### **POPE JOHN PAUL II DIES at 84**

Saturday, 2 April 2005: "The Holy Father died this evening at 9:37 p.m. (2:37 p.m. EST) in his private apartment. All the procedures outlined in the Apostolic Constitution Universi Dominici Gregis' that was written by John Paul II on Feb. 22, 1996, have been put in motion."

"At 8 PM the celebration of Holy Mass for Divine Mercy Sunday began in the Holy Father's room. During the course of the Holy Mass, the Viaticum was administered to the Holy Father and, once again, the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick."

The pope died after suffering heart and kidney failure following two hospitalizations in as many months. Just a few hours earlier, the **Vatican** had said he was in "very serious" condition but responded to members of the papal household.

**Cardinal Angelo Sodano**, the **Vatican** number 2 official, immediately led a tearful crowd of 70,000

John Paul II was last seen in public on *Wednesday* when, looking gaunt and unable to speak, he briefly appeared at his window.

His health sharply deteriorated the next day after he suffered a urinary tract infection. The **Vatican** said the pope was suffering from septic shock, which involves both bacteria in the blood and a consequent over-relaxing of the blood vessels.

Medical experts put the chances of survival for an elderly person in **John Paul's** condition at no more than **20** percent, and only when hospitalized in intensive care. As the very end drew near, the pontiff refused to be taken to a hospital and instead spent his final hours in the papal apartment in **Rome**.

# ASCENSION, PENTECOST and TRINITY SUNDAY – MAY 2005

# Three feasts of great importance in the life of the Church.

The Ascension is usually described as marking the completion of Jesus' ministry on earth as he returned to Heaven. But it is far more than that. It marks the when Jesus. Son exact moment of God. commissioned his disciples to begin the gigantic task of converting the whole world. As recorded in Saint Mark's Gospel, Jesus said: "Go into all the world and proclaim the good news to the whole creation. The one who believes and is baptized will be saved; but the one who does not believe will be condemned."

Saint Luke tells us that Pentecost occurred a short time after the Ascension, and marked the fulfillment of Jesus' promise, at his Ascension, to send the Holy Spirit on the disciples.

[Publisher's Note: Actually the nine days from Ascension Thursday (40 days after Easter) to Pentecost (50 days after Easter) was the first novena. It was prayed by the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Apostles, and disciples in the Upper Room waiting for the Holy Spirit to come as promised.]

The gift of the Holy Spirit electrified these fearful followers - who only weeks before had run away when Jesus was arrested, and were still hiding for fear

of those who had been responsible for their Lord's death - and transformed them into men and women willing to lay down their lives for their faith, as many of them did.

The feast of Holy Trinity, though logically linked with the other two, was established much later. Although its existence was clearly stated in the New Testament, and early recognized as a doctrine of the faith, it was only when the Arian heresy - which denied Jesus was God - was spreading in the fourth century, that the church Fathers prepared an Office with canticles, responses, a preface, and hymns, to be recited at Mass. From these, the feast we now celebrate as Trinity Sunday gradually evolved.

Together, these great feasts mark the promise which Jesus gave to his disciples, and its fulfillment in the Church on earth. As recorded by Saint Matthew, the very last words Jesus said to his Apostles before going up to Heaven, were: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of time."

The Vatican Web Site has on *Saturday, 2 April 2005* already been updated to show the Vacancy of the **Holy** or **Apostolic See (Papal Interregnum)**. The period between the death or resignation of a Pope and the election of his successor, when the **See of Peter** is vacant, is called the **Interregnum**. This Latin term means between the reign (of one Pope and another). It is a period governed by papal law, which admits of no changes to Church governance, or to the spiritual or material patrimony of St. Peter, save the election of his successor

# KNOW THAT I AM WITH YOU ALWAYS

#### ASCENSION THURSDAY, 5/5/2005

Acts 1: 1-11, Ephesians 1: 17-23, Matthew 28: 16-20



What does the Church celebrate on Ascension Day? We are being invited to have faith in an important aspect of the Risen Lord's Paschal Mystery. The Saviour was present to his chosen disciples after the Resurrection, laying

the foundations of the Church's faith. That extraordinary presence was of limited duration, and soon gave way to another manner of presence – as the Saviour guides the Church through the blessings of his own Spirit. Today's liturgy gathers three passages of the New Testament that give expression to the faith of the first Christians in this phase of the Paschal Mystery.

The concluding passage of Matthew's gospel is deceptive in its brevity. It is in fact a masterly summary of the teaching of the whole gospel - as the Risen Lord himself sends his disciples on mission with words of encouragement. He gives expression to the fullness of the divine authority that 'has been given to him' by the Father. He sends them on a mission that is universal: 'Make disciples of all the nations'. They are to teach them to 'observe all his commandments' - the New Law of his Sermon the Mount. They are to carry out their mission by preaching the Good News and by baptizing 'in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit'. And, as he echoes the words of the covenant that was the foundation of Israel's faith – 'I am with you' – he assures them that he is truly Emmanuel.

Luke's account, in the opening passage of the Acts of the Apostles, is the work of a skilful teacher concerned to help his readers understand the mystery of the Lord's new manner of presence. Luke alone in the New Testament speaks of the Lord's dealing with his disciples as lasting 'forty days' – a round number frequently used in the scriptures; though it may be linked with the fifty days between Passover and the Pentecost celebration of old Israel. It is made clear that this period is a time of preparation and **The PILGRIM**, Volume 16, Number 4 – April 2005 anticipation – the disciples can look forward to 'what the Father promised'; not many days hence they 'will be baptized with the Holy Spirit'. Luke's account is centered in Jerusalem. (In fact he has omitted any reference the disciples' withdrawal to in discouragement to Galilee.) Though the divine plan that shaped the Old Testament is being fulfilled, a new era is beginning – shaped, not by false messianic hopes of 'the restoration of the kingdom of Israel'. but by the Father's mysterious authority. It is the era of the Church's earthly pilgrimage. The Acts of the Apostles (like a second volume of Luke's gospel) will present the Church as carrying out its mission through the blessings of the Holy Spirit - 'You will be my witnesses to the ends of the earth'. Luke, the careful teacher, sketches a graphic word picture for his readers: the Lord is 'lifted up', and a 'cloud' (Old Testament sign of God's presence) takes him from their sight. Perhaps the mystery of the Savior's heavenly exaltation (see the early hymn of Philippians 2) has given rise to this kind of description in some circles. But Luke subtly modifies the crudeness of such a presentation. The two heavenly messengers make it clear that what is taking place is not an event of this world. Their advice to the disciples is not to stare into the sky, but to give themselves to the Church's earthly mission until the Lord returns.

