Mart 26, Axtell 22

(Fairfield) – What a game it was. In a season that saw steaks end, one good and one not so good, it appeared that the Axtell Longhorns would get another monkey off of their backs.

In game two, the Longhorns not only ended a scoreless streak against the Clifton Cubs, but also took their first victory over the Cubs. The Longhorns were not only 0-4 against the Cubs, they had never scored a point against them. But that all changed when Axtell walked away with a 14-6 win. In game four, Bosqueville snapped an eight game losing streak to Axtell and took home their first win ever over the Longhorns.

Axtell entered this contest with an 0-6 record against Mart and had been outscored 266-30.

For about 44 minutes, it appeared that another streak might end. The Longhorns stood toe to toe with the heavily favored Panthers and did not blink until their final drive of the night.

Axtell took the opening kickoff and was forced to punt. The first moment of truth for the Horns was the opening Mart Panther offensive drive. They passed with flying colors. The Panthers fumbled and the Horns pounced on the loose ball.

While Axtell was able to move the ball in the opening stanza, they were unable to get into the end zone. The Panthers had scoring problems of their own and the two teams went into the second quarter knotted at zero.

Weston Popham broke the scoreless drought with a 15 yarder up the middle and flashed the 'Hook 'em Horns' sign as he crossed the goal line. He followed that run up with a 2-point conversion run to put Axtell up, 8-0. The quarter wound down and it appeared the lead may hold up for the half until Xavier Wiliams found Zach Matthys from six yards out with 78 ticks left. The Horns broke through and batted away the extra point attempt and took an 8-6 lead into intermission.

The Panthers came out firing on all cylinders in the second half, taking the lead after a two minute drive. Williams wrapped it up from three yards out. The two point conversion pass was no good and Mart led 12-8.

Many of the Longhorns faithful shivering in the stands must have been thinking that at least it was a good first half. But, the men dressed in red had different ideas about that. Axtell stormed back and scored on a Hunter Cadell run. Brandon Trent's kick made it 15-12.

The Panthers took back the lead with 3:36 left in the quarter when Sean Farmer broke loose for 55 yards. Matthew Shaeffer made it 19-15 late in the third period.

The Longhorns never blinked and proceeded to drive the field once again. Popham called Cadell's number again and Hunter busted into paydirt from two yards out. Trent made it 22-19 with 10:39 left in the game.

It was time for the defense to step up and step up they did, forcing a Panther punt. Popham and company were driving for what might prove to be the ol 'nail in the Panther coffin' when a constant nemesis reared its ugly head. The Horns coughed up the football and Mart was able to land on it.

Longhorns fall short against mart

This time, Mart would not be denied. Facing fourth and three, Williams was forced out of the pocket and was able to find nine yards and a first down. He then found Nino Sharp from twelve yards out and Mart was up. Shaeffer added what proved to be the final point of the evening to give Mart a 26-22 lead with 4:49 to play.

When the offense took the field, everyone on the west side of the field felt that this might be remembered as 'The Drive'. But alas, it was not to be. The Panther defense which had problems containing the Longhorns all evening found a way and forced Axtell to turn the ball over on downs. They were then content to run out the clock and advance to the Area round of the playoffs.

Popham finished with 147 yards and a score on 25 carries and Cadell finished with 2 touchdowns and 85 steps on 20 carries.

In the final analysis, it may have come down to experience. It is almost an annual event for the Panthers to advance to the state playoff and they are a couple of years away from a Class AA state championship. Axtell, on the other hand, was making only their sixth trip in their history. Mart has been here before while it was a new experience for most of the Longhorns.

A loss though it was, it was a game to give Axtell a building block. They put together four quality quarters against a team with a real shot at the state championship. In recent history, they tend to play a good first half and watch a large deficit develop in the second. They now know that they can hang was the top teams.

Axtell is losing a great group of Seniors, but they showed the underclassmen something important. The team in white is where the Horns want to be. Their leadership has demonstrated that Axtell can get there with hard work and dedication. Who knows, we may look back at this game as a turning point in the program.

Looking Back at Longhorn History

Game 11

November 22, 1974

Axtell 12, Throckmorton 6

Waco Tribune-Herald Saturday, November 24, 1990 – Game 11

COMANCHE - Axtell coach Joe Wyatt's 35th and final season may never end.

The Axtell Longhorns and their retiring coach used a dominating defense and ball-controll offense to upset the ninth-ranked Throckmorton Greyhounds, 12-6 Friday night in the Class 1A area playoffs. Axtell (9-2) will face the Garden City-Santa Anna winner in the regionals, while Throckmorton finishes 11-1.

Axtell rolled up 15 first downs and 300 yards total offense, including 221 on the ground, while holding the Greyhounds to just six first downs and 105 yards.

Mike Voss did most of the work for the Longhorns, rushing for 155 yards on 29 carries, but it was Chris Harrison who got the scoring honors on runs of 12 and three yards.

The Longhorns took a 6-0 lead in the second quarter with Harrison's 12-yard TD run with only 10 seconds showing on the clock.

Mike Stroud, who had 69 yards on 29 carries for the Greyhounds, tied the game midway through the third period on a five-yard TD run as the extra-point kick failed.

Early in the fourth quarter, Axtell took the lead for good on Harrison's three-yard run at the tail end of a long drive. The decisive score came with 11:31 left in the game.

Weston Popham's 2nd quarter touchdown run moved Axtell across the 11,000 point mark in scoring all-time. They have now scored 11,019 and allowed 11,071.

If Mart goes on to win the state championship, it will be the 4th time in 6 play-off trips that Axtell has lost to the eventual state champions.

Axtell's all-time record is now 288-303-17.
