BISHOP SAYS NO SUNDAY SHOPPING - A WEDGE ISSUE IN THE CULTURE WARS

Phoenix July 18, 2005 (Life Site News.com) – The Catholic bishop of Phoenix, Arizona, quoted in the Arizona Republic, told a congregation attending the most recent priestly ordinations that the world has suffered with the loss of the religious observance of Sunday as a day of rest. The article, which appeared in the July 17th Sunday edition, posed the question, "Whatever happened to Sunday?" It reflects the observation of many Christians that the day which used to be reserved to religious and family togetherness, has turned into "an extension of Saturday," filled with errands invariable including shopping.

Bishop Olmsted of Phoenix said, "Keep the Lord's day holy...refrain from all shopping and enjoy Sunday as a day of rest, a day of leisure, a day for family, a day for celebrating the Eucharist."

The trend to the loss of the observance of Sunday is another feature of the general de-Christianizing of western culture since the end of the Second World War. Some say it is one small symptom among others, but others see it as the thin edge of wedge and one which may easily be reversed. According to a 2003 survey by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, as many as 33% of workers are at work on Sundays and holidays.

Steve Skojec, a married Catholic layman involved in the burgeoning Latin Mass community in Phoenix, says that his families as well as the other families involved in the traditional Catholic community take the Sunday religious and family observance as a serious part of their faith. Skojec, a realtor and father of two, told LifeSiteNews.com, that the observance of Sunday is worthwhile for its spiritual benefits. "For my wife and I, being in real estate, Sunday is a big money making day. But we feel, *if we forego the ability to make money on Sunday, God will bless us.*"

The work of restoring Christian culture is one that interests many young Catholic and other Christian lay people. The leadership of Christian communities can help by encouraging the growth of genuine Christian social and political movements such as pro-life activity, a project at which the new bishop of Phoenix has excelled

The diocese, which has recently made the Latin Mass much more available, has also encouraged other traditional Catholic measures to counter the secularizing trend. Bishop Olmstead recently welcomed five sisters from the same cloistered order of nuns as Mother Angelica of EWTN fame to his diocese. Father Frank Pavone of Priests for Life was also recently featured giving talks on the right to life in a Phoenix parish. Bishop Olmsted is also often seen protesting outside area abortion mills.

Skojec, 27, implied that the observance of Sunday, what Catholics refer to as the 'Sunday obligation' extends further than merely attending Church services. He said, "To us, if we forego the ability to make money on Sunday, God will bless us. In our minds, the avoidance of temporal gain on Sunday is rewarded with spiritual blessings".

EXPERTS IN THE EUCHARIST

The following is Pope John Paul II's message on "Eucharist and Mission," for the 78th World Mission Sunday, October 24, 2004.

My dearest Brothers and Sisters! The Church's missionary activity is an urgency also at the beginning of the third millennium, as I have often said. Mission, as I stated in the encyclical Redemptoris Missio, is still only beginning and we must commit ourselves wholeheartedly to its service. The entire People of God at every moment of its pilgrimage through history is called to share the Redeemer's "thirst" (cf. Jn. 19:28). This thirst to save souls has always been strongly experienced by the saints: It suffices to think, for example, of Saint Therese of Lisieux, patroness of the missions, and of Bishop Comboni, great apostle of Africa whom I recently had the joy of raising to the honor of the altars. The social and religious challenges facing humanity in our day call believers to renew their missionary fervor.

Yes! It is necessary to relaunch the mission "ad gentes" with courage, starting with the proclamation of Christ, Redeemer of every human person. The International Eucharistic Congress which will be celebrated in Guadalajara, Mexico this October, the missionary month, will be an extraordinary opportunity to grow in choral missionary awareness around the table of the Body and Blood of Christ. Gathered around the altar, the Church understands better her origin and her missionary mandate. As the theme of World Mission Sunday this year clearly emphasizes. "Eucharist" and "mission" are inseparable. In addition to reflection on the bond that exists between the Eucharistic mystery and the mystery of the Church, this year there will be an eloquent reference to the Blessed Virgin Mary, because of the occurrence of the 150th anniversary of the definition of the dogma of the Immaculate Conception (1854-2004).

Let us contemplate the Eucharist with the eyes of Mary. Confiding in the intercession of the Blessed Virgin, the Church offers Christ, the Bread of Salvation, to all peoples that they recognize Him and accept Him as the only Savior of mankind.

EUCHARISTIC MISSIONARIES

Returning to the Upper Room last year, precisely on Holy Thursday, I signed the encyclical Ecclesia de Eucharistia, from which I would like to take some passages which will help us, dearest Brothers and Sisters, to live World Mission Sunday this year with a Eucharistic spirit. "The Eucharist builds the Church and the Church makes the Eucharist" (no.26), I wrote, observing how the mission of the Church is a continuity of the mission of Christ (cf. Jn 20:21), and draws spiritual energy from communion with His Body and Blood. The goal of the Eucharist is precisely "communion of mankind with Christ and in Him with the Father and the Holy Spirit" (Ecclesia de Eucharistia, EE, no. 22).

