The collection of pledge cards to pray for an unborn baby in danger of abortion, on Respect Life Sunday, was truly inspiring. At St. Catherine church we collected approximately 300 pledges and at Our Lady of Grace about 90 cards. St. James church has not yet reported their totals, but they did participate in the program.



Too many Knights and their families worked in the program to name them all but special mention must be made of John and Betty Boch and Rudy and Marianne Cecere who organized and ran the program at Our Lady of Grace and Knight Sean Dolan who did the same at St. James in Lake Placid.

The purpose of the program was two-fold. 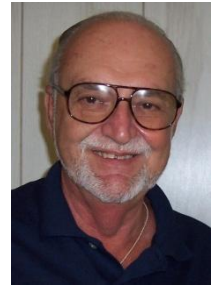

Veterans Day Thought

America's war veterans come in a wide variety of sizes, shapes and ages. Their collective experience spans two world wars and several foreign conflicts. They have followed war mules through Flanders Field, dropped from landing barges onto the beaches of Normandy, faced the icy cold of Porkchop Hill and trudged the rice paddies of the Mekong Delta.

But, regardless of differences in makeup and experience, all veterans share a common bond -- a brotherhood of memory and hard-won wisdom that helps define their character.

A veteran is the first man up as the flag passes by on the 4th of July, and the last one down, for he has been a witness to the blood and tears that make this and all other parades possible.

A veteran is a man of peace, soft spoken, slow to anger, quick to realize that those who talk most about the glory of war are those who know least about its horror. He never jokes about war; he's been there, and still sees on memory's vivid screen the wounded and the dying, the widows and orphans; he knows that it is not the man who is the enemy, but enslavement and false ideologies. Those whom he once faced across the hostile battle lines, he now esteems as his brothers.

A veteran is at once proud and humble; proud of the fact that in 200 years no foreign enemy has set foot on American soil; and humble in the realization that many of his comrades who helped him make this lofty aim a reality, never returned.

More than anything else, a veteran loves freedom. He can spend a whole afternoon doing nothing -- just because it suits him, and just because he has paid the price to do what he wants with his time. He also takes a personal pride in the freedom of others -- in men and women attending the church of their choice; in friends voting how they

choose; and in children sleeping quietly, without fear to interrupt their slumber.

A veteran is every man grown up a little taller -- a person who understands the awesome price of life's intangibles of freedom, justice and democracy. His motto is to live and let live. But, if he had to, if he had to choose between servitude and conflict, the veteran should once again answer a call to duty.

Because, above all - above all else -- a veteran is an American!

Florida State Knight of the Year

Mike Flood - PGK Council 5441

At the Council dinner and Installation of Officers ceremony held at the Quality Inn on October 14th PGK Mike Flood was recognized for his achievement in being named the Florida State Council Knight of the Year for Fraternal Year 2006/2007. For those of you that do not know Mike, or are unaware of all that he does, the following is the press release and the bio that was sent to State in support of Mike's Nomination.

Knight of the Year Press Release

Pope John XXIII Council 5441, of the Knights of Columbus, Sebring, has the honor of having the Knight of the Year from this council. This award is given to the outstanding Knight in the State of Florida as determined by the officers of the State Council. To select the outstanding Knight in the State out of 47,000, Knights is a most difficult task. It is without a doubt one of the most prestigious awards a Knight can earn. Many factors are considered in making this award, such as how does he assist his church, council, community, fellow Knights etc. Mike Flood has shown his abilities to be outstanding in all these aspects.

Mike has been a member of the Knights of Columbus for 40 years, beginning in Silver Spring, Md. He was Bingo co-chairman and earned the Key Man of the Year award in 1973. He remained active in the council and in the Fourth Degree Assembly where he held every officer position and became Commander of the Color Corp and assisted the Master and Marshall and became Commander. He received a plaque for outstanding service, and his council awarded him the Knight of the Year for 1975-76.

Mike is currently the Council Financial Secretary, Webmaster, Program Director, Bingo Chairman, and Fourth Degree Assembly Comptroller and Color Corps Commander. This brother is always on time for any assignment he undertakes. His success in this council is due to his own initiative and hard work. Yet, when any endeavor is publicized and merits attention, he always gives credit to the other officers and members of the council, never to himself.