The reading from Ephesians is an eloquent testimony to the way in which the Church understood this mission, carried out under the authority of the Risen Christ, who has made himself 'the head of the Church which is his body'.

# IN THE ONE SPIRIT WE WERE ALL BAPTISED

PENTECOST SUNDAY, 5/15/2005 Acts 2: 1-11; 1 Corinthians 12: 3-7, 12-13; John 20: 19-23



The liturgies of the Easter season bring home to us the unity of the Savior's Paschal Mystery. How frequently our New Testament readings have made mention of the Holy Spirit, looking forward to the coming of the Spirit as a final culmination.

Luke's account of the coming of the Spirit upon the apostles associates this coming with the 'day of

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Pentecost', a Jewish festival celebrated fifty days after Passover – a harvest festival that later became a celebration of the giving of the Law to Moses. The basis of Luke's vivid dramatization may well have been the fact that, on this popular festival, the apostles - still uncertain how to undertake the enormous mission they had been given – may have joined the pilgrims crowding Jerusalem, and for the first time found the courage to proclaim their faith in the Risen Lord. In the joy and success they found on this occasion, they recognized the 'baptism with the Holy Spirit' they had been promised. In the Acts of the Apostles Luke tells the story of the Church of the beginnings using a device in use at the time by writers of popular history – of taking important events in the history they are presenting, and dramatizing them in a way that brings out their far-reaching significance. Thus, in Luke's account, what begins as an event on one room of the city – 'a noise that filled the whole house', 'something that seemed like tongues of fire', the apostles 'speaking in foreign languages' suddenly involves the whole crowded city, as faith in the Risen Lord is preached 'to devout men from every nation under heaven'. As Luke's dramatization continues in the passage that follows our reading, Peter's preaching leads to the baptizing of three thousand people -a number designed to bring out the momentous nature of what is taking place, and the universal mission that will flow from it, rather than giving a precise historical detail. As we know, Luke is writing a sequel to his gospel: the story of the Holy Spirit's life-giving guidance of the early Church. In

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later ages, our instinct has been sound, in celebrating Pentecost as the birthday of the Church.

The other readings point to other dimensions of the workings of the Spirit in our lives. Our life in Christ is filled, from beginning to end, with God's generous gifts. And all of these gifts come from 'one and the same Spirit' – from our faith in Christ as our 'Lord and God' to the Individual contributions we are able to make to the life of our community.

In John's gospel, as we are reminded in today's reading, the Spirit is given on the evening of Resurrection Day itself. 'Peace be with you', Jesus repeats, and 'breathing on them' he says, 'Receive the Holy Spirit'. John's gospel reminds us that if the Spirit is responsible for the great things in which God is present in the life of the Church, the Spirit is also evident in our personal lives, in the true 'peace' and contentment that comes to those who give themselves generously to the Lord. In John's gospel, Jesus, at the Last Supper, associates the gift of the Spirit he promises with a peace that is his special gift: 'My own peace I give you, a peace the world cannot give this is my gift to you' (Jn 14:27),

How varied are the gifts of the Spirit. In this era of change and renewal, let us become more aware of our dependence upon them.

### GOD SENT HIS SON, THAT THROUGH HIM THE WORLD MIGHT BE SAVED

TRINITY SUNDAY, 5/22/2005 Exodus 34: 4-7, 8-9; 2 Corinthians 13: 11-13; John 3: 16-18



In each of us there are personal depths, mysterious depths that others can know only if we choose to make them our friends. We should not be surprised, that in the boundless life of our God there is a mystery of overflowing life that is far beyond

our complete comprehension. Yet – and here we are touching the very heart of our Christian faith, and its greatness – this mystery of personal life reaches out to us, and invites us into its friendship.

We humans share the mystery of our personhood with others by expressing who were are in our interaction with them. And so it has been with the divine selfdisclosure, or revelation. From the first, the God of our faith tradition has reached out to humanity with an astounding generosity that was very different from what was expected from the remote and fearful gods the peoples of the world had set up for themselves: Yahweh was the champion of the oppressed, a God whose self-giving was expressed in a covenant relationship. Our reading from the Book of Exodus gives a moving expression to the deep lessons this covenant relationship brought to those who were open to a meeting with the God who had made them his own: 'a God of tenderness, and compassion, slow to anger, and rich in kindness and faithfulness'.

Great as these lessons were, however, they were only a prelude and foreshadowing of the interaction that would give an ultimate expression to the personal life of God -when 'the Word became flesh, and we saw the glory that he has as the only Son of the Father, full of grace and truth' (Jn 1:14). Today's reading from John's gospel reiterates this truth: 'God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son'. Now the

mystery of God's generous love has its full expression. The love of the Son, as he gives himself 'that the world might be saved', is the expression of the love of the Father himself – expressed in this text in an echo of Abraham's anguish, when he was told, 'Take your son, your only son; you are to offer him as a burnt offering' (Gen 22:2). In this expression of divine compassion, the astounding superabundance of life in a Trinity of Persons finds expression; and gives us a sharing in its friendship, as 'the love of God is poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit which has been given to us' (Rom 5:5). (Today's gospel reading is noteworthy for its reference to 'the world'. Usually, in John's gospel, 'the world' refers to humanity's project when it is alienated from God [cf. Jn 15:19]; and God's love towards the disciples of Jesus is what is stressed. In this text, however, 'the world' too is the object of God's saving love.)

Paul's benediction at the end of his second letter to the Corinthians is a remarkable summary of this sharing in the Trinitarian life. It is through 'Grace' – the absolutely unmerited generosity that has shaped all God's dealings from the beginning - that now finds an ultimate expression in all that 'the Lord Jesus Christ' has done. And what the Saviour has done is the revelation of 'the love of God (the Father)', a love that gathers us into a 'fellowship' that is united in the gifts of 'the Holy Spirit'. These words of the text and its reference to 'a holy kiss' probably echo the liturgies of Paul's communities. It is especially in a faith-filled liturgy that believers experience their sharing in the fellowship of the Trinitarian life.

