Dr. Emmanuel C. Alozie (alum, '86)



Emmanuel C. Alozie (Ph.D., Southern Mississippi) is professor of media communications and has taught at Governors State University, North Carolina A&T State University, Lincoln University, Shaw University, and Edward Waters College. He served as an interim coordinator of marketing, public relations and Outreach at St. Marys' Heath Center, Jefferson City, Missouri, and as an accounts and advertising/public relations official with the United Bank of Africa, Nigeria. He has also worked for the Associated Press, Columbus (Ga.) Ledger-Enquirer, Asbury Park Press, Kansas City Star, and Topeka Capital-Journal and Oakland Tribune.

His areas of teaching and research interests are in development communication, international/cultural journalism, advertising and public relations.

Alozie, who served an assistant editor for Democratic Communiqué, published Cultural Reflections and the Role of Advertising in the Socio-Economic and National Development of Nigeria (2005, Mellen) and co-edited, Toward the Common Good: Perspectives in International Public Relations (2004, Ally & Bacon). His publications include numerous several book chapters as well as articles and reviews in leading national and international academic journals and conference proceedings in communication. He has presented his scholarly works at national and international conferences.

The Rust College undergraduate, who earned his master's from Arkansas State University, has received teaching and research awards as well as fellowships/grants from many organizations and institutions including the Association for Education of Journalism and Mass Communication, Southern Illinois University, Governors State University, the Freedom Forum, American Press Institute, Cap-Cities/ABC, Inland Press Association, Dow Jones Newspaper Fund, American Society of Newspaper Editors and Poynter Institute.
