WEST COAST CONFERENCE CROSS COUNTRY

MEN'S HISTORY

The West Coast Conference has sponsored Cross Country Championships since 1976, and it has been a storied championship for the University of Portland. The men's team has dominated this championship by winning it for 25 consecutive years, the longest streak in any sport in WCC history. Portland runners have also won the individual championship 25 straight years and have swept the top five positions nine times, including five straight years from 1994 to 1999. That streak was snapped in 2000 as San Diego's Antonio Lopez finished second to Portland's Ryan Craig. It was the highest finish by a non-Portland runner since 1989. In 2002, Portland was once again impressive, as five Pilots finished in the top 10, led by individual winner Jeff Driscoll. Driscoll won the race with a time of 24:54, one second off of the WCC Championship course record that was set by his brother, Joe, in 2000. The 2003 championship was more of the same as Portland's Brett Carter became the 12th different Portland runner to win the WCC Championship in the last 12 years.

Pilots Joe Driscoll and Bryan Bothwell each surpassed the men's 8K course record in 1999, with Driscoll beating Bothwell by one second to win the overall title in 24:53. The old record of 24:56 had been set by UP's Todd Davis only one year earlier. Santa Clara is the only school to come close to defeating Portland. The 1985 Broncos squad had five runners in the top ten, including Rory O'Flaherty at #3, but Brent Felt and John Bursell finished 1-2 for the Pilots to defeat Santa Clara by the slimmest margin in WCC history, 11 points (26-37). In 1986, Bronco runners O'Flaherty and Bill Quirk finished in the top five, but Felt and the Pilots again finished first, winning 27-48. Nevada-Reno is the only other squad to win the West Coast Athletic Conference (WCAC) Cross Country Championships--taking four straight from 1975-1978.

WOMEN'S HISTORY

Portland's women's team, like their male counterparts, have also dominated this event. The Pilots have won 14 of the last 19 women's championships the WCC has sponsored, including seven of the last eight. After finishing in second place in 2001, Portland reclaimed the women's title in 2002, with four runners finishing in the top 10. Allegra Porter of Saint Mary's won the women's race with a time of 17:42, the second fastest time ever recorded at the WCC Women's Cross Country Championships. In 2003, Portland captured its 14th WCC crown, landing five runners in the top 10. However, it was San Diego's Tiffanie Marley who took home the individual crown, becoming the first Torero to capture the title. In 2001, Santa Clara captured its first WCC Cross Country Championship stunning Portland by a slim 46 points to 63 points, ending the Pilots' streak of five straight titles. Paced by freshman Robin Bell who captured third place, the Broncos claimed five of the top fifteen spots. Though LMU finished in seventh place, junior Edit Pakay took home the individual title with a time of 17:58, the sixth fastest time recorded at the WCC Championships and the all-time fastest championship pace set by an LMU runner. Pakay was followed by Saint Mary's Allegra Porter, who clocked in at 18:07, good for the eighth fastest pace all-time, while also setting a then Saint Mary's record for the fastest time in Gaels' history. In 2000, Pilot Nicole Ricci claimed the individual championship beating teammate Alyson Barrett to the line by 39 seconds. It was the third-largest individual victory margin in the history of the women's race. The Pilots finished 17 points ahead of runner-up Gonzaga, who matched Portland by placing four runners in the top ten. The Pilots, however, used the strength of a 1-2-3 finish by Ricci, Barrett, and Jessie Newton to successfully defend their title.

Former WCC member US International took the first two championships in 1985 and 1986. In 1986, Nevada-Reno's Patty Young set a Crystal Springs Women's 5K course record at 17:47 that stood until 1994. Portland won the first of three consecutive championships in 1987. The 1987 Pilot squad set a WCC scoring record of 18 points, a feat which has yet to be surpassed. Saint Mary's captured its only championship in 1990, narrowly defeating Portland 55-59 behind individual winner Anne Wedum, who crossed the finish line with a time of 18:33. Portland and Saint Mary's ran neck-and-neck in 1991, with the Pilots capturing the title by two points, 43-45, the slimmest margin in WCC history. The Pilots then reeled off three more championships through 1994, with an average victory margin of 51 points in each of those three years. Nicole Karr surpassed the 8 year-old course record in 17:43 to lead the Pilots in 1994. In 1995, Gonzaga placed 4 of the top 7 runners to win the championship, followed by a rugged Saint Mary's squad which placed 4 of the top 10 runners. Gonzaga sophomore Cheska Fairbanks set a new course and championships record in 1996 at 17:26, but Portland regained the championship throne.

