More information on our Pre-school project in TOUL KRANG, CAMBODIA.

Dear Mr Chan, 28 - 7 - 02

Jean-Luc and Lappreciate your help to our Cambodian children in Toul Krang village. They are looking much better since they have well water to drink and to wash themselves from Nov 2001. They are looking forward to enter their Pre-school. Toul Krang flooded badly in the past two years which caused illnesses to them. The 265 families are mostly farmers and fishermen. A few men and women can read and write. They harm themselves by drinking... so the children don't have much good examples. These little ones will continue to be poor for a long time, but they love to learn. Each week my friends and I visit them. They are ready to sing again, draw pictures again, talk to us again about when can they come to school. My co-workers and I will continue to teach them, giving them the opportunities to receive basic education. We have low expectation, but we have high hope for them to become better community. The good thing is the whole village come together to learn about what their children learn. They begin to understand team-work for the common good. Toul Krang needs help to

- ** create supportive environments to reduce barriers to action,
- . make opportunities for behavior change, make the healthy
- choice the easier choice
- ** strengthen community action (advice for community members on family planning)
- ** develop personal skills (literacy...) training in problem-solving
- . and negotiation, training about sanitation and the spread of
- , diseases, skill in communication and personal relationships.

On Friday 21 June 2002 WHO declared the European region polio free. TARGET - to eradicate polio world wide by 2005. Although polio rarely crosses the minds of people in the developed world today, this devastating disease is still crippling children in parts of Asia and Africa, primarily in regions of high poverty, population density and civil unrest. There is a US\$275m in funding gap.

Starting July 2002, Rotary clubs world wide will reach out to their communities with the goal of raising US\$80m thru' 2003. This disease is preventable, thanks to the oral polio vaccine. Since 1985 Rotary has been raising fund and providing volunteer support. To-date Rotary has contributed more than US\$462m for the protection of more than 2 billion children in 122 countries.
