### **County Fair Update**

The Quilting Department will have new classes this year--Charity Quilt Blocks. Check out the Fair Book OR Nuts & Bolts has a listing of all fiber-related

classes. Notice there is a Miscellaneous category so if you know of another charity you'd like to support with a block, it could be entered there. The great thing about these classes is that it only has to be pieced--you don't have to quilt them. Also, following is a special thought regarding quilting for causes; it comes from the Alzheimer's website.

"Quilting for a cause is different than supporting a cause by writing a check. I'm not saying one or the other is better; it is just different. I'm just saying that sewing a quilt (or block) takes thought & planning. We sew something of ourselves into it; we give it soul. When we wish with each stitch that the work of our hands & our hearts will somehow make a difference in a cause we believe in, the fabric changes. You can't see the change, but you can feel the hope. (Ami Simms of the Alzheimer's Art Quilt Initiative)"  
So consider doing a block (or two)--you can enter one in each class if you want. What a special way to make a difference and let the public know about the Guild's commitment to the community.

## Block of the Month--A Stitch in Time

Several of you have asked me about the width of the sashing strips. This isn't designated on the original pattern instructions so use whatever you want. I have been using 3 1/2 inch strips. They can also be in fabrics/colors of your choice.

In sewing the basket strip on to the body so far finished, I found that it was smaller than it needed to be by a couple of inches. I suggest sewing a 2 inch vertical strip of your background fabric on each end and match the centers before sewing, then trim off evenly. I apologize for the discrepancies in this pattern. I try to catch them ahead of time but obviously I missed that one! (I plan to write the designer and let her know!) Also, the next row of 3 blocks (June, July, & August) will be set on point in case you

are wondering why they look way too small (I neglected to put this distinction in the diagram given to you).

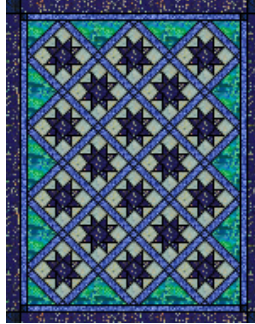

## Square in a Square Quilt Workshop

Quilt: Pineapple Diamond \$40.00

18 Star Starfling Quilt  
(Janet Waldron made this with “extra pizzazz” cornerstones in the sashings)  
53.55” x 68.40”



The first border finishes 1.5” and requires 5/8 yard fabric.

The second border finishes 3” and require 1 Yard of fabric.

The quilt requires 18 Starfling blocks finished at 9 inch sq. Their pattern may be found at <http://www.pbtex.com/html/starfling.html>

**Corner Triangles** (1/3 yard)

Cut 2 squares 8.325” sq.

$((10.5 \times 1.414) / 2) + .875 = 8.29 \approx 8.325$

These squares will be cut in half diagonally. These are the “outside corners”.

**Setting Triangles** (7/8 yard)

Cut 3 squares 16.125” sq.

$(10.5 \times 1.414) + 1.25 = 16.09 \approx 16.125$

These squares will be (carefully!) cut in quarters diagonally and will fit along the sides of the rows of the quilt. The rows are constructed on the diagonal with these triangles.

**Sashings** (7/8 yard)

Cut 15 WOF (Width of Fabric) x 2” strips. Sub-cut these strips into

twenty-four 9.5”x2” pieces, and,  
two 12.5”x 2” pieces

which fit between the blocks in the rows.

Create five really long strips (two need to be about 50”x2”, and three need to be about 75”x2”) to fit between the rows.

**Construction**

1 The quilt’s rows are sashed as follows:

The first row has one block which gets a sashing on the *top* and both sides,

The second row has three blocks and side sashings,

The third and fourth rows have five blocks with side sashings,

The fifth row has three blocks with sashings,

The sixth row has sashings on the *bottom* and both sides.

The long sashings are added to the bottom sides of the rows.

2. The setting triangles are added after the all the sashing strips have been sewn on, that is, after the rows have the both the long sashings in addition to the short sides-of-the-block sashings.

3. The corner triangles are added after the long sashing strips have been sewn on. This is a fun step, because the quilt begins to take form!

4. Cut and add borders.

5. Layer, baste, quilt and bind.

Proposed Amendments to the Quilters Above the Clouds Bylaws  
Submitted by Wendy Dillenschneider, 2<sup>nd</sup> VP, Programs

- Article V: Officers
  - Section 1 to be amended to include the elected office of 3<sup>rd</sup> Vice President, Future Programs.
  - Section 4 to be renumbered as Section 5, and a new Section 4 inserted as follows:
    - The 3<sup>rd</sup> Vice President, Future Programs, shall serve a one year term as 3<sup>rd</sup> Vice President and shall automatically succeed the 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President, Programs, for the following calendar year, thus serving a total of two years, one year in each position.
  - Section 5 amend Duties of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President as follows:
    - In Paragraph 1, remove the 2<sup>nd</sup> sentence.
    - Renumber paragraphs 2 and 3 as paragraphs 3 and 4, and add a new paragraph 2 as follows:
      - Assist and coordinate with the 3<sup>rd</sup> Vice President in scheduling and budgeting for programs to be presented during the 3<sup>rd</sup> Vice President's term as Programs (2<sup>nd</sup>) Vice President. Sign contracts as necessary to complete scheduling of such programs. Act as the 3<sup>rd</sup> Vice President's representative as a voting member of the Executive Board.
  - Section 5 insert Duties of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Vice President as follows:
    - Plan, organize and present future monthly programs reflecting the interests of the membership for presentation at the general membership meetings during the subsequent calendar year during which the 3<sup>rd</sup> Vice President has assumed the position of 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President.
    - Coordinate with the 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President in scheduling and budgeting for programs to be presented during the 3<sup>rd</sup> Vice President's term as Programs (2<sup>nd</sup>) Vice President.
    - Keep a file of proposed programs with contact information and transfer the same to their successor at the end of their term of office as 3<sup>rd</sup> Vice President.
    - Perform any other duties as may be required by the 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President or the executive board.
- Article VI: Executive Board
  - Section 1, the 2<sup>nd</sup> sentence to be amended as follows:
    - Only those persons, with the exception of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Vice President, who holds a non-voting position, may vote on Executive Board Matters.
- Article VII: Nominations and Elections
  - Add Section 6 as follows:
    - For the calendar year 2009 only, a special election shall be held in June to fill the newly created position of 3<sup>rd</sup> Vice President. From that time forward, the 3<sup>rd</sup> Vice President will be elected at the general election in October. The 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President will no longer be elected at the general election as the 3<sup>rd</sup> Vice President will assume the office of 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President according to Article 5, Section 4, above.

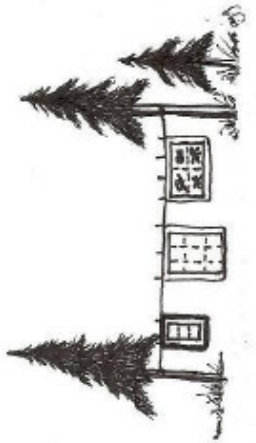

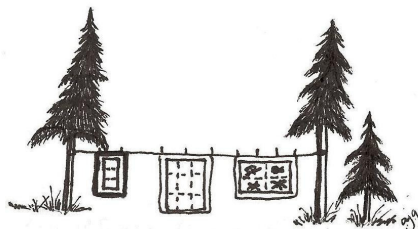
