

## Instructions to Authors

**Submission of Manuscripts.** Manuscripts should be submitted to the Dr. Ambika Arasu, Editor, The Indian Journal of Lymphology, Room No.11, Vijaya Health Centre, NSK Salai, Vadapalani, Chennai-600 026. The original and three copies of text and illustrations are required. All articles are subject to editorial revision. Submission of an article is taken as acceptance by the author that it contains nothing that is libellous or infringes copyright. When an article is accepted for publication the copyright will belong to the publisher.

**Presentation of Manuscript.** The manuscript, in English, should be typed with double spacing on one side only with a margin of at least 3 cm all around. It should commence with a separate title page, showing title and author(s) name(s). Each author should indicate his/her professional discipline and current appointments. Author's degrees and qualifications are required for articles, book reviews and letters for publication. The full address (including postal code) is required for each author. The person to whom reprint requests are to be sent should be indicated.

A summary of not more than 200 words must follow the title page. Each page of the manuscript should be numbered consecutively. Typescripts should be carefully checked before submission as no changes to the content of the accepted manuscript can be allowed at any stage of production.

The format of the article should be in the following sequence - Key words, Summary/Abstract, Introduction, Methodology, Results, Discussion, Conclusion, Details of Author's Address for Correspondence, Acknowledgements and References.

**Headings** Normally only two categories of heading should be used. Major ones should be typed in capital letters in the middle of the page and underlined; sub-headings should be typed in lowercase and also underlined. Headings should not be numbered.

**Data and Terminology** All quantitative measurements should be given in System International (SI) units. Authors should indicate the statistical techniques to determine significance, etc. Where percentage are given, the actual numbers on which these are based should also be provided.

**Tables** These should be typed double-spaced on separate sheets (i.e. not incorporated within the written text). A short descriptive title should appear above

each table with a clear legend, and any footnotes suitably identified below. All units must be included.

**Illustrations** Line drawings should be on separate sheets of good quality white paper and drawn in black ink. They should be about twice the size of final reproduction. Bromide prints made from original line drawings are acceptable. Half-tone figures should be clear, highly-contrasted black and white glossy prints (colour photographs should be avoided). Photomicrographs should have internal scale-markers where appropriate. X-ray films should be submitted as photographic prints carefully made to bring out the details to be illustrated, with an overlay indicating the area of importance.

Figures should be completely lettered, taking into account necessary size reduction. Captions should be typed, double spaced, on a separate sheet. All figures should be clearly marked in pencil on the reverse side with the number, author's name and top edge indicated.

**References** The accuracy and completeness of references are of the utmost importance. The need to query inaccurate or incomplete references causes unnecessary delay.

**1. References in the Text:** These should be quoted by the name(s) of the author(s) and the date of publication. In the case of two authors, both names should be stated. In the case of more than two authors, only the first should be stated, followed by "et al". References must be indicated by numbers. Authors must specifically ensure that all references in the text also appear in the references list, and vice versa.

**2. Reference List:** This should appear at the end of the paper in alphabetical order. The author's name should be followed by his/her initials (unpunctuated), and separated from that of the next author by a comma. The names of all authors should be given (do not use "et al" in the reference list). Next should appear the date of publication, followed by details of the work in question:

**Resubmission of Manuscripts.** When manuscripts are returned to authors for revision with referee's comments, two copies of the revised paper should be resubmitted to the Editor. A letter must be enclosed detailing the action taken with regard to each point raised by the referees. If it is felt that no changes is appropriate with regard to a specific point, this should be clearly explained.
