It is situated right next to Washington Parish, and Bogalusa. I have done some pretty extensive research on the Bush line there. My gggrandfather was Alexander Bush, for whom the town of Bush,La. was named due to the fact that he was the first postmaster there in April, 1904. He was born in May, 1846 in Marion County, Ga and was the son of Nathan or Nathaniel Bush and Caroline Elizabeth Butler. He and two of his brothers fought in the Civil war. I have his pension file. Anyway, I figure that we are probalbly related through Levi Bush, Alexander's oldest brother. I also have his pension file and he resided in Washington Parish, at Isabel, I think. Thanks for the quick response.....

I had seen that James and Sarah Brooks Cooper were buried at the Old Henley cemetery.....and that it was west of McNeill. However, I didn't know if it was in (Henleyfield) near one of the church's or somewhere else on someone's private property? If you could provide specifics....I'd appreciate it. I know my way around Pearl River County quite well. I would like to visit and photograph their gravesite the next time I'm down that way.

I have the same info that you do on Sarah. I only have in my database that her father's name was Joseph or Jack, no name for her mother or their birth/death dates.....only that they came over from Washington Parish, LA. I have traced back as far as James' Grandparents (Cornelius Cooper & Jane Wood). If you have info beyond that.....I'm all ears. :)

FYI.....Henry Franklin Davis and Anna Cooper Davis are buried at Union Baptist Church Cemetery (Caesar Community), Pearl River/Hancock County line. Their graves sit fairly close to the main road surrounded by other Coopers. A Cornelius Cooper is also buried there, however, he was Anna's brother, and was a veteran of the Civil War.

I have a copy of some handwritten notes authored by Lily Davis Fleming (my Great Aunt). Aunt Lily passed away in the 1980's and was 93 years old I believe. Aunt Lily was rather thorough in her genealogy.....so I have confidence in what she wrote. Lily documented in her notes that Anna Cooper Davis was part Indian. Have you ever heard of Indian blood in the Cooper or Brooks families?

If you provide me with a mailing address.....I'll be glad to mail you a copy of Henry Franklin and Anna Cooper Davis. I may have some extra copies around my place. The photocopy machine at Walmart have proven to be the best thing since sliced bread! :)
