

Anne Frank Project

1. Select a topic that relates to WW2. This can be a person, place, event, or thing involved in the war.
2. You may choose the method of presentation:

A. Poster/Artwork

Topic/title: should be prominent, concise, visible

Labels: descriptive, concise

Objects: realistic, colorful, proportionate, well-secured

Explanatory Text: 3 paragraph minimum

Works Cited: appropriate form (on back of poster)

NEATNESS COUNTS!

B. Essay/Report

Introduction: attention-getting, thesis clearly stated

Body: Support with examples, reasons, details

Conclusion: Thesis restated, good concluding sentence

Works Cited: appropriate form (on separate sheet)

Ink or typed

Minimum: 1 ½ pages

C. Oral Report

Introduction: attention-getting

Middle: content is of substance

Summary: main points reiterated

Body Language: appropriate gestures

Use of visual aids: optional

Length: minimum of 3 minutes (max. 6 minutes)

D. Video/Audio Tape of Grandparent or relative who participated in the war effort.

This will not be viewed by the class. Minimum of 20 questions submitted to me prior to interview. It is not enough to have been a child who remembers a war going on.

E. PowerPoint Presentation

(If you have PowerPoint at home, then save to a disk and bring it in.

If you do not have PowerPoint at home, then expect to work in the computer lab after school. Save to the network drive under your name. Please note: NO class time is available to do this)

Minimum: 5 slides (no maximum)

Background: appropriate for the subject

Music/sounds: appropriate for the subject/era

Animation/Movies: appropriate for the subject

(don't add goofy, funny animation if topic is serious)

Pictures: labeled

Cite Sources on last slide (MLA format)
