

THE FEDERAL COURT SUIT FOR WORKERS COMP REFORM

Would challenge the Florida-Workers Compensation act as being violative of due process right.

Rationale: The system that delivers benefits is broken. The promise of fast delivery of benefits or a fast resolution by an administrative judge now takes longer that it would take to get a similar claim before a circuit court judge for major issues and before a small claims court for minor issues.

Would propose to the federal courts that they take over responsibility for ensuring due process of law.

Rationale: This parallels how federal courts took over control of schools to end segregation and state prisons to end overcrowding.

Would attack the substantive benefits as being an unconstitutional replacement for tort remedy.

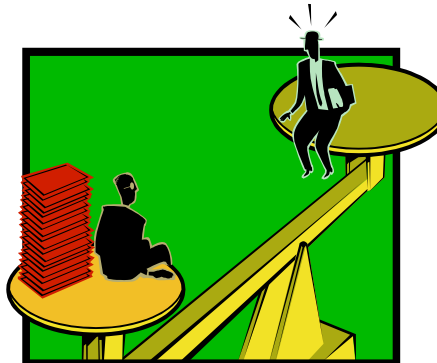
