

Woodmont Civic Association minutes for January 22, 2004

Item 1. Thanks to neighbors.

Naiem opened with a word of thanks to those who helped with the preparation and delivery of the January 2004 Newsletter.

Item 2. Treasurer's Report.

The treasurer's report was presented and adopted.

It was agreed to put a reminder in the next newsletter about dues payment.

Item 3. Woodmont Center parking lot.

The plan for parking lot changes to Woodmont center have been reviewed and approved.

The plan keeps the parking spaces straight and both ends of the lot open for entrance.

The design may lose some green space. Now they are waiting for the approval to go ahead with the plan.

Item 4. Fillmore Street traffic.

Three projects are under consideration: a sidewalk on Fillmore, a sidewalk on Edgewood, and expanding the area for the school bus stop at Fillmore and 24th St. There are no immediate plans by the county to proceed with any of these at this time.

Penelope Wrenn is taking the point for the bus stop.

Discussion revealed the county looks for a "captain" in the community, usually in the direct vicinity of the project to take the lead in championing a plan.

There is also money available through the conservation plan for projects like these.

Item 5. Delegates to the Arlington Civic Federation

Nominations were taken for 4 delegates to the Arlington Civic Federation.

The nominees for delegate are Sharon Rodgers, Steve Baur, Larry Roberts, Roy Cook, David Thacker, and Art Lindsley.

The nominees for 4 alternates are Norm Mosher, Carla von Bernewitz, Rose Kehoe, Lee Rooker, and Bill Santry.

Elections will take place at the April 2004 meeting.

Item 6. Property assessments in Woodmont

There was discussion concerning the high rise in recent rates.

Item 7. Other Business

1. Fort C.F. Smith Park. Scott Deibler submitted drafts that are before the Dept. of Parks, Rec. and Community Resources for the placement of signs in the park.

He also invited the association to have one or our quarterly meetings at the park.

2. There was a question about the "group homes" on 24th St. The association has decided not to take an official stance on them. There are individual residents discussing the zoning of the homes with the county.

3. There was a question about the maintenance of Woodmont Center as to who is responsible. Concerns should be addressed the Arlington School Board.

4. Steve Baur gave an update on the airport noise. A plan has been put forth. There will be meetings in 4 communities for effected citizens to comment.