# MEL GIBSON'S SECRET MEETING with FATIMA VISIONARY

Actor Mel Gibson held a secret meeting with one of the famous visionaries of Fatima, Sister Lucia of Portugal.

Sister Lucia, now 98 years of age, is a cloistered nun who as a child saw and spoke with the Virgin Mary in Fatima, Portugal, in 1917.

Her visions and those of her two childhood friends, both since passed away, were both prophetic and apocalyptic. The Catholic Church accepted the visions as authentic.

Fatima-based Unity Publishing's Richard Salbato recently revealed in an online report that after the nuns asked for a private showing of Gibson's film "The Passion of the Christ," Gibson not only OK'd the viewing, but the actor flew to Coimbra, Portugal, to personally introduce the film to Lucia and her Sisters.

During Lent of 2004, the nuns at the convent in Coimbra, where Sister Lucia lives, wanted to see the film as a devotional aid in preparation for Good Friday and Easter.

Unable to leave the convent or meet face-to-face with outsiders because of the strict Carmelite rules governing cloistered sisters – and lacking the modern convenience of a DVD player – they sought to contact Mel Gibson's Icon Productions for help. According to Unity, word was sent out from the Convent to make contact with Icon or Gibson to get a DVD for the convent.

Thanks to a girl in Porto, Portugal, Luciana Regadas, who knew a volunteer worker for Icon Productions and Mel Gibson, Lourdes Gutierrez, this contact was made. Gutierrez had been involved with the movie in a volunteer capacity, helping to put together two screenings in the Miami, Fla., area.

According to Unity, "Mel Gibson had come to Fatima in September of 2003 to ask Our Lady for help in the film and later Jim Caviezel (the actor who played Christ) came to show the film to religious institutions to get their opinions of the movie. He even went to the Convent in Coimbra to show the film but was refused because he insisted on going behind the cloister which is not permitted."

Lourdes Gutierrez recalled that "Ninety-two e-mails back and forth later and many phone calls, a deal was set to show the film to the nuns. This was difficult because there were no DVDs yet and only 1 inch tapes, which require special cameras and large pull down screens.

"We even got approval for Mel Gibson to see Lucia in a private meeting, but because Mel Gibson might be attacked as using Lucia to promote his film, he, Mel Gibson, and not the convent, insisted that such a visit would be strictly secret.

"In the end only Father Condor, the convent and the Icon Production crew knew of the date of showing the film. We knew the month but that was all. It must

have cost Mel Gibson ten to twenty thousand dollars to show this film to the convent because it took a full crew of camera men.

"Mel Gibson later came into Portugal to promote the Portuguese version of the film and then sneaked over to the Convent without anyone knowing and met with Sister Lucia. We were told not to print this or let anyone know unless the Convent or Mel Gibson gave permission for it. This did not come until after the film ran its course in the theaters and the DVD ran its campaign in the stores."

Mel Gibson visited Lucia of Fatima at the Carmel convent last July. He was accompanied by his wife, Robin Moore, and Father Luis Condor.

According to the convent's Mother Superior Celina, the actor and his wife are wonderful and very humble people.

"He is very outspoken and a person easily to be liked, and he answered all of our questions about the movie. Some questions were asked by Sister Lucy, who attended the meeting which lasted for about an hour, was always very alert following the conversation," she told Unity.

According to Unity, what the nuns or Lucia said about the movie is unknown and may never be known because statements by Lucia or, for that matter, any Carmelite nun anywhere in the world are always sent through the bishop or the Holy Father first.

Because of her power of influence, Lucia must be very careful what she says publicly since she is one of the possessors of the so-called "Third Secret of Fatima."

As a child, Sister Lucia and her friends Jacinta and Francisco saw the Virgin Mary in a series of apparitions.

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While playing in a field outside the village of Fatima during World War I they saw a flash of light on top of a small evergreen tree. The light turned out to be the Virgin Mary, who asked that they come back on the 13th of each month for the next six months, at which times she would tell them who she was and what she wanted.

During the apparitions, the Virgin Mary made some prophecies, telling the children that if man did not stop offending God, a second great war would begin during the reign of Pope Pius XI. Twenty-two years later, World War II broke out in Europe.

The Virgin Mary also warned that Russia, unless converted, would wreak havoc upon the world. This was before the rise of the Soviet Union.

Mary also confided to the girls the so-called Third Secret. The Secret was to be read by the pope in office in 1960 and then publicized. As it turned out, Pope John XXIII was the pope at that time who read the secret and decided to not reveal its contents.

The contents of the Third Secret were shared with John XXIII's successors. In June 2000, Pope John Paul II released the Third Secret.

The message, as recounted by Lucia, warned of tribulation for the world and persecution of the Catholic Church, including the shooting of the pope.

Some Church officials believe that the shooting of John Paul II in 1982 was a fulfillment of the prophecy, while others believe it has yet to be fulfilled. Others wonder if the full details of the Third Secret have been revealed.

Asked in 1980 why the Secret had yet to be released, Pope John Paul II told a German audience:

"Because of the seriousness of its contents, in order not to encourage the worldwide power of Communism to carry out certain coups, my Predecessors in the Chair of Peter have diplomatically preferred to withhold its publication.

"On the other hand, it should be sufficient for all Christians to know this much: if there is a message in which it is said that the oceans will flood entire sections of the earth; that, from one moment to the other, millions of people will perish ... there is no longer any point in really wanting to publish this secret message.

"Many want to know merely out of curiosity, or because of their taste for sensationalism, but they forget that 'to know' implies for them a responsibility. It is dangerous to want to satisfy one's curiosity only, if one is convinced that we can do nothing against a catastrophe that has been predicted." At this point, the Holy Father took hold of his Rosary and said: "Here is the remedy against the evil! Pray, pray and ask for nothing else. Put everything in the hands of the Mother of God!"

John Paul II continued: "We must be prepared to undergo great trials in the not-too-distant future; trials that will require us to be ready to give up even our lives, and a total gift of self to Christ and for Christ.

