The full details are in the VPN and the rules can be seen at the NRC web site. It will be shot on the same weekend as Service Match, with WA 1500 being shot on Saturday's and Service shot on Sunday's.*

*Secondly, To enable the club to compete in the postal comps we are changing the format of the Action Match shoot to the following*

*Event 1 Falling Plate 48 Rounds*

*Event 2 Practical Event 48 Rounds*

*Event 3 Barricade Event 48 Rounds*

*Shooting all three on the day to make a match*

*Open sights only are allowed, any service match pistol is ok.*

*The new events start first shoot in the new year, if you have any questions Jack Pyne may be able to help you find the answer*
