

As the Osprey Soars

[This represents a summary of the events at West Coon Rapids Dam in Brooklyn Park, MN for 2007 by Paul Fusco.]

In the past episodes we learned that a new (banded) male had returned to the West Coon Rapids Dam (CRD) nest platform on March 27. He was making himself at home, bringing in sticks, and defending his territory against the many eagles that kept going by. The bands led us to conclude he was 5 years old, originating in a nest about 6 miles to the south-east of the dam.

On April 2nd, he was ousted by the original, injured left wing, male, who had returned for his 8th year! The female who we all know as T17, who was with him for the last 5 years, who usually returns within 1 to 3 days of his arrival, sadly had still not arrived (as of April 15, 2007. The original male continued to add to the nest, but there was no female.

\$\$\$\$\$\$\$\$\$\$\$\$\$\$\$\$\$ On Thursday, April 12th, the male took to the air real quickly, (but, he had no fish). It was a windy day, but there she was. He did his courtship flight as the winds blew him further southward down the Mississippi River. He returned approximately 30 minutes later with a new female. Hung out awhile. Later they took a flight, and he brought back more nesting material. Later that day I saw him and another osprey, probably her, flying to the northeast. Is this part of a tour? Why had he not given her an offering, (fish)? On Friday, reports came in of seeing 3 osprey in the area, but only the original injured left wing male was on the platform. Again on Saturday, only he was seen at the nest, but two other osprey were seen flying in the vicinity, but this time he started carrying a fish around with him wherever he flew! Would this help? Or was it all over for the original male?

On Sunday, April 15, our original male had his nesting spot, he started bringing back the final touches, the softer grasses, for the cup. But, he was still missing something... - A Female! He went to get a fish. He started to hang around with the fish he had caught. Then he even resorted to flying around carrying the fish wherever he flew. It did not seem to be looking good I thought. Most of the osprey probably had already flown through. I was not too hopeful that he was going to get a mate for his 8th season in a row, which is rare, I believe. THEN, while he was flying high in the air, he started a courtship flight, but then, the next thing I knew, two osprey landed on the platform.... Oh No!

It was the young male who had come back first on March 27th, but this time he had a female with him. She looked like she was impressed with the nest... - that he made?!!! Meanwhile up in the air, the original male was doing this beautiful courtship flight, just the way he was supposed to be doing it. Falling and rising, while chirping, all the time displaying the fish. (Although earlier some who had seen the fish he was carrying around said it looked a little stiff and dried out!) What to do?! What to do?! Would he lose his nest site? Instead of circling high above, he was coming in closer and closer, while still rising and falling. When he was within approximately 80 feet of the nest he did it. Was it a plan he had all along, or was it one he came up with in that instant? He started heading straight for the platform, right where the male was standing on the platform...

The younger male, seeing this osprey coming at him decided to get out of there fast and worry about what to do once Ó he escapes! In an instant, the original male takes the place of the first male, then while standing on the nest that he mostly made... with a finesse rarely seen among osprey,... he simply handed the fish to the female.... And she ac-cepted!

Was Thursday's interlude all part of the plan? Is courtship all instinct, or is it an experiential process too? Will this be the start of a new nesting at CRD? Is she old enough? How will these two get along differently then his past "wife" for the last 5 years?...