"Through your prayers and mine, it is possible to alleviate this tribulation, but it is no longer possible to avert it, because it is only in this way that the Church can be effectively renewed. How many times, indeed, has the renewal of the Church been effected in blood? This time, again, it will not be otherwise.

"We must be strong, we must prepare ourselves, we must entrust ourselves to Christ and to His holy Mother, and we must be attentive, very attentive, to the prayer of the Rosary."

# MEL GIBSON BLASTS OSCARS, PLANS FATIMA MOVIE

Mel Gibson says he cut scenes from his soon-to-bere-released blockbuster film, "Passion of the Christ," to tone down the violence that earned it an R rating and kept some people from seeing it.

Gibson said he received "truckloads of cards and letters" when the original film was released.

"What came up again and again was that a lot of people were turned away because of the brutality in the film and were afraid to watch," he told Raymond Arroyo on EWTN's "World Over Live" Friday night.

"So I thought if I softened it up a bit, I could have a wider audience. Essentially it's the same film, but what I've done is to excise some of the aspects of it," he explained. "The trick was to excise or imply some of the aspects of it that were pretty much in your face, without actually showing them."

Gibson said he edited the film by reducing its length by about five or six minutes.

Gibson said among the changes he made was the scene showing the crowning of Christ with the crown of thorns.

"You see it, but it's farther away," he said, adding that viewers no longer see the nails being driven into Christ's hands. Despite the changes, Gibson said, "it still works." Gibson spoke about his recent visit to meet Sister Lucia, the Fatima visionary, as first revealed by NewsMax.com in January. [See previous article.]

Calling her "incredibly childlike," Gibson described her convent as "pretty austere and spartan."

Noting that he believes that the full contents of the famed Third Secret have not been revealed, he said, "I still don't think we got all it," but said he did not raise the subject with her.

"You can't go in there and say, 'So, what's the Third Secret?" he explained. "But I still want to know."

Sister Lucia passed away last month, renewing interest in the subject of her visions of the Virgin Mary. London's Daily Mail reported this weekend that Gibson is considering a movie about Fatima.

Commenting on the recent Oscar awards ceremonies, where Hollywood turned its back on "The Passion," Gibson said that he made none of the usual Hollywood moves to promote his film.

"The whole notion of these awards ceremonies is ludicrous. ... It's really a marketing exercise."

The awards ceremonies, he added, are "a celebration of mediocrity."

"My film is not right wing or political, but they made it so," he said.

He noted that he was delighted that his film won the People's Choice award.

As for the Oscar, Gibson said: "I didn't expect one. I knew exactly what was going to happen. I didn't try to market the film. People are spending 15 or 20 million dollars to market their films. That's a lot of money for a little gold statue." Gibson also revealed that he will be going back to acting in a couple of upcoming films.

# POPE FACES DOWN EVIL WITH NEW BOOK

Pope John Paul II may be ailing, but he is not afraid to speak out.

Already the Pope's newest book – just released in Europe – is creating headlines around the world.

In his most candid writings yet, John Paul II's "Memory and Identity, Conversations Between Millenniums" tackles hot button issues such as abortion and same-sex marriage, and fearlessly makes the case for his Church's positions.

Written in a question-and-answer format, the book is said to be a must-read not only for Catholics, but also for Christians concerned about the direction Western society is heading.

Though just published, it is already soaring to the top of the world's best-seller lists. The global anticipation is reminiscent of the excitement generated by his first book, "Crossing the Threshold of Hope," which came out a decade ago and sold 20 million copies.

The new book is scheduled to be released in the U.S. next month..

"Memory and Identity" has already set off a heated controversy in Germany and among Jewish groups after it was revealed that the Pope compares abortion to the Nazi Holocaust. In Germany, for example, a leader of the country's Central Council of Jews called the comparison "unacceptable."

According to press reports, the Pope:

Recalls his near-death memories after the attempt on his life, and compares abortion to the Holocaust.

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Denounces gay marriages as part of "a new ideology of evil." He argues that same-sex marriages threaten society by undermining the traditional family. Takes another swing at gay marriages when he refers to "pressures" on the European Parliament to allow them. "It is legitimate and necessary to ask oneself if this is not perhaps part of a new ideology of evil, perhaps more insidious and hidden, which attempts to pit human rights against the family and against man," he writes. Calls abortion "legal extermination" comparable to attempts to wipe out Jews and other groups in the 20th century. The Pope openly talks about the Nazi attempt to exterminate Jews and the wholesale slaughter of political opponents by Communist regimes after World War II. Writes about Turkish gunman Mehmet Ali Agca, who shot and nearly killed him in Saint Peter's Square on May 13, 1981. The Pope believes the gunman did not act alone, suggesting that the former Soviet Communist Bloc was probably behind the plot. The Pope says that the assassination attempt was not the gunman's initiative: "Someone else masterminded it and someone else commissioned it." Posits a connection between the assassination attempt and "the last convulsion" of the ideologies of the 20th century - a clear reference to the Communist bloc. Warns that new evils as bad the Nazis and Communism are rising, and claims that legally elected parliaments in formerly totalitarian countries are today allowing what he calls "new forms of evil" and new exterminations

"There is still, however, a legal extermination of human beings who have been conceived but not yet born," he writes. "And this time we are talking about an extermination which has been allowed by nothing less than democratically elected parliaments where one normally hears appeals for the civil progress of society and all humanity," he writes.

At a news conference introducing the Pope's new book, Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger, the Vatican's top doctrinal official, explained the Pope's comparison of abortion and the Holocaust by noting that the Pope was warning that evil lurked everywhere, "even in liberal political systems."

"Memory and Identity" is based on the Pope's conversations with philosopher friends in 1993 and later with some of his aides. Marketing materials from Orion Books, the publisher of the English edition, say the book reflects on the most challenging issues and events of the Pope's turbulent times.

"Pope John Paul II reveals his personal thoughts in a truly historic document," Orion writes. "The world's greatest communicator offers a moving insight into his intellectual and spiritual journey and pastoral experience."

With the Pope in his twilight years, the publisher notes this book contains his last words for posterity, "an intellectual and spiritual testament in an attempt to seek the answer to defining problems that vex our lives."

