MINUTES OF THE TVCC MEETING AUGUST 19, 2008

Minutes of the August 19, 2008, Board and General Meeting of the Temecula Valley Car Club, held at Carrow's on Madison Avenue , Murrieta , CA .

The meeting was called to order by President Alphy Norman at 6:37 PM.

Secretary Nancy Humphrey asked for a motion to accept the minutes of the July meeting; a second was made, and it was approved.

Treasurer Harvey Williamson was not present but he had submitted a report which was read by Alphy; a motion was made to accept it as read, and it was approved.

Historian Mark Norman asked that if anyone went to an event, to submit pictures and the details of the event.

Newsletter editor Betty Kienitz stated that all was going well, but also reminded everyone to get news to her by the last week of the month so that the newsletter would be sent out on time.

Cruise Night Chairman Duncan Miller was out of town on business. Cruise Night was run by the following: Alphy Norman, Celestina & Mark Norman, Andy Zun, and Skip Humphrey. We had 39 cars.

Publicity Chairman Skip Humphrey said all was well and the papers are getting the notices in both papers.

Vice President Mike Kienitz gave a brief report assisted by Wes Peterson regarding the trip on August 30th to Rancho California RV Park, Southeast on Highway 79. Those coming from the 15 freeway are meeting at Wal Mart on Highway 79, and will be leaving at 9:00 AM promptly; those coming from Hemet will meet with us at the RV park entrance. The RV park will provide refreshments and lunch; they will also donate \$50.00 to the club, and \$40.00 to each driver. The trip is filled as it was limited to 15 cars. It will end at 2:00 PM.

It was also noted by Roger Serianni that there will be a show at Hemet Ryan Airport on October 11th. It will start at 10:00 AM and end at 2:00 PM. B-B-Q is \$9.00 without a car and \$5.00 with a car. It is the same day as our own Cruise Night, but if we leave promptly we should be at Siggy's before our start time.

It was also mentioned that the Temecula Film Festival on September 17th will need 35 cars; they prefer four-door cars as drivers will be transporting passengers about 200 feet to the entrance. Alphy announced that the CHVA tour is closed. She also announced a fund raiser on September 27th at the Ramona Bowl; for each \$25.00 ticket we sell, the club would get \$5.00.

OLD BUSINESS. We need to continue our search for new officers. Nancy Humphrey has told the Board and members at the meeting that she will NOT be Secretary; she has done it for too many years. NEW BUSINESS. The member who is going through a divorce has not asked to advertise his house, and, as agreed at the July meeting, we will only allow this as it has potential for a car collector.

The next club meeting will be on September 16th, same time and place.

A motion was made to adjourn; it was seconded and approved; we adjourned at 7:33 PM.
