Rotary cannot address the many concerns without a solid base membership.

By recruiting more dynamic professionals, we can breathe new life into our Rotary clubs. We have made a lot of progress in enhancing the quality of our membership. Now we need to turn again to boosting our numbers.

I am relying on each one of you to find that essential balance between quantity and quality: Step up your membership recruitment efforts, but make sure the people you are recruiting will be quality Rotarians. Wouldn't it be great if every Rotarian brought in one new member into Rotary each year? For some reason, it doesn't happen. It is disturbing to know that only a small percentage of Rotarians actually bring in new members. We have to do something about this.

I want you to recognize Rotarians who bring in new members. Let us recognize the Rotarians in your weekly Club Bulletin and in our monthly Governor's Monthly Letter. Personally, I believe it is important to recognize these Rotarians and to showcase the outstanding projects of the various clubs in the district.

And while you are recruiting new members, don't forget about existing Rotarians. We need to be more proactive in our membership retention efforts. Let us not forget that it is seven times easier to keep an existing Rotarian than to bring in a new one.

I like to think of Membership Development and Retention in terms of the corporate world. Recruiting new members is like sending out a sales force to sell people on the benefits of becoming a Rotarian. Membership Retention is Rotary's Customer Service Policy.

We can make the best sales pitch in the world, but unless our product is backed up by quality support systems, new members are not likely to stay along.

Search for the Most Outstanding Public Servant (MOPS) 2002

I. Rationale:

The search for and recognition of the "Most Outstanding Public Servants (MOPS) of the Year 2002 Award" in eight (8) categories is a continuing vocational service project of District 3800. The objective of this Vocational Service is to give due recognition, incentives and motivation to all the deserving "Most Outstanding Public Servants" in various eight (8) categories, thus making them role models for others to emulate. This awarding will also foster and encourage the ideals of Vocational Service as a basis of worthy enterprises.

II. Categories: The eight categories of the MOPS are the following:

1. **Barangay Employee** - includes councilman, barangay tanod, secretariat & clerks (Barangay Chairman/Captain not included).
2. **Fireman** - Fireman up to SFO4 rank.
3. **General Service Employee** - includes municipal department office clerks; inspectors; building & guards maintenance personnel, street cleaners (supervisors not included).
4. **Health Employees** - includes nurse & nursing aids, midwife; non supervisory clinic personnel (health officer & doctors not included).
5. **Judiciary Employee** - includes clerk of court stenographer, interpreter, sheriff and process server (judges not included).
6. **Policeman** - includes police investigator, traffic, and peace and order policeman, jail policeman and station office clerks up to the rank of SPO4.
7. **Public Elementary School Teacher** - up to class adviser assignment (but must not have any supervising function).
8. **Public High School Teacher** - up to class adviser assignment (but must not have any supervising function).

III. Launching the Project

Launching of the project shall be done separately or simultaneously by the zone in the month of July 2002. Each Zone shall install streamers of the project in front of the every municipal building/city hall. The Zone shall also arrange to install posters in every Barangay Halls; Fire Stations; Health Centers Municipal Courts; Police Headquarters & Stations' Public Elementary & High Schools.

IV. Qualification MOPS Nominee

1. Must be Filipino citizen of legal age
2. Must be a rank file (non supervisory) public servant presently working in the municipality/city and have been in public service for at least three (3) years.
3. The performance of the nominee from January 1 to August 31, 2002 shall be the main considerations. The nominee of performance for three years prior to January 2002 may also be considered.
4. The nominee shall not be a related, by second degree of consanguinity, to any Rotarian of District 3800.
5. The nominee shall not be endorsed by his/her supervisor or superior by filing up the nominee information sheet duly signed.

V. Search Period

The search period shall be from July 1, 2002 up to August 31, 2002 for the Zone level. Awarding rites for the zone shall take place during the first or second week of September 2002. It is suggested that the Zone shall arrange to have the awarding rites during their intercity meeting.

The eight (8) awardees of the Zone, one for each category, shall be forwarded to the District Vocational Awards Committee not later than the 1st week of September, 2002 for the final selection of the eight (8) Most Outstanding Public Servants for the year 2002. The District level awarding will be held on October 19, 2002.

followed after the forum, wherein the participants were divided into two groups.

What is WCS? The WCS Program consists of activities within

international service through which Rotarians conduct projects to improve lives and meet human needs, and thus promote international understanding and goodwill by means of material, technical and professional assistance.

WCS' Program. Its program includes 1) promotion of increased knowledge of Rotary's international service objectives through WCS opportunities and activities; 2) promotion and use of the WCS Projects Exchange; 3) promotion of cooperation between the International Service and Rotary Foundation committees at district and club levels, as appropriate; 4) expansion of Inter-country committees as vehicles for International Service, including WCS activities; 5) promotion of support for disaster

relief projects; 6) promotion of 23 February, as "World Understanding and Peace" day; 7) use of the Donations-In-Kind Information Network to support WCS projects with donated goods and services; 8) use of Carl P. Miller Discovery Grants and Matching Grants as resources in the implementation of WCS projects; 9) commendation of International Projects Advisory Committees (IPACS) aims and achievements in areas where these provide a useful framework for WCS activities; and 10) personal involvement by Rotarians in WCS activities, including international volunteer service.

Status of WCS programs of D3800

PDG Santi Chua reported at the WCS Forum on the status of WCS project proposals already submitted to the District. Of the 73 clubs in the District, 21 clubs have submitted 23 project proposals; 9 clubs submitted project proposals but these were received too late for publication in the WCS Project Exchange; and, 43 clubs did not submit any project proposal at all. He then proceeded to discuss a step-by-step approach to ensure a successful inclusion of the project in the WCS Project Exchange and its eventual acceptance and support by a foreign Rotary club. He warned, however, that inclusion in the WCS Project Exchange does not in itself guarantee that the project will receive financial or technical support from foreign clubs. He stressed that clubs must be patient and must respond promptly to any request for information about the project. Prompt communication is very important and is the key to a successful acceptance of a WCS project proposal.

During the workshop, the participants were taught the finer points of filling up the WCS forms, the Project Data Form for the WCS Project Exchange and the TRF Matching Grants Application form. In addition, the resource persons answered numerous questions that were not raised during the open forum.

In his overall assessment of the WCS Forum, District Governor Efen de Guzman expressed the hope that, with the knowledge gained from the forum, all the Rotary clubs in District 3800 will now be able to submit WCS project proposals so that funds will be made available for their projects.
