- I hope to obtain a job where I can constantly be learning and discovering new things. By working as a performer, I can continue to learn about music and beats and the human body and the way it can move.

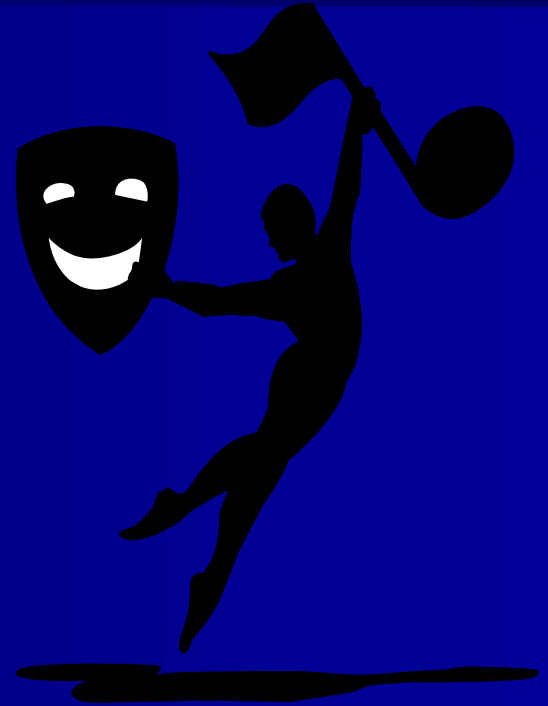
