

10Aug05	Around the World - Canada and Canadian Cubs	Hall	Leader: Rama Duty Six: Brown
Gathering	Canadian puzzles (<i>Find-a-Word</i>) and Canada stuff (<i>binders, Cub book, badge chart, flag, map, misc</i>) Explain that this is a Canadian Cub pack meeting, including a Canadian inspection, opening		
18h00 - 18h15	Inspection leaders inspect sixes, look for 25 cents for telephone, badges on sash, paws and claws, fur and fangs, pen and paper, Cub book (6 points max per Cub - total for six - winning six leads the Grand Howl) Grand Howl and flag break (<i>Canadian flag</i>)		
18h15 - 18h30	Forest Dodgeball - All the Cubs spread out around the hall. Once they have chosen their position they are not allowed to move. One player is called out and becomes the runner. He must avoid being hit by the ball which is thrown by the other players. He can run, duck, dive etc., but must stay within the boundary of play and cannot hit / knock the other players. The other players try to hit the runner with the ball. They must not move their feet and can only hold the ball a couple of seconds before they throw it. Whoever throws the ball that hits the runner is then 'up' and they must start running. Throwers are not allowed to trip / hit the runner. Variations - throwers can only use one hand - must stand on one leg - cannot talk / shout.		
18h30 - 18h40	Where is Canada? (Raksha) - look at a world map/globe (<i>map</i>) - How are Canada and Australia similar? - lots of empty space, population in a strip, similar governments, lots of immigrants - How are they different? - bilingual, immediate neighbour (US), weather, animals		
18h40 - 18h45	Canada quiz elimination game (Bagheera) - all the Cubs stand in the middle of the playing area. To one side is the true area, to the other side the false area. Ask each question and let the Cubs run to the side they think is correct. Everyone on the wrong side is eliminated, go to flag		
18h45 - 18h55	Draw and colour the Canadian flag (Rama) - talk about the proportions, why red? - draw the flag, colour it in (<i>paper, pencils, red crayons/pencils</i>)		
18h55 -19h10	Canadian Motto, Law, and Promise (Bagheera) (<i>sheets with text in French</i>)		
19h10 - 19h20	Making tir (Rama) - Tir (pull) is a French-Canadian winter treat. Pour maple syrup on snow (or ground up ice in our case), insert a paddle stick, and roll while it hardens. You end up with a nice lolly. We can wrap in plastic to send home. (<i>maple syrup, ground up ice in cooler</i>) Story/Songs - Funky Monkey song w/actions (Rama), Birch Sugaring story, if there is time (Raksha) (<i>story</i>)		
19h20 - 19h30	Closing - question time, notices, Mouse Howl (Brown six), pins (<i>Canada pins</i>)
