### A Note from the Past-President

During the interim period since the last *Kingfisher*, some good news has happened. Jim Egge at our May Board meeting graciously agreed to be the President of the Audubon Chapter of Minneapolis for the coming year. As the Past-President, I know Jim will do a good job based on the tremendous support he gave me. I know all of you wish him well. To insure a productive term, he will need your help.

This past year Audubon Chapter of Minneapolis continued and expanded some of its programs. Most notably in our mentoring program, led by Jim Egge, we were able to continue our program with the Harvest School, an African American charter school. We sponsored an outing for the school on a paddle boat on the St. Croix River to view eagles.

With the success with the Harvest School, we were able to recruit more volunteers to expand the mentoring program to another school, Assumption School, a predominately Hispanic American school.

Last fall Kit Healy volunteered to chair the Conservation Committee. Under her leadership we were able to cosponsor an event with the major sponsor, Audubon Neighborhood Association, and the Northeast Middle School. The event, the "Spring WindDing", celebrated nature in the city. Look for this to be an annual event. The chapter hopes to be able to help the Audubon Neighborhood Association realize their visiton of transforming Audubon Park in northeat Minneapolis into a much more bird and nature friendly city park as well as providing some needed spring flood mitigation.

Kit also set up Audubon Chapter of Minneapolis to help the Friends of Eloise Butler do a garlic mustard pull at the Eloise Butler Wildflower Garden and Bird sanctuary. She also arranged to get some help for the Wild Ones with their weeding of the gardens at Nokomis Lake.

All of these programs were helped by having adequate funds to help with these programs. The other huge ingredient is the increase in the number of volunteers Jim and Kit have been able to recruit. Volunteers are the key to successful programs, please continue to help us!



### 6<sup>th</sup> Annual Wood Duck Jump

The Wood Duck Jump was again a resounding success. About 25 viewers lined the windows at Jerry Bahls' house on May 9th and were again treated to a spectacular event. The hatch occurred the day before. There were about 21 eggs in the box. Viewing the nest with a camera in the box reveiled there were some hooded mergansers in the box with the wood ducks. Jerry informed the audience that there were 3 hooded merganser eggs in the box and it appeared that all had hatched. At about 8:18, the hen flew down to the ground and called the young out. Ten wood ducks and three mergansers jumped out of the box, led by a merganser. An inspection of the box showed there were still nine unhatched eggs. All were not viable.

# North American Duck Populations Soar - Minnesota Populations Dive

Earlier this month the U.S. Fish and Wildlife released its 2009 Waterfowl Breeding Population and Habitat Survey at <a href="http://audubonaction.org/ct/PdeC">http://audubonaction.org/ct/PdeC</a> b41vRcj/ The total estimated number of ducks was 42 million, which is 13 percent greater than last year's estimate and 25 percent greater than the 1955-2008 average.

Unfortunately, the same time period shows a continued decline for Minnesota's waterfowl. The 2009 State Waterfowl Breeding Population Survey at <a href="http://audubonaction.org/ct/97eC\_b41vRce/">http://audubonaction.org/ct/97eC\_b41vRce/</a> saw duck numbers drop 31% from 2008 and 32% below the ten-year average. Whether this difference is attributable to dry weather patterns, poor quality wetlands or some combination of factors remains to be seen.

# The American Clean Energy and Security Act (ACES)

Several weeks ago the House of Representatives passed a landmark bill that will transform our energy economy and cut greenhouse gas emissions by 80%. As bird and wildlife advocates know, the number one threat to North American species is climate change, and for that reason Audubon has played a major role in seeking ACES's passage. But there are plenty of other reasons to celebrate this bill as well. It calls for energy efficiencies both within the energy generation sector and within our homes that will save consumers money; it generates funding through a market-based cap and trade approach that rewards businesses for going green, and it will create millions of "green-collar" jobs. The Senate will take up the bill this fall where Audubon Minnesota expects support from Senators Klobuchar and Franken. Here's a guick list of the Minnesota House delegation and how they voted.