An Associated Press (AP) story takes it a step further: The book, it says, looks at Western Civilization with the goal of identifying nothing less than the "roots of evil."

as they want you to be, in order to love you. Our Heavenly Mother is not thus. She is full of grace, she is all in the love of God, and she tells us: "Dear children, if you knew how much I love you, you would cry of joy".

We can give to others only what we have. The same applies to love. Only the one who feels the love of God, and who knows that God loves him, can give this love to others. Often, when we have to show our love and give our love to others, we have the impression to have failed the exam. We are still far from mutual love, and it is the sign that we are also far from the love of God. The more we approach the love of God, the more easily will we be able to live and to give witness to others. This is the way of the prayer: to make the experience of what is most beautiful and to realize in our life what is most difficult.

The one who knows oneself loved wants to become similar to the one who loves him, and wants to answer to love. Blessed Mother Teresa used to say: "I know how much God loves me, and this is urging me towards the others, so that all can make the experience of it".

Let us pray for the power of love and for daily conversion, according to the prayer of John Henry Cardinal Newman: "Dear Jesus, help me to spread Your fragrance everywhere I go. Flood my soul with Your spirit and life. Penetrate and possess my whole being so utterly that all my life may only be a radiance of Yours. Shine through me, and be so in me that every soul I come in contact with may feel Your presence in my soul. The light, O Jesus, will be all from You; none of it will be mine; it will be You shining on others through me."

### **ANOTHER REFLECTION**

"Dear children! Today I call you to love. Little children, love each other with God's love." With the

first two sentences of Her message of March 25, 2005, Our Lady speaks to the heart of the Christian believer. These words seem so appropriate for Her message given this month on Good Friday.

As we begin another Easter Season, let us recall those sacred events that encompassed the passion, crucifixion and death of Jesus. Through a profound graciousness with much self-sacrificing love, Jesus offered Himself in the most complete way for the salvation of humanity. During these days may these thoughts ring in our ears. Let the love of Jesus shown through His sacrifice set the tone for who we are and who we hope to be. This process can begin by accepting Our Lady's "call to love; and by loving each other with God's love."

"At every moment, in joy and in sorrow, may love prevail and in this way, love will begin to reign in your hearts." As one reads this third sentence of Our Lady's message of March 25, 2005, he or she can comprehend a reality that is already known: the fact that love is the essence of what the Christian faith is all about. However, the willingness to fully embrace the self-sacrificing, unconditional love of our Triune God becomes more than a challenge for most of us. Again, let us reflect upon these words of Our Lady in this particular sentence of Her message of March 25, 2005. In joy and during successful times of our life, it can be easy, "to love." On the other hand, during the difficult times in sorrow and suffering it is much harder, "to love." Again, we have been called by Our dear Blessed Mother to change. We need to seek out and accept the quiet, forgiving, merciful, and suffering love of Jesus revealed to us during His passion and crucifixion. We must offer ourselves to the Eternal Father as Jesus did during His Agony in Also, we must reject the pride, the Garden. arrogance, indifference and revenge that can fill our hearts when people are not as charitable and kind as they should be. At times, we must be quiet and filled with solitude as Jesus was before Caiaphas, Pilate, and Herod. We have been called to embrace our crosses courageously, being filled with love as Jesus was during His way of the cross. As one lives in this world, he or she will realize quickly that these are significant challenges; but this is the way that "love will begin to reign in your hearts."

"The risen Jesus will be with you and you will be His witnesses." As Our Lady speaks these words to all of us who are Her little children, may we contemplate the immense beauty of Jesus' presence within our lives. Let us be willing to proclaim the message of Jesus being witnesses to His love by loving others in a most profound way. As we listen to many inspiring readings from the <u>Acts of the Apostles</u> during the Easter Season, may we be filled with hope as the Apostles were. As we embark upon this journey of being Jesus' witnesses in our world crying out for the peace of our dear Lord, may we share the faith with others in a most fervent way. Be a present day apostle, being one with the zeal of the early Christians. In this way, we can begin to spread the faith with Our Lady's presence and protection as She proclaimed in the fifth sentence of the message of March 25, 2005. "I will rejoice with you and protect you with my motherly mantle."

In this message of March 25, 2005 we have been called and challenged by Our Lady to love with God's love, while embracing that love. In this way, we can be witnesses of the risen Jesus. In the sixth sentence of this message, we are reminded of the importance of our personal daily conversion. "Especially, little children, I will watch your daily conversion with love." Again, these words should flow to the center of our being. Let us embrace this daily conversion with much strength. We must never be satisfied with who we are. We need to continue to seek out that precious reality of becoming one with God. This can only happen when we acknowledge our weakness and our sin. May we be willing to change. We are never alone in this process. Our Lady is with us, showering us with Her motherly love like a soft spring rain. Our dear Blessed Mother continues to bring us to the Holy Spirit while preparing us for Her dear Son. May we be forever grateful for Her dear motherly love and concern.

I hope you had a beautiful Holy Week and Easter Sunday. Rejoice and be filled with hope by the special opportunity given to us to celebrate this Easter

#### **SLAVES OF HABITS AND TRADITIONS**

One morning, while working on my regular and daily occupations, I met a man whom I knew. I saw that he was nervous and I asked: "How are you?". He answered me: "I am really fed up with this snow and this ice!" I responded: "Why are you annoyed with the snow? We usually see so little of it in our region!", and he said: "How not to be annoyed? The newspapers did not arrive yet, and it is almost midday! I read the newspaper every morning, and this morning they did not arrive! How can the day start well?" Someone else told me that the day started badly because he was in hurry, and he did not manage to drink his coffee, without which he couldn't function very well.

This is our reality. The things of this world and the practices without which we cannot live determine our temper, the day and the time that is passing. We are unable to live without certain things, unimportant in themselves. We became slaves. And when we speak about slavery today, we should not think of prison cells, camps, jails and colonization of peoples and groups. Contemporary slavery, it is the slavery of the heart and the spirit. Our heart and our spirit are imprisoned. We live in our personal dungeons. We are tied by all kinds of attachments and bound by our own habits and traditions. We are slaves of reputation, work, false friendships, interests, money, insurance companies, banks, games of fortune, alcohol, drugs, the media. In a world, which does not cease announcing the personal freedom, we became modern slaves.

