A Note from the President

At the May program meeting, Audubon Chapter of Minneapolis will hold a brief Annual Meeting to elect three Board Members for a three-year term. (The Bylaws stipulate that 3 members are elected for 3 year terms.) This is a very important event for the Chapter's future. Not so much for any shift in the Chapter's policies, but more for the continuity of the Chapter itself. We currently have six vacancies on the Board; three of these vacancies are for terms that end in May and consequently if the current election has a full slate of candidates, the vacancies will fall to three. These three vacancies can be filled through appointments by the Board, so having the critical mass of Board members to conduct the business of the Chapter is at stake.

In addition to the three Board members (bylaws require them to be elected by the general membership), the President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer are elected at the April Board meeting by the Board (required by bylaws) and they assume their offices at the May Board meeting. We expect to have a new President and Vice President. At the time I'm writing this, we do not have candidates for either office. None of the candidates for office need to be on the Board. so anyone is a potential officer. The past President has the option of being on the Board and I expect to serve in that capacity, because the next President probably will not have any experience leading the Chapter. I hope to be there to give appropriate advice.

As the current President, I want to thank Susan Anderson and her Nominating Committee (Jim Egge and Trudi Poquette) for doing the difficult job of recruiting nominees for the Board and Chapter offices. These are unprecedented times with the severe downturn in the economy plus huge demands on our personal time. Finding the time to serve in an all-volunteer organization can be very difficult due to the lack of resources, both financial and technical. It can also be very rewarding because it frees one to be very innovative and unrestricted by a bureaucracy. Susan and her team have done an outstanding job in bring forth their slate of candidates. Of course, none of us could have done it without your help. And if there are still a few vacancies, please help us out—I think you will find it rewarding.





The park's setting, within a traditional neighborhood, offers genuine human-scale opportunities. The planned features and plantings will serve as a guide and inspiration for all visitors. An interpretive trail will explain how people can create intimate personal sanctuaries in their own back yards. Nature has no borders, and the park plan is only the centerpiece of a vision for an entire neighborhood alive with flora and fauna.

The people of Audubon Park do more than dream. We have actively pursued implementation of our vision. Our neighborhood association has applied for, and won, several grants to bring the concept plan to the next level of detail. We are cultivating long-term relationships, as we understand dreams are seldom built overnight.