The freshman from Olympia, WA led the Pilots to a first place finish at the Auburn Invitational out of a 21-team field. Moore was the top Pilot finisher, and third overall, on the 8K course with a time of 25:00.1. That mark was the fifth fastest time in the WCC this season. Moore runs for Portland's "A" team and has been limited in the number of appearances this fall. The Auburn Invitational was the only race Moore ran in during the month of October. Moore will continue to run for the Portland "A" team, and will not be competing in the WCC Cross Country Championships.

The senior from Lake Elizabeth, CA posted a personal best and school all-time best time of 17:41.0 at the Willamette Invitational on the 5K course. That mark was also the fastest time recorded in the WCC this season. Marley placed 16th overall in the highly competitive race. Marley also competed in the Triton Classic and the UNLV Invitational in October. She was the top Torero finisher in the Triton Classic with a sixth place overall finish, and she won the UNLV Invitational with a time of 18:40.5 on the 6K course. Marley is the defending 2003 WCC women's champion.

GONZAGA BULLDOGS

Gonzaga returns a number of experienced runners on both the men's and women's teams to this year's WCC Championships...Gonzaga's top male returner is **Ryan Anderson**, who finished sixth overall in 2003...The Bulldogs also return seventh place finisher **Joe Miller**, and eighth place finisher **Joe Manning**...For the women, 13th place finisher **Jill Semenza** is the top returning Bulldog, while 16th place **Jamie Schiel** also returns for Gonzaga...Semenza has led Gonzaga in each of the five races the women have competed in this year...Anderson and Miller have each led the Bulldogs in two races, while Manning was the top Gonzaga finisher in one race this season...Last year, the men finished second, while the women claimed fourth place at the championships...In the 2004 preseason poll, Gonzaga men were picked to finish second, while the women were picked third.



LOYOLA MARYMOUNT LIONS

Loyola Marymount enters the 2004 WCC Championships with veteran squads for both the men and the women...Five of the top seven men ran in last year's championship race...**Adam Bacon** is the top Lion returner for the men after a 20th place finish in last year's race...Three of the top seven women also return for the Lions who are led by 20th place finisher **Kristen Gonzalez**...Bacon has been the top Lion finisher in each of the four invitationals the men have competed in this year...The women have been led by four different runners in the five races they have competed in...**Maria Degitz** was the top Lion finisher twice, while **Kelly Yahr**, Gonzalez, and **Brittany Rezowalli** have each led Loyola Marymount once...The LMU men finished in fourth place last season, while the women took home fifth...Both teams were picked to finish in fourth place in the 2004 preseason poll.



PEPPERDINE WAVES

Pepperdine brings some experienced runners as well as some talented underclassmen to this year's WCC Championships...**Chad Trammell** is the top Wave returner for the men after a 12th place finish at the 2003 championships...14th place finisher **Louis Rich** also returns for Pepperdine...**Tarrah Crowley** returns for the women after a 14th place finish in last year's race...Trammell and Rich each led the Waves in one competition this season, while newcomer **Brian Washburn** was the top Wave finisher at three different races...The women have been led by **Kyla Maher** on three occasions, while **Katie Clary**, Crowley, and **Taylor Carroll** have all led the Waves once this season...In 2003, the men finished fifth, while the women took home third...The men were picked to finish sixth in the 2004 preseason poll, while the women were picked tied for fourth.