When Jesus announces to his contemporaries that he has come to make them free in Spirit and in Truth, they rebel by saying that, being sons of Abraham, they are nobody's slaves. (Cf: Jn 8,31-42) However, once again the thoughts of Jesus were not their thoughts. Jesus speaks about slavery to sin, of the Page 16

blind slavery to the law, which neglects the heart and the needs for the concrete person. Jesus advances towards the cross and death to make us free, to overcome sin, and to announce the time of the fullness of life.

Each one of us can recognize his own prison and dungeon. Very close to us, a voice announces freedom. The way of the freedom, which is not limited by systems or the world politics, is to leave sin and human chains. The poet sings: "You are created for flying, my soul!" True freedom does not consist in the absence of walls and bars. Freedom is lived in the heart. At our time, certain prisoners are more free than those who live in freedom. There is no freedom without God, because the free will is an inalienable gift that comes from God. Confessionals, in particular in Medjugorje, are today places of freedom, which give witness of the victory of the mercy of God over the sin of men. The words of the priest, "Your sins are forgiven, go in peace!", mean: "God renewed you in Spirit and in Truth. go and live free of any sin and any attachment!"

#### THE 12TH INTERNATIONAL MEETING FOR LEADERS OF MEDJUGORJE PEACE CENTERS AND PRAYER, PILGRIM AND CHARITY GROUPS HAS ENDED



The 12th International Meeting for Leaders of Medjugorje Peace Centers and Prayer, Pilgrim and Charity groups took place in Medjugorje from March 6 to 10, 2005. About 120 participants

came from about 15 countries. The theme of this encounter was: "The guide and the pilgrim".

This year's speakers were Hubert Liebherr from Germany and Kevin Lacey from Ireland. During the meeting, there was also one day of fasting and intense prayer led by Father Ljubo Kurtovic. About the role of the guide spoke also Father Jozo Zovko. Father Ivan Landeka gave the report about the humanitarian activities linked to Medjugorje. During the encounter, the documentary "The Lights of Medjugorje" was shown to the participants. Masses during the meeting were presided by Doctor Father Tomislav Pervan,

Father Ljubo Kurtovic, Father Svetozar Kraljevic and Father Mario Knezovic who - in his function of Director of the Information Center "Mir" Medjugorje - was also the coordinator of the meeting. The concluding Mass was presided by Father Branko Rados, pastor of Medjugorje. The participants were



especially praying for the health of our Holy Father, the Pope John Paul II, and they sent him a letter of encouragement signed by all. The participants made the following statement, which we

publish entirely.

#### STATEMENT

Gathered together under the protection of the Queen of Peace in Medjugorje, united with Christ and the Church, we took part in the 12th International Meeting for Leaders of Medjugorje Peace Centers and Prayer, Pilgrim and Charity groups. As we are related to Medjugorje for a number of years now, as pilgrims and as leaders of pilgrimages, we were meditating on the theme, "The guide and the pilgrim".

Aware of the fact that Medjugorje is attracting pilgrims from all over the world, open to the Holy Spirit, we were listening to the conferences about the role of the guide - as extended hands of God and of Our Lady - on the way of conversion of so many. We were thinking of the words of Jesus: "You have not chosen me but I have chosen you". (John 15,16) To be a guide is a gift, but also a great responsibility, that can be carried out only in full collaboration with the Grace of God and in being attentive to Our Lady's messages. "Therefore, dear little children, listen and live what I tell you, because it is important for you when I shall not be with you any longer, that you remember my words and all that I told you." (Message of October 25, 1992) In this sense, we have decided to give a new attention to the role of the guide as a mediator, standing like a road sign on the pathway of God. In prayer, we received strength to continue tirelessly with the mission that we have inherited. We also exchanged experiences and opinions on how each leader and guide of payer groups should be personally evangelized in the Spirit, in freedom and in truth, in order to be able to play the role of mediator. "You need the Spirit of Truth to be able to convey the messages just the way they are, neither adding anything to them, nor taking anything whatsoever way from them, but just the way I said them." (Message of June 9, 1984.)

From this meeting, we invite all those who organize pilgrimages to Medjugorje to put at the center of their journey the Prayer- and Liturgical Program proposed by the Parish Medjugorje, and to explain to the pilgrims the essential importance of the sacramental life of the Church, especially of Holy Mass and Confession.

We also prayed for the health of our Holy Father, the Pope John Paul II, beseeching God to give him strength, and asking Our Lady to intercede for him and for his service to Christ, to the Church and to all mankind.

#### Verastegui in Medjugorje



18.03.2005. – The Mexican television movie star Eduardo Verastegui came to the Shrine of the Queen of Peace in Medjugorje for the first time in March 2005. He heard about Medjugorje for the first time from his English teacher three years ago, when he moved from Mexico to Los Angeles. He had to learn English, because he has

signed a contract for a movie to be made in the USA. His teacher is very devoted to Our Lady and to Medjugorje, and she spoke to him about apparitions, visionaries, messages, confessions and prayers in

Medjugorje. "This is how my conversion began. I started to go to the church daily, and among the Catholics, wherever I came, I heard only "Medjugorje, Medjugorje"..., says Eduardo.

### INTERESTING STORY ABOUT MOUNT KRIZEVAC

I am a lightweight history buff. In my informal research of Krizevac, forever a significant place on Earth for my husband and me as that is where we felt closest to Mother Mary and where she touched us to our core, I came across a most intriguing article on the mountain.

Seems as early as 1932, God began preparing Medjugorje for its future role:

"The first strange incident took place in 1932 involving Pope Pius XI. This pope was born Achille Ratti near Milano and, after his ordination as a priest, was an archivist at the Vatican Library. After World War I, he became the papal nuncio in Warsaw, Poland. He was also an enthusiastic mountain climber.

One night in February 1932, Pope Pius XI was asleep in his Vatican bedroom and dreamed that he was climbing a mountain. A mountain he had never seen before. # ON the ORIGIN and MEANING of the ROSARY

#### A Powerful Prayer, Says Archbishop Sorrentino

VATICAN CITY, OCT. 12, 2004 (Zenit.org).- The rosary is an "intensely contemplative" and powerful prayer with a long history, says a Vatican aide.

