

ORGANIZATION OF CONFERENCES, WORKSHOPS AND PANEL DISCUSSIONS

1. “Justice in Punishment”, a three-day conference under the auspices of Israel Academy of Sciences and Humanities, the Hebrew University, and the Mishkenot Sha’ananim Conference Center, held in March 1988 in Jerusalem. It brought together philosophers, legal scholars, and judges from Israel, Europe, US, and Australia. The proceedings were published in a special issue of *Israel Law Review* (vol. 25, 1991, no. 3-4).
2. “Terrorism and Justice”, public workshop organized in the aftermath of the terrorist attacks in the United States on 11 September 2001, and held at the University of Melbourne on 2 November 2001. It produced the book *Terrorism and Justice: Moral Argument in a Threatened World*, edited by Tony Coady and Michael O’Keefe (Melbourne: Melbourne University Press, 2002 .)
3. “Identity, Self-determination and Secession”, workshop organized in collaboration with the Department of Politics and the Division of Law, Macquarie University, and held at the University of Melbourne on 7-8 August 2003. Participants included philosophers and legal scholars from Australia and overseas. It generated the book *Identity, Self-Determination and Secession* I co-edited with Aleksandar Pavković (Aldershot: Ashgate Publishing, 2006).
4. “Civilian Immunity in War”, conference organized in collaboration with the Center for Interdisciplinary Research (ZiF), University of Bielefeld, Germany, and held at the University of Melbourne on 3-5 December 2003. It brought together philosophers, legal scholars, and international politics experts from Australia and overseas, and generated the book I edited *Civilian Immunity in War* (Oxford: Oxford University Press, 2007).
5. “The Bombing of Germany’s Cities and Towns in World War II”, public panel discussion organized in collaboration with Goethe-Institut, Melbourne, and held at the University of Melbourne on 5 December 2003.
6. “Politics and Morality”, workshop organized as part of research on the core project “The Morality of ‘Dirty Hands’ as an Issue in Political Leadership” and held at the University of Melbourne on 24-25 August 2004. Participants included philosophers from several Australian universities. The workshop

generated the book I edited *Politics and Morality* (Basingstoke, UK and New York: Palgrave Macmillan, 2006).

7. “Fighting ‘Dirty’: Torture in the Defense of Freedom?”, public panel discussion held at the University of Melbourne on 25 August 2004.
8. “Terrorism and Counterterrorism: Philosophical Perspectives, I”, workshop held at the University of Melbourne on 22-23 August 2005. It brought together philosophers from Australia and overseas, and generated a special issue on terrorism and counterterrorism of *Iyyun: The Jerusalem Philosophical Quarterly*, guest-edited by myself (vol. 55, 2006, no. 1)
9. “Terrorism and Counterterrorism: Philosophical Perspectives”, public panel discussion held at the University of Melbourne on 24 August 2005
10. “Patriotism: Philosophical Perspectives”, workshop held at the University of Melbourne on 21-22 August 2006. It brought together philosophers and political theorists from Australia and overseas, and generated the book *Patriotism: Philosophical and Political Perspectives I* co-edited with Aleksandar Pavković (Aldershot: Ashgate Publishing, 2008)
11. “Terrorism and Counterterrorism: Philosophical Perspectives, II”, workshop held at the University of Melbourne on 27-28 August 2007. Participants included philosophers and political theorists from Australia and overseas.
