

# SPLIT THE TIMELINE?

Somewhat like what the famous libertine-taught Messiah Yeshua al Nazarine the Bible records having said was true about those following the path which he himself foreran, my yoke is pleasant; and my burden is airily-weighted. This I know, from personal experience (carefully worded). While Yeshua seems to have had drowsy moments (“I am [a block to] the Way, [not] the [vast] Truth, and the Life [? – materially but not so much so spiritually at times]”), he did leave “the big blip” on World History for planet earth as “The Man Who Split Time” (dividing BC and AD). Also, while Yeshua shows very bad stewardship for God’s perfect creation in the story where he wilts a whole fig tree because he wants one simple fig (honestly and specifically), the wise Qohelet (writer of Ecclesiastes) tugs at the heart remembering there is a time for every purpose under heaven. People *have* poverty solving problems (in more ways than one), and the interests of the masses can be felt in the basic question, “Are you tired of poverty, people?” Yet it *is* “Harvest Time”, as the page has turned from Revelation 9 to Revelation 10 – Hillary Rodham Clinton having made known (in spirit) her commitment to become the President. The certainty that Revelation (the true book of the Bible) would prove God’s sovereignty at the end of this world age has been lost (judgment and knowledge too) exchanged for myopic daydreaming that says “Visualize World Peace”. Likewise, sciences have devolved into quantum hypothesis. I suggest “Visualize humble science’s peaceful stardust.” The words “Judgment Day” will bring back some reckoning for Muslims. “Daybreak” means about the same thing to my Rainbow Family; as does “Armageddon” to Christianity.

Comprising many worlds (one per person) history connects along *exactly one* timeline in the *one* universe of the *one* God Almighty – sovereign perpetual Maker and *one-up*. However, Stephen Hawking – the worldly-respected smart man – in his capacity as a “physicist” presented some popular ideas about how the material world works, in a book and later a movie titled “A Brief History of Time.” Perhaps the most memorable aspect of Professor Hawking’s presentation was him discussing the timeline in terms of “theoretical physics” (a term with *no* meaningful definition). Hawking’s diagram depicts (in an array of pointed arcs) the timeline (of things to come), which it *does* do, according to quantum theory and hypothesis<sup>1</sup>. However, critical parts of the Scientific Method are utterly absent from such a worldview. It involves *no* experimentation<sup>2</sup>, *no* observation<sup>3</sup>, and what *looks* like conclusion<sup>4</sup>, is essentially formulating a lot of hypotheses that the sound same. Appreciating that I am sometimes wrong myself, combined with my knowledge that Professor Hawking (besides being “book-smart”) is also humble, empathic, and moreover *mystical*, leads me to believe that (like fellow mystic Albert Einstein before him)

Professor Hawking winds up emphatic that reality is *completely* designed (not random whatsoever). For one thing, God is transcendent to both space and time (the material dimensions); for another, people have seen ahead in time totally accurately, even specific events a few days from now. So, as Einstein said, “God does *not* play dice.”

Unfortunately, the frail mortal mentality tends to believe whatever is most interesting, instead of what is true. When one considers the ideas commonly expressed this century, it is painfully obvious that modern “science” is a collection of some of the **worst** ideas ever thought – including “subconscious mind” in psychology, “capitalism” in politics (which stems from “materialism” – superficial explanations of regularity and periodicity in the materiality). Furthermore, worldly religiosity ignores causes and effects inherent in the choices that adherents make about what they want to do – giving what they do not want to get back. Nonetheless, people have been noticing (as though for the first time) that they observe things happening – including when other people appear to say and do things that they know in their *right* minds could not be occurring, because timelines of individual worlds come back into alignment.

Frighteningly, people are beset with avoidance towards reality and wishing the big picture in time will conform to their personal views, rather than the other way around. Iran’s legacy of academics, established in the universities of Tehran, combined with value given to explanations, tempts some well-meaning Muslims to hold that the one timeline of history will connect with the timeline splitting at some future point, perhaps the “seven thunders” of Revelation 10: 4. Many Christians who believe in “Rapture” hold that the timeline has *already* split at mysterious points they cannot quite pin down and *will* at more, for the “saved.” The fact that personal material worlds go into and out of phase with one another lends credence to this heresy. Vain (wishful) thinking about the expression “God can do anything” threatens the spiritual well-being of those who want others with conflicting spiritual paths to drop dead like flies in an atomic war, while they trust (assume and expect) to see God restore peace to the material world. Self-righteous people who envision the “seven thunders” as the wrath of their God seem willing to encourage atomic holocaust, believing that empirical knowledge indicates the power of God about to be revealed (in the manifestation of the timeline splitting) resulting in two (or more) different futures. The thunders indicate a *cataclysmic* change beyond human conception, but *not* the timeline splitting. Rather, to transcendently split the timeline helps one decide what boomerangs to throw.