"Personally, I have seen miracles with the rediscovery of this prayer," said Archbishop Domenico Sorrentino, secretary of the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Sacraments, in an interview on Vatican Radio.

He recalled encountering "people who have found in this prayer food for the soul and a reason for conversion."

At last Wednesday's general audience, John Paul II invited the faithful in this "month of the rosary" to make the Marian devotion "your daily prayer."

The recitation of the rosary began "in a very modest way in the first centuries of the second millennium," Archbishop Sorrentino said in his interview.

"At that time, the Psalms were recited in their liturgical organization, the Psalter with lauds and

vespers, but there were many who could not pray ... in Latin, and the Psalms then began to be replaced by the 'Pater' and 'Ave' prayers, which little by little were given a certain organization that varied according to circumstances," the archbishop explained.

"Then, gradually, meditation of the mysteries was added," he continued. "The prayer grew until it took on the typical form that we are used to reciting, and this occurred in particular with Saint Pius V, when he instituted the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, which was then linked to a special historical circumstance: the Christian victory over the Ottoman menace."

"The Pope believed that this victory was due to the insistent prayer of Christians, through the intercession of the Mother of God," Archbishop Sorrentino noted.

Since then, the rosary "has been recited by the Christian community following this scheme, until John Paul II, two years ago, with the Year of the Rosary," altered this prayer, "focusing more on its Christological and biblical aspect, in particular, by adding the 'mysteries of light," the archbishop said.

"If it is well understood," it "is a prayer that says much," he said. The rosary is intensely "contemplative. The repetition, which often from a distance might seem to be mechanical, in fact serves as a breath of the soul which, gazing on Jesus Christ, assumes a contemplative attitude through Mary's eyes and heart."

If understood from this perspective, one can appreciate how this Marian prayer "can really give tone to the Christian spirit, it can help a Christian in his daily living to remain well anchored in the mystery of our salvation, especially in Jesus Christ, who is the heart, the center of the life of a Christian," the prelate said.

"Sadly, sometimes this prayer is recited in the least of its possibilities," he said. "It would be good if the People of God became conscious of the potential of this prayer by following closely the suggestions made by the Pope."

# LETTER of the HOLY FATHER JOHN PAUL II to PRIESTS for HOLY THURSDAY 2005

#### Dear Priests!

1. In this Year of the Eucharist, I particularly welcome our annual spiritual encounter for Holy Thursday, the day when Christ's love was manifested "to the end" (cf. Jn 13:1), the day of the Eucharist, the day of our priesthood.

My thoughts turn to you, dear priests, as I spend this time recuperating in hospital, a patient alongside other patients, uniting in the Eucharist my own sufferings with those of Christ. In this spirit I want to reflect with you on some aspects of our priestly spirituality.

I will take as my inspiration the words of Eucharistic consecration, which we say every day in persona Christi in order to make present on our altars the sacrifice made once and for all on Calvary. These words provide us with illuminating insights for priestly spirituality: if the whole Church draws life from the Eucharist, all the more then must the life of a priest be "shaped" by the Eucharist. So for us, the words of institution must be more than a formula of consecration: they must be a "formula of life".

#### A life of profound "gratitude"

2. "Tibi gratias agens benedixit". At every Mass we remember and relive the first sentiment expressed by Jesus as he broke the bread: that of thanksgiving. Gratitude is the disposition which lies at the root of the very word "Eucharist". This expression of thanksgiving contains the whole Biblical spirituality of praise for the mirabilia Dei. God loves us, he goes before us in his Providence, he accompanies us with his continuous saving acts.

In the Eucharist Jesus thanks the Father with us and for us. How could this thanksgiving of Jesus fail to shape the life of a priest? He knows that he must

cultivate a constant sense of gratitude for the many gifts he has received in the course of his life: in particular, for the gift of faith, which it is his task to proclaim, and for the gift of the priesthood, which consecrates him totally to the service of the Kingdom of God. We have our crosses to bear - and we are certainly not the only ones! - but the gifts we have received are so great that we cannot fail to sing from the depths of our hearts our own Magnificat.

#### A life that is "given"

3. "Accipite et manducate. Accipite et bibite". Christ's self-giving, which has its origin in the Trinitarian life of the God who is Love, reaches its culmination in the sacrifice of the Cross, sacramentally anticipated in the Last Supper. It is impossible to repeat the words of consecration without feeling oneself caught up in this spiritual movement. In a certain sense, when he says the words: "take and eat", the priest must learn to apply them also to himself, and to speak them with truth and generosity. If he is able to offer himself as a gift, placing himself at the disposal of the community and at the service of anyone in need, his life takes on its true meaning.

This is exactly what Jesus expected of his apostles, as the Evangelist John emphasizes in his account of the washing of the feet. It is also what the People of God expect of a priest. If we think about it more fully, the priest's promise of obedience, which he made on the day of Ordination and is asked to renew at the Chrism Mass, is illuminated by this relationship with the Eucharist. Obeying out of love, sacrificing even a certain legitimate freedom when the authoritative discernment of the Bishop so requires, the priest lives out in his own flesh that "take and eat" with which Christ, in the Last Supper, gave himself to the Church.

#### A life that is "saved" in order to save

4. "Hoc est enim corpus meum quod pro vobis tradetur." The body and the blood of Christ are given for the salvation of man, of the whole man and of all men. This salvation is integral and at the same time universal, because no one, unless he freely chooses, is excluded from the saving power of Christ's blood: "qui pro vobis et pro multis effundetur". It is a sacrifice offered for "many", as the Biblical text says (Mk 14:24; Mt 26:28; cf. Is 53:11-12); this typical Semitic expression refers to the multitude who are saved by Christ, the one Redeemer, yet at the same time it implies the totality of human beings to whom salvation is offered: the Lord's blood is "shed for you and for all", as some translations legitimately make explicit. Christ's flesh is truly given "for the life of the world" (Jn 6:51; cf. 1 Jn 2:2).

