Celebrating Easter: The Great Fifty Days

The traditional arrangement of the Easter Season consists of fifty days, often called the "Great Fifty Days." This season begins with the Easter Vigil and concludes with Evening Prayer II of Pentecost. The Paschal candle remains in its prominent position throughout the season and is lighted at all liturgies. When incense is used, the Paschal candle is incensed. At the conclusion of the Easter Season, the candle is placed near the tabernacle.



It is no easy task to extend the celebration of the Easter event throughout the fifty days of the season. The external signs and symbols that we use in our liturgical worship can function to extend this season in our minds and hearts. My brother knights and Columbiettes, it is up to us to pray and meditate on the sacrifice that our Lord did for us and to keep it ever present in our hearts.

The churches help us in this category by having the church itself festively decorated with floral arrangements and bright white alter cloths. Provisions are usually made and should be made so that floral arrangements continue throughout the season. The vesture of the Priests and Deacons should likewise be of a festive character.

What would the Easter season sound like for us? My brother Knights and Columbiettes are we ready to hear the hymnody of Easter ring out in our Council and in **our Hearts and Minds?** Can we have the festive settings ring out throughout the Fifty Days but also keeps it working in our minds and hearts throughout the year? If we have properly prepared ourselves for Easter and the season of Easter we should have a good foundation to let it happen. Would it

not be wonderful to be able to show **Love, Compassion and understanding** throughout the year? We have a responsibility and a commitment to exercise these things not only among ourselves but with all of God's people.

These responsibilities and commitments that we have as men and women of God can be accomplished by fixing our eyes on Jesus. *"Look to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding it's shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God. (Heb. 12:2)"*

The idea of fixing our eyes on Jesus is so simple that even a young child can understand it. Many of us hold two images of Jesus dear to our hearts; the crucified Christ and the risen Lord seated at the right hand of the father in Glory. Still others like to see Him with His Blessed Mother, perhaps in their home at Nazareth. As we fix our eyes on Jesus in this way, something marvelous can begin to happen. The Holy Spirit begins to open our minds and fill us with spiritual wisdom and understanding (Colossians 1:9). We begin to grasp more about Jesus: what He did for us, how much he loves us, how merciful He is, and how much he rejoices with us and suffers with us.

Words from Scripture that previously had no meaning begin to come alive. They enlighten our minds and encourage us to be holy. They convince us that we have god's strength to help us and to make us more fruitful for Jesus. When we grasp who He is and what He has done for us, our only response is to say, "Jesus, I love you." We are in a renewed walk with Jesus all over again, and His love in turn calms our fears, heals our wounds, and energizes us with hope and confidence. Isn't this what we need, Hope and confidence, not only in each other but also with Jesus? Let us, as we gaze upon our Lord, pray that He will help us remove all the

obstacles that may prevent us from being men and women of God.

Culture of Life Fund

This article is included in our newsletter at the request of the Supreme Council. It describes the purpose for a one time assessment against every member.

In order to provide our members information regarding the Culture of Life Fund assessment, please read the following message at your council meeting and publish it in your council newsletter.

Last August, the delegates to the Annual Supreme Council Meeting reaffirmed the Order's longstanding commitment to the Church's teaching on life and marriage by unanimously approving Resolution 302, which established the Culture of Life Fund and a special assessment of \$3.00 per member. It was anticipated that this Fund would support a broad range of initiatives that advance the Culture of Life. I am happy to report that the Fund has done just that. Two programs, one to assist men and women to cope with the traumatic aftereffects of abortion and divorce and one to help men be better fathers have been introduced. To date, the response to these initiatives has far surpassed our expectations.

In addition, our financial support last fall was vital to the passage of constitutional amendments protecting the sanctity of marriage in California, Florida and Arizona. Today, 30 states have such amendments. In January, we implemented our new initiative helping state councils provide pregnancy centers with ultrasound machines. The Supreme Council partnered with local Knights to put this lifesaving technology in the hands of pregnancy centers in both Iowa and Florida. On a national level, the Board of Directors recently voted to provide financial support to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops for a newly formed Task Force whose purpose is to promote the Church's teaching on marriage as

one man and one woman.

The Knights of Columbus has always been deeply committed to promoting racial equality and defending religious liberty as a basic civil right. In the United States today, the abortion lobby has indicated a desire to move the so-called "Freedom of Choice Act (FOCA) through Congress. This radical piece of legislation would not only expand abortion "rights," but also force medical personnel, morally opposed to abortion, to violate their consciences and participate in abortions. In Canada, the Parliament has witnessed the introduction of a private member's bill that would legalize euthanasia across the country. On these and a host of other issues affecting the Culture of life, the Knights of Columbus must be ready to educate the public about the need to support policies and legislations that protect human life from conception to natural death.

Please remember that contributions to the Fund from councils or individual members remain in the country of origin and will only be used for projects in that country.
