

Cordell, Absalom L.—Private Sept. 9, 1861. Absent without leave from Feb. 1, 1862. Dropped from rolls Apr. 7, 1863.

Cox, George Q.—Private July 17, 1861. Wounded at Winchester, Va. May 25, 1862. Captured at Fort Steadman, Va. Mar. 25, 1865. Exchanged in 1865. Surrendered, Appomattox, Va. Apr. 9, 1865.

Curren, Edward—Private Feb. 22, 1862. Wounded at Cold Harbor, Va. June 27, 1862; Sharpsburg, Md. Sept. 17, 1862. Roll for June 30, 1864, bears remark: "Dropped, supposed to have deserted Mar. 1, 1864." No later record.

Davenport, John Frank—Private July 17, 1861. Wounded at Chantilly, Va. Sept. 1, 1862. Appointed 4th Sergeant July 1, 1864. Killed on picket at Snicker's Ferry, Va. July 18, 1864.

Davis, Charles L.—Private July 17, 1861. Discharged, disability, Oct. 17, 1861. Enlisted as a private in Co. G, 46th Regt. Ga. Inf. July 1, 1862. Wounded at Kennesaw Mountain, Ga. June 20, 1864. Roll for Aug. 1864, last on file, shows him "In LaGrange, Ga. hospital, wounded." Examined by Medical Board at Eufaula, Ala. for retirement Jan. 24, 1865, and recommended for light duty. Return of Post at Columbus, Ga. shows he was received there Feb. 27, 1865. No later record.

Doyal, David J.—See Dyal.

Dunaway, John F. M. (or Dunnaway)—Private July 17, 1861. Died at Cold Harbor, Va. Dec. 31, 1861.

Dunaway, Wiley M. (or Dunnaway)—Private July 17, 1861. Died of disease in Culpeper, Va. hospital Jan. 14, 1862.

Dyal, David J.—Private Oct. 24, 1863. Wounded at Plymouth, N. C. Apr. 18, 1864. Deserted. Received by Provost Marshal General at Washington, D. C., a Confederate deserter, Apr. 4, 1865. Took oath of allegiance to U. S. Govt., date not given, and furnished transportation to Savannah, Ga.

Elam, Thomas J.—Private July 17, 1861. Appointed Musician. Received by Provost Marshal General, a Confederate deserter, Mar. 29, 1865. Took oath of allegiance to U. S. Govt. and sent to Washington, D. C. Apr. 4, 1865.

Elliott, Samuel W.—Private Feb. 25, 1862. Wounded at 2d Manassas, Va. Aug. 28, 1862. Died of wounds Sept. 1, 1862.

Floyd, George J.—Private Feb. 25, 1862. Died at Culpeper, Va. Apr. 15, 1862.

Garland, Samuel W.—Private Feb. 24, 1862. Died in General Hospital #2, at Lynchburg, Va. May 9, 1862. Buried there in Confederate Cemetery. No. 6, 3d Line, Lot 168—Christain's Factory.

Gartrell, Joseph S. W.—Private July 17, 1861. Discharged, disability, Sept. 1861. Reenlisted Mar. 4, 1862. Roll for Aug. 31, 1864, last on file, shows he was dropped from rolls Mar. 1, 1864: supposed to have deserted.

Gibbons, William—Private July 17, 1861. Wounded at Cold Harbor, Va. June 27, 1862; Fredericksburg, Va. Dec. 13, 1862. On detached duty at Columbus, Ga. Oct. 17, 1863. No later record.

Gilbert, William H.—Private Mar. 3, 1864. Surrendered, Appomattox, Va. Apr. 9, 1865.

Glynn, John—Private July 17, 1861. Killed at 2d Manassas, Va. Aug. 28, 1862.

Goodman, James G.—Private July 17, 1861. Wounded at 2d Manassas, Va. Aug. 28, 1862. Captured at Farmville, Va. Apr. 6, 1865. Released at Newport News, Va. June 26, 1865.

Goodman, Joel—Private Apr. 1, 1864. Roll for Aug. 31, 1864, last on file, shows him present. No later record.

Goodwin, Parker—Private Sept. 9, 1861. Died at Culpeper, Va. Apr. 15, 1862.

Graves, Thomas J.—Private July 17, 1861. Appointed 4th Sergeant in 1862. Killed at Gettysburg, Pa. July 2, 1863.

Harper, William P.—Private July 17, 1861. Discharged, disability, at Richmond, Va., prior to Apr. 30, 1862.

Harrell, Joseph E.—Private Dec. 1, 1863. Appointed Musician. Captured at Burkeville, Va. Apr. 5, 1865, and paroled there Apr. 14-17, 1865. (Born in Crawford County, Ga. June 22, 1835.)