Repeating Christ's venerable words in the recollected silence of the liturgical assembly, we priests become privileged heralds of this mystery of salvation. Yet unless we sense that we ourselves are saved, how can we be convincing heralds? We are the first to be touched inwardly by the grace which raises us from our frailty and makes us cry "Abba, Father" with the confidence of God's children (cf. Gal 4:6; Rom 8:15). This in turn commits us to advance along the path of perfection. Holiness, in fact, is the full expression of salvation. Only if our lives manifest the fact that we are saved do we become credible heralds of salvation. Moreover, a constant awareness of Christ's will to offer salvation to all cannot fail to inspire us with fresh missionary fervor, spurring each of us on to become "all things to all men, in order to save at least some of them" (1 Cor 9:22).

#### A life that "remembers"

5. "Hoc facite in meam commemorationem." These words of Jesus have been preserved for us not only by Luke (22:19) but also by Paul (1 Cor 11:24). We should keep in mind that they were spoken in the context of the Paschal meal, which for the Jews was indeed a "memorial" (in Hebrew, zikkarôn). On that occasion the Israelites relived the Exodus first and foremost, but also the other important events of their history: the call of Abraham, the sacrifice of Isaac, the Covenant of Sinai, the many acts of God in defense of his people. For Christians too, the Eucharist is a "memorial", but of a unique kind: it not only commemorates, but sacramentally makes present the death and resurrection of the Lord.

Jesus said: "Do this in memory of me". The Eucharist does not simply commemorate a fact; it commemorates Him! Through his daily repetition in persona Christi of the words of the "memorial", the priest is invited to develop a "spirituality of remembrance". At a time when rapid social and cultural changes are weakening the sense of tradition and leading the younger generation especially to risk losing touch with their roots, the priest is called to be, within the community entrusted to him, the man who faithfully remembers the entire mystery of Christ: prefigured in the Old Testament, fulfilled in the New, and understood ever more deeply, under the guidance of the Spirit, as Jesus explicitly promised: "He will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you" (Jn 14:26).

#### A "consecrated" life

6. "Mysterium fidei!" Every time he proclaims these words after consecrating the bread and wine, the priest expresses his ever-renewed amazement at the extraordinary miracle worked at his hands. It is a miracle which only the eyes of faith can perceive. The

natural elements do not lose their external characteristics, since the "species" remain those of bread and wine; but their "substance", through the power of Christ's word and the action of the Holy Spirit, is changed into the substance of the body and blood of Christ. On the altar, then, Christ crucified and risen is "truly, really and substantially" present in the fullness of his humanity and divinity. What an eminently sacred reality! That is why the Church treats this mystery with such great reverence, and takes such care to ensure the observance of the liturgical norms intended to safeguard the sanctity of so great a sacrament.

We priests are the celebrants, but also the guardians of this most sacred mystery. It is our relationship to the Eucharist that most clearly challenges us to lead a "sacred" life. This must shine forth from our whole way of being, but above all from the way we celebrate. Let us sit at the school of the saints! The Year of the Eucharist invites us to rediscover those saints who were vigorous proponents of Eucharistic devotion (cf. Mane Nobiscum Domine, 31). Many beatified and canonized priests have given exemplary testimony in this regard, enkindling fervor among the faithful present at their celebrations of Mass. Many of them were known for their prolonged Eucharistic adoration. To place ourselves before Jesus in the Eucharist, to take advantage of our ``moments of solitude" and to fill them with this Presence, is to enliven our consecration by our personal relationship with Christ, from whom our life derives its joy and its meaning.

#### A life centered on Christ

7. "Mortem tuam annuntiamus, Domine, et tuam resurrectionem confitemur, donec venias." Every time we celebrate the Eucharist, the remembrance of Christ in his Paschal Mystery leads to the desire for a full and definitive encounter with Him. We live in expectation of his coming! In priestly spirituality, this expectation must be lived out through pastoral charity, which impels us to live in the midst of God's People, so as to direct their path and to nourish their hope. This task requires from the priest an interior attitude similar to that of the Apostle Paul: "Forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on towards the goal" (Phil 3:13-14). The priest is someone who, despite the passing of years, continues to radiate vouthfulness. spreading it almost "contagiously" among those he meets along the way. His secret lies in his "passion" for Christ. As Saint Paul said: "For me, to live is Christ" (Phil 1:21).

Particularly in the context of the new evangelization, the people have a right to turn to priests in the hope of

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"seeing" Christ in them (cf. Jn 12:21). The young feel the need for this especially; Christ continues to call them, to make them his friends and to challenge some to give themselves completely for the sake of the Kingdom. Vocations will certainly not be lacking if our manner of life is truly priestly, if we become more holy, more joyful, more impassioned in the exercise of our ministry. A priest "won" by Christ (cf. Phil 3:12) more easily "wins" others, so that they too decide to set out on the same adventure.

#### A "Eucharistic" life at the school of Mary

8. The relationship between the Blessed Virgin Mary and the Eucharist is a very close one, as I pointed out in the Encyclical Ecclesia de Eucharistia (cf. Nos. 53-58). In its own sober liturgical language, every Eucharistic Prayer brings this out. Thus in the Roman Canon we say: "In union with the whole Church we honor Mary, the ever-virgin Mother of Jesus Christ our Lord and God". In the other Eucharistic Prayers, honor leads to petition, as for example in Prayer II: "Make us worthy to share eternal life with Mary, the virgin Mother of God."

In recent years, I have warmly recommended the contemplation of the face of Christ, especially in my Letters Novo Millennio Ineunte (cf. Nos. 23ff.) and in Rosarium Virginis Mariae (cf. Nos. 9ff.), and I have pointed to Mary as our great teacher. In the Encyclical on the Eucharist I then spoke of her as the "Woman of the Eucharist" (cf. No. 53). Who more than Mary can help us taste the greatness of the Eucharistic mystery? She more than anyone can teach us how to celebrate the sacred mysteries with due fervor and to commune with her Son, hidden in the Eucharist. I pray to her, then, for all of you, and I entrust to her especially the elderly, the sick, and those in difficulty. This Easter, in the Year of the Eucharist, I gladly repeat to each of you the gentle and consoling words of Jesus: "Behold your Mother" (Jn 19:27).

With these sentiments, I send you my heartfelt blessing, and I wish you the profound joy of Easter.
