

# War Resisters Support Campaign

Since 2004, over 50 U.S. war resisters who refuse to fight in Iraq have come to Canada in search of sanctuary. On June 3rd, the House of Commons adopted a motion stating that the Government of Canada should create a program that would allow these war resisters to apply for permanent resident status, and that any



deportation proceedings against them should cease immediately.

Yet the Conservative government has so far refused to implement the War Resisters' motion. One resister, former National Guard sergeant Corey Glass, faces deportation on July 10 unless the motion is implemented.

The War Resisters Support Campaign is calling on the Canadian government to respect the will of Parliament and a majority of Canadians, by implementing the motion and allowing U.S. war resisters to stay in Canada. This country has a history of welcoming conscientious objectors. During the Vietnam War between 50,000 and 80,000 Americans who refused to participate in that war were welcomed to Canada. As well, Canada did not join in the Iraq war in 2003. Canadians are proud of both these facts, and are today opening their hearts and their homes to a new generation of people of conscience.

If they are returned to the U.S. they face certain punishment for refusing to participate in an illegal war. Your voice can make a difference.
