3rd Grade reads 4,000 minutes,  
4th Grade reads 5,000 minutes  
5th Grade reads 6,000 minutes.

## New Parking Restrictions

Recently, the City added parking and pick-up restrictions in front of our school. While updating signage and curb markings on Wylie Road, Norman City staff took notice of traffic problems on Wylie Road during after school hours.

We were informed by the City that they had observed the area during dismissal time and noticed significant parking activity along the west side of Wylie Road, south of Camden Way. This parking activity was considered detrimental to the safe flow of traffic on Wylie Road. The specific problem being addressed with the parking restriction deals with vehicles driving left of center across the double yellow line. Allowing parking along the west side forces southbound drivers to cross the double yellow line into the path of northbound vehicles. This was explained as not only being unsafe; it also makes every southbound driver subject to a traffic citation.

We do not want any of our Jackson parents or friends to receive parking or other citations, so we ask that you do not park or load in this area of Wylie Road. We are sorry for any inconvenience that this creates, but it was done by the City with concerns for child and traffic safety in mind. Thank you for your cooperation.



## Tardies and Absences

As a reminder, school begins at 8:00am and ends at 2:45pm. Any student that is late to school needs to report to the office to get a tardy slip before going to class. If your child is not going to attend school that day, please call the office and let them know of their absence. An unexcused absence will go on their record if the office is not notified.

## Weather the News

Parent's we are collecting **weather pictures** drawn by your children to put into the Norman Transcript. If you are not familiar with this, they are in the weather section of the paper. Students from Norman can submit drawings and five are chosen on a daily basis to be published in the paper. Typically they choose drawings that represent the weather for that day's forecast. Drawings need to be brightly colored (i.e. markers, crayons, colored pencils, or water colored paints) on white paper; landscape preferably. Turn them into your child's teacher. Once a month they will be collected and taken to the Norman Transcript.