PORTLAND PILOTS

Portland returns the top five overall finishers from the 2003 WCC Championships on the men's side, along with the fourth and sixth place finishers from a year ago for the women...**Brett Carter**, **Trevor Coolidge**, **Matt Perez**, **Matt Sheeks**, and **Brendan Robinson** finished one through five a year ago, while **Breanne Siebol** and **Kristen Rohde** are the top returners for the women...Robinson was the top Pilot finisher for the men twice this season, while Coolidge and **John Moore** finished first once...Moore will not be competing in the championships...Newcomer **Amie Dahne** led the Pilots twice this year, while fellow newcomer **Allison Richie** was the top Portland runner once, as was **Kelsey Metcalfe**...The Pilot men and women took home first place a year ago at the 2003 WCC Championships...The men were picked to finish first again this year in the 2004 preseason poll, while the women shared the top billing with the Santa Clara women.



SAINT MARY'S GAELS

Saint Mary's men bring back some experienced runners to the 2004 championships, while the women are filled with fresh faces...Four of the top seven men return from a year ago, led by 19th place finisher **Andrew Parsel**...34th place finisher **Casey Chadd** also returns for the men...The women return just two runners from the 2003 squad that competed in the championships...Parsel was the top Gael male finisher at every race SMC competed in this year...Transfer **Evelyn Bocanegra**, like Parsel, led the Gaels in every competition the women competed in this year...Bocanegra will be making her WCC Championships debut in this year's race...The Gaels are looking to improve upon the eighth place finishes for the men and the women at last year's championships...SMC was picked to finish eighth in the men's and women's races in the 2004 preseason poll.



SAN DIEGO TOREROS

San Diego returns the top overall women's finisher from the 2003 championships, as well as some other experienced runners and talented newcomers to the 2004 WCC Championships...**Tiffanie Marley** returns as the reigning WCC women's individual champion...The men return 28th place finisher **Brent Warnken** and 35th place finisher **Dennis Sheehan**...Besides Marley, the women return 32nd place finisher **Cassandra Chavez**...Sheehan was the top male Torero finisher at four different competitions this year, while Warnken led USD on two occasions...Chavez led the Torero women early in the year at two races, while Marley came on strong to lead USD in four competitions...The men finished in seventh place last year, while the women took home sixth place at the 2003 championships...San Diego was picked to finish seventh in both races in the 2004 preseason poll.



SAN FRANCISCO DONS

San Francisco brings a very balanced men's team with three returners and three newcomers to the 2004 WCC Championships...The women return just one runner from the 2003 championships in their top seven...**Eric Flemming** is the top Don returner for the men after a 17th place finish a year ago...**Renee Stribling** is the lone returner for the women after placing 18th at last year's championship...Newcomer **Cheyne Inman** led the men four times this season, and was named WCC Player of the Month in September...**Ryan Courtwright** led the Don men once...**Jeannine Hagedorn** was the top woman finisher for the Dons five different times this season, and was also named WCC Player of the Month for September...**Lucy Miller** finished first for the women once...Last season, the men came in sixth, while the women claimed seventh place...USF was picked fifth for the men and sixth for the women in the 2004 preseason poll.



SANTA CLARA BRONCOS

Santa Clara returns a number of experienced runners as well as some very talented newcomers for both the men and the women...15th place finisher at the 2003 championships, **John Hinman**, returns for the Broncos, as does 25th place finisher **JP Thyken**...The women return fifth place finisher **Lauren Swigart**, ninth place finisher **Robin Bell**, 10th place finisher **Katie Hansen**, and 12th place finisher **Blossom Marimpietri**...Newcomer **Michael Delaurenti** led the Bronco men on three occasions this year, while **Chris Doerhoff** was the top Bronco finisher once...**Jessica Baldwin-Philippi** led the Bronco women twice this season, while **Ann Thomas** and Hansen each led the women once...The SCU men finished third last season at the championships, while the women claimed second...The men were picked to finish this season in third place, while the women shared the top spot in the 2004 preseason poll with Portland...The women won the first SCU cross country title in 2001.

