Axtell's record in Game 1 is 31-24-5 with an average score of 17-12. Axtell has outscored their opponent 1040-744 in game 1. Under Coach Cadell, their record is 8-3-0 with an average score of 24-19. They have outscored their opponents 271-212.

Axtell's record in the month of August is 3-0-0 with an average score of 28-16. They have outscored their opponents 85-48.

Game 7

October 24, 1986

Axtell – In a game that featured the highest ranked teams to meet in a Central Texas regular season game since a 1977 match up between #1 Valley Mills and #2 Axtell, the standing room only crowd at Ellison Field was not disappointed. The Longhorns and Yellow Jackets stood toe to toe and slugged it out. Axtell QB Bruce Beets turned in another outstanding game and his passing (12-15 for 287 yds and 3 TDs) was the difference maker.

Axtell opened the scoring when Michael Benson scored from 10 yards out. The teams traded scores in the second stanza and Axtell took a 13-7 lead into the locker room. Clint Dye took the second half kickoff and in a play designed just for Axtell, handed it to Robert Davenport who returned it 75 yards for a touchdown. The extra point put the Horns behind for the first time during the 1986 season. How did a team which entered the game averaging 50.5 points per game (even with a 6-0 opening game victory) respond to this development? They did it with a 5 play 75 yard drive of their own which culminated with a 44 yard pass from Beets to Brian Hand. Meridian, proving that they also deserved their ranking, put together a 95 yard drive in 16 plays. The drive had stalled when Ray Bible was thrown for a 7 yard loss on third and 3 at the Meridian 15 yard line, but a personal foul breathed new life into the Jackets. Another play implemented just for Axtell, a halfback pass from star running back Tony Pollard, netted 32 yards during the drive. Pollard capped the drive from one yard out. Trailing in penetrations 5-3, Meridian decided to go for two, but Beets batted away the pass. Meridian had a golden opportunity when Benson fumbled near midfield with 5:29 remaining. The threat was killed when Kyle Bradford made a leaping interception. The game was iced three plays later when Beets hit Brad Gordon for a 57 yard score. Hands reception on the conversion ensured there would be no last minute heroics from the Yellow Jackets.
