## SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS CRITERIA FOR 2009

We are pleased to announce that the Sea Cliff - Glen Head Lions Club will be awarding two \$1,000 scholarships to graduating seniors who **live within the North Shore School District**. This is available to all North Shore resident seniors regardless of the high school he/she attends. The general guidelines are referenced below.

A Scholarship certificate will be presented to the recipients at our installation meeting in June 2009. The Scholarship *check payable to each student* will be mailed after we receive a copy of the enrollment receipt or some other valid proof that attendance is guaranteed in college for the fall semester. Please address this information to the P.O. Box on this letter head.

All students who wish to be considered for these scholarships must submit a completed application by **April 20<sup>th</sup>, 2009 - see attached**. Students who attend NSHS should submit the application to Ms. McNally. Eligible students who attend other high schools should request the assistance of their respective guidance counselors and mail the completed application to the Lions PO Box.

Final interviews will be held in the NS High School during the first two weeks of May. Please check with Ms. McNally at the NSHS – 516/277-7036 for date, time and room number.

### GENERAL CRITERIA:

1. Average grade of 80 or above.
2. Must be accepted to and will attend either a two-year junior college or four-year college.
3. Lions Club International is a service organization. Therefore candidates must have exhibited and demonstrated a sincere effort to community service either within the school curriculum or with outside activities.
4. Special consideration will be given to students that can substantiate financial need.
