From "History of Suffield, by Hezekiah Spencer Sheldon,p.36: "John Ingersoll of Westfield and his son John had grants in Suffield, but probably did not settle. Another son, Thomas, had the proprietary rights of John senior, but did not settle here."

John Ingersoll (1615-84) received an Original Land Grant, in 1666, in Westfield, Connecticut, where he died. He was born in England.

Article in NEHG Register (Volume 151, April 1997, pp. 153-165) by David L. Greene, "The English Origins (and Spiritual Turmoil) of John Ingersoll of Westfield, Massachusetts," states that the parents of John Ingersoll were Thomas Ingersoll/Inkersall and Margery Eaton. Thomas applied to the Bishop of London for a license to marry Margery Eaton on Dec. 14, 1620. The couple were married in St. Dunstan parish, Stepney, Middlesex on Dec. 15, 1620. Later they would return to Derby where John was born in 1626. In his statement for entering the church, John Ingersoll mentioned his boyhood in Derby.

John Inkersall was married three times: (1) to Dorothy Lord, (2) to Abigail Bascom, and (3) to Mary Hunt. His date of death is often given as 2 September 1684. He is buried at the Old Westfield Cemetery, Westfield, Conn.

From Charles J. Peterson: 14 October 2001. A survey of sources on RootsWeb's WorldConnect Project site shows 100 attributions of John Ingersoll to parents Richard Ingersoll (son of George Ingersoll) and Ann Langley; 13 references to parents Thomas Ingersoll and Margery Eaton; 33 sources which cite George Inkersall as parent; and 1 reference to Geoffrey Ingersoll and Dorothy Morleigh as parents. Apparently Thomas Ingersoll and Margery Eaton are his actual parents.

John Ingersoll or Ingerson of Westfield, Massachusetts. 1539-1681, various Inkersall/Inkersoll/Inkerstall/Intersall/Intarsall/Enkersall records recorded in the records of All Saints, St. Werburgh, and St. Alkmund Parishes in Derby, Derbyshire, England.

25 January 1641/1642, John Ingersoll, age 15, son of Thomas Ingersoll of Darby, shoemaker, apprenticed to Thomas Dawes of Tylers and Bricklayers Company in London. John may not have completed his apprenticeship due to the English Civil War.

\* circa 1644, in Darby [sic], old England, according to his public revelation of religious experience.

\* circa 1651, married Dorothy Lord in Hartford, Connecticut.

28 November 1654, fined 10 shillings by the Connecticut Particular Court for lying.

\* January 1656/1657, Dorothy Lord Ingersoll died in Northampton, Massachusetts, where the family had moved up the Connecticut River from Hartford.

\* 12 December 1657, married Abigail Bascom.

\* April 1666, Abigail Bascom Ingersoll died; John settled in what was to become Westfield this year when he received a grant of 20 acres of land.

\* circa 1667, marriage to Mary Hunt.

\* 12 August 1673, John Inkersall named in the will of his father Thomas Inkersall, of Derby, Derbyshire, England.

\* 1679, one of "seven pillars" (founders) of the Westfield Church.

\* 3 September 1684, John Ingersoll died at age of 58.

\* 18 August 1690, Mary Hunt Ingersoll, widow of John, died.
