Axtell 22, Holland 6

(Holland) – The game began almost as a continuation of the game from last week. The Longhorns took the opening kickoff, but when unable to move the ball was forced to punt. When the ball touched a Hornet player and scrubbed around, the Hornets were somehow able to get loose and carry it deep into Longhorn territory. Holland followed up with a 20-yard touchdown pass for a quick lead.

The Longhorns rode the legs of Greg Clark to get into Hornet land and a touchdown . Josh Reynolds found Clark for the extra points and Axtell led 8-6. Mykel King intercepted a pass and returned it to the Hornets 45-yard line. Two plays later, the Horns took the lead on a 45-yard pass from Keith Lindsay to Josh Reynolds. The conversion failed and the Horns were up by eight.

The Horns appeared prime to increase their lead when Greg Clark knocked the ball from the arms of the Hornets, but in a moment of generosity, they gave the ball back to Holland. Brady Skinner stepped in front of a Hornet pass and took it back 15 yards to paydirt. Josh Reynolds ran in the extra points to make it 22-6.

During the final period, the Hornets were able to move the ball against the Longhorn defense. Late in the game, they drove inside the Horn 10-yard line but they were unable to cash in. Taking over on downs, Axtell was able to run out the clock and ensure their second win in three games.

Axtell 31, Holland 0

(Axtell) – The Axtell Longhorns pulled off their first shut-out of 2008 Friday night beating the Holland Hornets 31-0. The offense totaled 338 yards on offense but ended up with fewer first downs than the Hornets who mustered 128 yards in offense. The first play from scrimmage resulted in a 15-yard penalty against Holland in a precursor of things to come. Weston Popham wrapped up the opening drive with a 23 yard scamper for the score. After taking a week off, Axtell extra point conversion woes returned with a vengeance. The kick was wide left, leaving the score 6-0. The Horns only converted only the extra point on their final score. Brandon Trent fooled everyone, including the Hornets, with an on-side kickoff and topped it off by recovering the kick himself setting the Horns offense up at the Hornet 45-yard line. The third down play found a loose pigskin that was covered up by the Horns Kayln Yose, forcing an Axtell punt. Holland's Clayton Ash attempted a screen pass that was intercepted by DL Ryan Clark who was not fooled at all. He returned the ball to the Hornet's 21-yard line. The Horns were not able to move the ball and gave the ball back to Holland on downs. The teams traded punts to wind up the quarter.

Axtell got the ball in great position early in the second after a punt and proceeded to drive 45 yards to increase their lead. Seth Keene polished off the drive with a 5 yard run. The pass for two was incomplete. Punts, a fake punt and one of the seven fumbles lost round out most the rest of the half. The exception to that rule was a 26 yard touchdown carry by Porter Miles. This time it was the snap that doomed the extra point attempt, but the Horns were still up 18-0.

Charlie Groce ended the Hornets opening drive with an interception that would have set the Horns up at midfield except for the yellow hankie on the ground. Instead, Axtell began at their own 12-yard line. Again fumbles plagued the teams as they traded fumbles. Axtell began their next scoring at the Hornet forty after receiving their gift. Popham hit Groce for the final 13 yards and a 24-0 lead with 1:55 left in the quarter. The teams again exchanged fumbles before going to the final period.

Early in the fourth, Jacob Kubitzka broke loose for a 56 yard score. Brandon Trent's kick gave Axtell their final margin of victory at 31-0. Holland tried hard to erase the goose egg, but the defense would not budge. The offense was content to run the clock down and get backup players some playing time.

Holland turned the ball over five times, twice on interceptions and losing three of four fumbles. Axtell dropped the ball seven times losing three of them. Axtell finished with nine first downs while Holland had eleven.

Axtell's record in Game 4 is 32-27-2 with an average score of 18-16. Axtell has been outscored by their opponent 1074-968 in game 4. Under Coach Cadell, their record is 6-5-0 with an average score of 17-23. They have been outscored by their opponents 183-251.

Axtell's record on September 19th is 8-0-0 with an average score of 29-9. They have outscored their opponents 235-72. Under Coach Cadell, they are 2-0-0 with an average score of 34-21. They have been outscored by their opponents 67-42.

Axtell's 8-0-0 record against Bosqueville is the most wins against a single team without a loss. It is one better than the 7-0-0 record against Connally 'B'.

The 31-0 win over Holland marked the 22nd time that Axtell has shut out their opponent in their first head-to-head meeting.

Axtell 33, Frost 28

Game date

(Frost) – Homer Pricer threw for 155 yards and 4 touchdowns to lead the Axtell Longhorns to a come from behind 33-28 victory over the Frost Polar Bears. Going into the final period, things seemed to be going the Longhorns way. Pricer hit Donny Elston for a 45 yard touchdown in the first quarter and followed up with the extra point kick. In the second, Randy Greene, who finished with 155 yards on the ground, found paydirt from 5 yards out. In the third quarter, Pricer found Elston again, this time from 13 yards out. Axtell entered that quarter leading 21-13, but the Polar Bears suddenly came to life scoring two touchdowns, the last coming in late in the game. Pricer struck from 13 yards again, this time to Eric Baker. The conversion failed leaving the Horns down by a single point with time running out. Everyone in the stadium knew the on-side kick was coming and somehow the Horns ended up at the bottom of the pile. Baker caught the Pricer 'Hail Mary' for a 47-yard miracle and the Longhorn victory.