In addition to this award, the Florida State Deputy has nominated Mike Flood to be the Fraternalist of the Year. This is an honor determined by the National Fraternal Congress of America. The Knights of Columbus is a member of this organization

Candidate's Biography

"He is the concrete foundation on which this council exists." A quote from one of this candidates' fellow officers. Before going into detail here is a quote from the Council's Chaplain ... "It is an honor to submit a recommendation in behalf of this candidate for Knight of the Year. He is gifted with talents which he shares fully. I am impressed with his ability to think outside of the box and get the job done. His willingness to serve to the fullest is an example for all Knights and people he serves. He moves quietly, without pretense in his service of our Lord and His people. His people span all God's children from infancy to elderly. When he is called upon he acts immediately and effectively. For example: at Mass, when volunteers are no-show he can be depended upon to fill in. He quietly fills the need. There is a serenity about him which makes him a welcome oasis for people in need."

Although he is presently an officer in his council and performing in an outstanding manner, he still finds time to give advice and assistance to his fellow officers and brothers. Our nominee can be found at every function that the council sponsors. He will arrange the hall, be it for a dance, a special event such as the Oktoberfest, or a guest such as the Elvis and Patsy Cline impersonators. He has surveyed the hall and developed various seating arrangements to accommodate these various functions. He supervises and assists moving the chairs and tables for these events and then replacing items for the next function. He is computer literate which aids all members in completing reports on time. He is the council's Web Master and is responsible for placing its information on the internet. He attends all regular and special meetings of the council. He is usually first to arrive and last to depart.

This candidate is seen at other functions also. He performed multiple shifts during our "Tootsie Roll" drives, he is a stalwart during our membership drives, and he helps arrange, serve, and clean up for the council's breakfasts. He is a mainstay for activities held away from the council hall. As an example he worked in the kitchen to feed children during the Halloween Spook House sponsored by the local Volunteer Fire Department. He aided the Chairman of the Basketball Free Throw Tournament in registering participants and counting the throws. He participated in the council's Pro Life activities. He distributed literature during the Teen Fair Exhibition held annually. The nominee assisted the participants in the Special Olympics. He is a kind and understanding individual with a unique personality and patience which allows him to work and serve everyone from youngsters to the elderly and infirmed.

During this year he has been instrumental in obtaining members to join the first and second degree exemplification teams. He is present at every practice and offers advice and encouragement to the team members. In this regard when there is a degree being held in another area he is one officer you can depend upon to accompany the candidate. This is especially true for the third degree exemplifications.

As the Bingo chairman he noticed that attendance and revenue were decreasing. He then visited various other Bingo establishments to observe and obtain ideas to increase his profits. As a result of his initiative he revamped the Bingo system, installing new and innovative games, revised the procedure for selling cards, and instituted different methods of awarding players who attended the Bingo sessions. These actions have shown an increase of about 12% in attendance and revenue has increased about 23%. These increases have provided the council with the ability to increase its' donations to the Helping Life and Vocation Funds and local charities.

Our nominee is also an Officer in the Fourth Degree Assembly and Commander of the Color Corp. He conducts training sessions before the activities in which the Corp will participate. This includes any special event requested by any Priest in our area, or a visit by the Bishop, participating in a casket watch and funeral Mass, leading a procession for the observance of Our Lady of Guadalupe, etc. He personally calls the members of the Corp to insure a good turnout for these occasions. Here again he attends all meetings and functions of the fourth degree and he accompanies the candidates to the Fourth Degree Exemplifications.

This outstanding candidate attends mass daily and serves as a Eucharist Minister during these Masses and on Sunday. When not serving as Eucharist Minister on Sunday's he serves as an usher. At least one day a week he travels to a nearby nursing home to distribute Communion. He frequently remains there to talk and visit with some of the lonely residents.

This candidate is also active in Veterans affairs. He helps promote our activities regarding obtaining different items for veterans in hospitals. He assists in packaging and distributing them to the local organizations. He participates in various veterans functions in the area. This nominee is also the Web Master for one of the US Coast Guard Service Organizations.

In his spare time our nominee volunteers at least once a week at a near by library in their Genealogical Room which houses the County's Genealogical Society's and United Daughters of the Confederacy Library books. He is presently organizing and cataloging the collection of books and publications which number in the thousands. Working with the Genealogical Society he is currently indexing and photographing all the tombstones in all the cemeteries in the County. He is the Web Master for this information and responsible for insuring the data is placed on the internet.

This outstanding individual is now transcribing Land Records for his previous Genealogical Society, located in another state, for publication in books that are sold to the public. He has completed four books and is now working on the fifth book. These books date back to the 1700's and are titled "Abstracts of Land Records ... County ... ", volumes iv, v, vi, vii, and now viii.

All the brothers in this council and assembly are proud to have Mike Flood selected as the Knight of the Year for the State of Florida.