AROUND THE WCC

FASTEST TIMES

Gonzaga's Ryan Anderson and San Diego's Tiffanie Marley have posted the fastest times in the WCC for the men and the women, respectively. Anderson paced the Bulldogs, and finished 14th overall, at the Willamette Invitational with a time of 24:41.0 on the 8K course. Marley was the top Torero finisher, and 16th overall, at the same Willamette Invitational with a time of 17:41.0 on the 5K course. That time marked a personal best for Marley, the 2003 WCC Champion. It was also a school best for San Diego women's cross country. Anderson also recorded the 10th fastest time in the WCC this year at the National Catholic Invitational at Notre Dame with a time of 25:11.0, while Marley also posted the seventh fastest time in the WCC this year at the Aztec Invitational at San Diego State with a time of 18:25.0.

FIRST PLACE FINISHES

WCC men's cross country teams have recorded first-place finishes on seven different occasions this year, while the women have posted four first-place finishes. Both the Gonzaga men and women took home the title at the Sasquatch Invitational on Sept. 11. The Portland men have three first place finishes in the four events they have run this year. The Pilot men claimed the top spot at the Pier Park Invitational on Sept. 10, the Auburn Invitational on Oct. 11, and the Jim Danner Invitational on Oct. 16. The Portland women recorded a first place finish at the Pier Park Invitational as well. The San Diego men and women each have one first place finish this season. The men claimed the top spot at the USD Invitational on Sept. 11, while the women took home the top honor at the UNLV Invitational on Oct. 16. The San Francisco men placed first at the Triton Classic on Oct. 9, while the Santa Clara men and women took home first place honors at the Bronco Invitational on Sept. 4.

TOP RUNNERS RETURN TO WCC CROSS COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS

The top five male runners from the 2003 WCC Championships will all attend this year's race. Portland's Brett Carter (alternate), Trevor Coolidge, Matt Perez, Matt Sheeks, and Brendan Robinson are all on the Portland roster for the 2004 championships. On the women's side, 2003 winner Tiffanie Marley from San Diego will be back to defend her title, along with 2003 fourth place finisher Breanne Siebol from Portland, and fifth place finisher Lauren Swigart from Santa Clara.

PORTLAND AND SANTA CLARA TOP WCC PRESEASON CROSS COUNTRY POLLS

San Bruno, Calif. - The University of Portland was tabbed to claim the 2004 men's cross country title, while Portland and Santa Clara split the vote to capture the women's title, as chosen by the WCC head coaches. Portland is the overwhelming favorite to win the men's competition, receiving the maximum of 49 points and all seven first place votes from the seven other WCC schools. The Santa Clara men received the one remaining first place vote. In the women's poll, both Portland and Santa Clara earned 46 points and received four first place votes.

The Pilots have won the men's race 25 consecutive years, the longest streak in any sport in WCC history. Portland runners have also taken the top individual spot in as many years, with freshman Brett Carter taking home the title at the 2003 championship with a time of 25:42. In 2003, the Pilots recorded the top five fastest times and placed seven runners in the top 10, all receiving All-WCC honors.

The Portland women, like their male counterparts, have dominated WCC cross country. The Pilots have won 14 of the last 19 women's championships the WCC has sponsored, including seven of the last eight. Santa Clara broke the Pilot's five-year winning streak in 2001 and finished second to Portland the past two years. In 2003, Portland placed five runners in the top 10 of the women's competition, while the Broncos landed four in the top 10 and five in the top 15. The Broncos return all five of those top finishers from a year ago and are led by sophomore Lauren Swigart, Santa Clara's fastest performer. Last year's women's race belonged to San Diego's Tiffanie Marley, who returns to defend her title in 2004. Marley finished with a time of 18:04, and was the first Torero woman to win the WCC title.

Gonzaga is slated to finish second in the men's poll, while Santa Clara, who received the only other first place vote, is picked to finish in third. Loyola Marymount was tabbed fourth, with San Francisco taking fifth and Pepperdine coming in at sixth. San Diego and Saint Mary's round out the men's field in seventh and eighth place, respectively.

Gonzaga was picked to finish third, behind Portland and Santa Clara in the women's poll. Loyola Marymount and Pepperdine share the fourth place spot. San Francisco, San Diego, and Saint Mary's earned sixth through eighth place, respectively.

The 2004 WCC Men's and Women's Cross Country Championship will take place on October 30 at Crystal Springs Cross Country Course in Belmont, CA.
