

Potions/Scrolls Use Proposal

Rules Addition to follow text on page 64, following the potion creation table. Text is to read:

Potions and scrolls are adventure only items, and may be used only in during adventures, regardless of the spell or ability they represent.

Example: A player may use a spell of 'Cure Light Wounds' during any type of event, but may only use a potion of 'Cure Light Wounds' during an adventure. A player may cast the spell 'Fireball' at any type of event, but may only use a scroll of 'Fireball' during an adventure.

Stab Tip Dimensions Proposal

Due to unfortunate oversight and omission, crushing tips/stab tips/red tips added to weapons are currently unregulated in size/shape. This proposal asks to add the following text to the top of page 54, following 'missile weapons' and preceding 'siege weapons'

Thrusting Tips

There are many weapons in Darkon, and many of them may be equipped with an optional 'Thrusting tip' which does either red or yellow damage. Any thrusting tip must conform to a set of safety standards as stated in Chapter Three

As well as the following text added to page 44 following 'Black Glaive' and preceding 'Shields'

Thrusting Tips

Thrusting tips must be firmly attached to a weapon, and must be at least one half inch thick and three inches in diameter and especially well padded with an open cell type of foam.

As thrusting tips are one of the hardest Darkon weapons to make safely, new players are strongly encouraged to speak to a veteran with thrusting tip construction experience before attempting to construct any thrusting tips on their own.

A Noble or Weapon Marshal may cut into a Javelin to ensure proper, safe construction.

Bylaws change

Proposed the following be added to the text of page 218 (Appendix II, Article IV, part 1, number i, section v, number 1, attached to a)

- I) All senate proposals must be presented to the magistrate in writing at least five days in advance of the senate meeting.
- II) All senate proposals must be presented to the magistrate must be placed onto the senate agenda

This is to ensure that in the future no member of the EB nor any other governing body may prevent items of concern from being heard by the senate.
