Deacon's Corner

This month I would like to share with you some of the teachings that I have been privy to in my preparation to being ordained. Devotion to Mary "Mother of God" is something that is necessary to all of us.



If devotion to the most holy Virgin Mary is necessary to all men simply for working out their salvation, it is still more so for those who are called to any special perfection; and I do believe as members of the Knights and Columbiettes we are called to that special perfection. I, in my humble opinion, think that no-one can really acquire an intimate union with Our Lord and a perfect fidelity to the Holy Ghost without a very great union with the most Holy Virgin, and a great dependence on Her assistance.

but please consider reading it anyway. It is primarily directed at our inactive members - that have left the council for a myriad of reasons, explaining how we got here and where I hope lead the council in the future.

The council's only sources of income were from member dues, and Bingo which supported our charitable donations as well as the majority of the funds that were used to maintain the council hall and pay the bills. We went from generating a lot of income from the two-night weekly Bingo, to enough income to "keep the ship afloat" on just Wednesdays, to having to close down due to the lack of income to support the high overhead of our aging Council Hall. The reason that Bingo was shutdown was due to a lack of volunteer workers.

With the formation of Council 17477 in Avon Park our membership has decreased from 192 to 152 members. Even before the new council was formed attendance at our meetings was typically between 14-22 members. Having just looked at the new council roster, 124 of our current members live in the immediate Sebring area.

As our Council's Grand Knight for the remainder of the current Fraternal Year I would like to challenge every member to get involved in the re-birth of our council - one that is actively pursuing the primary objectives of our Order. As you all know, the main programs areas of the Knights of Columbus are Church, Family, Youth, Community and Council. In the three years since I moved to Sebring our council has only been minimally active in supporting programs in any of these areas, other than the Right to Life programs.

The average age of our members living in the Sebring area is slightly over 71. The demographics are:

20's - 2	60's - 27
30's - 1	70's - 45
40's - 5	80's - 30
50's - 14	90's - 6

Twenty-two members are under age 50 ... 81 are over age 70 ... we are obviously an aging council where many of our members have contributed their time and service for many years. Many of them are unlikely to take leadership rolls in the council at this time in their lives. However, I would like to see you get involved in the council, to share your ideas and experience with our new leadership team.

Our primary objective for this year will be to recruit new members from St. Catherine's to join us in building a new council. I'll be meeting with Father Jose shortly to discuss the Knights and where we fit in our Parish. He has already told me that he will support us in our programs and looks forward to working with us.

As you can see on page two of the newsletter, our Nominating Committee has identified candidates for most of Council Offices for the next Fraternal Year. If you are interested in any position feel free to contact me and I can explain its responsibilities to you.

My objective for the remainder of this Fraternal Year is to lay the groundwork for next year. At our May business meeting I will be giving you a program schedule from my previous council. As you will note when you see it, it was a busy council. My objective would be to pick one or more items in each area and attempt to get involved in our church, families, youth and community.

In order to initiate programs in each of these areas we need to identify sources of income that we can use to support programs. I will propose to you several fund-raising events which we can take on with your support. We will need chairmen or co-chairs to lead these events by planning the event, selling tickets, setting up, preparing food, cleaning up, etc. I know that each event that we take on will take a significant amount of manpower, but each will require leadership. Think about these fund raisers and let me know if you can help.

To our "retired" members - consider attending a meeting and see where we are going. Bring your experience and expertise to the council and share it with our new leaders.

I realize that all of this is a huge undertaking, which will not succeed without your help and support. Give it a chance and see if we can make a change for the better - together!

Pro Life Report

Diocesan Post Card Campaign to Florida Congressional Delegation opposing The Freedom of Choice Act (FOCA).

Once again my brother Knights and their families stepped up to help the Pro-Life program by distributing post cards to our Congressional delegation opposing the Freedom of Choice Act. This proposed legislation would establish the "right" to abortion without any restrictions or limitations. It would effectively repeal any and all federal, state and local laws restricting or limiting abortions in the USA. Fr. Gonzalez, pastor of St. Catherine church, gave permission to distribute the post cards after all weekend Masses on April 18/19.



This program originated with the Respect Life Dept. of the Venice Diocese and was not primarily a K. of C. project. But who else would step up, on short notice, to defend the "Unborn Child"? Our council has a proud history of actively supporting the Pro-Life movement, financially, spiritually, with our property and our personal commitment. For example, who can forget the Pro-Life rally in front of the K.C. hall on the 35th anniversary of the Roe v. Wade decision, January 2008 ? Anyone who participated will remember our crowd standing in front of the K.C. hall, holding our protest signs, on that cold, damp and windy Sunday afternoon. It was one of the my most memorable days of my life.

The post cards we gave out came in sets of three, addressed respectively to our two U.S. senators and to Congressman Tom Rooney. The message on each card pleads with them to, "Please oppose FOCA or any similar measure ..." and

We've offered the council hall and property to St. Catherine parish for \$300,000 without the house on Prospect. It is currently at the Diocese awaiting approval from the Bishop (assume the Diocesan Financial Steering Committee). We expect a decision in a reasonably short timeframe.

The property's value has diminished from the \$1.3 million that it was originally listed at, to the \$600,000 range currently, if we could find a buyer.

As you may remember from previous meetings upon termination of the CMBA any proceeds from disposition of the property must be donated to the church or another 501(C)3 charity.

We need to begin maintaining the property again now that we are in the growing season. We need to begin cutting the yards, trimming and performing normal outside maintenance. We also need to identify items that need to be moved from the council hall to the house that we will, at least temporarily, keep. We would like to establish a "work crew" that would be willing to work 4 hours or so on a Saturday or any other day that is convenient to the membership. We will be asking for volunteers at the next meeting and calling others to see if we can take care of our property until it can be properly disposed.