When we take part in the Eucharistic sacrifice we understand more profoundly the universality of redemption and consequently, the urgency of the Church's mission with its program which "has its center in Christ Himself, who is to be known, loved, and imitated, so that in Him we may live the life of the Trinity; and with Him transform history until its fulfillment in the heavenly Jerusalem" (EE, no. 60).

Around Christ in the Eucharist the Church grows as the people, temple, and family of God: one, holy, Catholic and apostolic. At the same time she understands better her character of universal sacrament of salvation and visible reality with a hierarchical structure. Certainly "no Christian community can be built up unless it has its basis and center in the celebration of the most Holy Eucharist" (EE, no. 33). At the end of every Mass, when the celebrant takes leave of the assembly with the words "Ite, Missa est," all should feel they are sent as "missionaries of the Eucharist" to carry to every environment the great gift received. In fact, anyone who encounters Christ in the Eucharist cannot fail to proclaim through his or her life the merciful love of the Redeemer.

To live the Eucharist it is necessary as well to spend much time in adoration in front of the Blessed Sacrament, something which I myself experience every day, drawing from it strength, consolation, and assistance (cf. EE, no. 25). The Eucharist, the Second Vatican Council affirms, "is the source and summit of all Christian life" (cf. Lumen Gentium, LG, no. 11), "the source and summit of all evangelization" (cf. Presbyterorum Ordinis, no. 5). The bread and wine, fruit of human hands, transformed through the power of the Holy Spirit into the Body and Blood of Christ, become a pledge of the "new heaven and new earth" (Rev. 21:1), announced by the Church in her daily mission.

In Christ, whom we adore present in the mystery of the Eucharist, the Father uttered His final word with regard to humanity and human history. How could the Church fulfill her vocation without cultivating a constant relationship with the Eucharist, without nourishing herself with this food which sanctifies, without founding her missionary activity on this indispensable support? To evangelize the world there

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is need of apostles who are "experts" in the celebration, adoration, and contemplation of the Eucharist.

NOURISHED BY THE EUCHARIST

In the Eucharist we relive the mystery of the Redemption, culminating in the Lord's sacrifice, as it is said in the words of consecration: "my body which will be given for you. . . my blood which will be poured out for you" (Lk. 22:19-20). Christ died for all; and for all is the gift of salvation which the Eucharist renders sacramentally present in the course of history: "Do this in memory of me" (Lk. 22:19). This mandate is entrusted to ordained ministers through the Sacrament of Holy Orders. To this banquet and sacrifice all men and women are invited so they may share in the very life of Christ: "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him. As I, who am sent by the living Father, myself draw life from the Father, so whoever eats me will draw life from me" (Jn. 6:56-57). Nourished by Him, believers come to understand that the missionary task means being "acceptable as an offering, made holy by the Holy Spirit" (cf. Rom. 15:16), in order to be more and more "one heart and soul" (Acts 4:32) and to be witnesses of His love to the ends of the earth. Journeying through the centuries, reliving every day the sacrifice of the altar, the Church, the People of God, awaits Christ's coming in glory. This is proclaimed after the consecration by the Eucharistic assembly gathered around the altar.

Time after time, with renewed faith, the Church repeats her desire for the final encounter with the One who comes to bring His plan of universal salvation to completion. The Holy Spirit with invisible but powerful working, guides the Christian people on this daily spiritual itinerary on which they inevitably encounter difficulties and experience the mystery of the Cross. The Eucharist is the comfort and the pledge of final triumph for those who fight evil and sin; it is the "bread of life" which sustains those who, in turn, become "bread broken" for others, paying at times even with martyrdom their fidelity to the Gospel.

FIRST TABERNACLE

This year, as I already mentioned, will be the 150th anniversary of the proclamation of the dogma of the Immaculate Conception. Mary was "redeemed by reason of the merits of her Son" in an especially sublime manner (LG, no. 53). I said in the encyclical letter Ecclesia de Eucharistia: "Gazing upon Mary, we come to know that transforming power present in the Eucharist. In her we see the world renewed in love" (EE, no. 62). Mary, "the first 'tabernacle' in history" (EE, no. 55), shows us and offers us Christ, the Way, the Truth and the Life (cf. Jn. 14:6). "If the Church and the Eucharist are inseparably united, the same ought to be said of Mary and the Eucharist" (EE, no. 57).

I hope that the happy coinciding of the International Eucharistic Congress with the 150th anniversary of the definition of the Immaculate Conception of Mary, may offer the faithful, parishes and missionary institutes an opportunity to strengthen their missionary zeal so that in every community there may always be "a genuine 'hunger' for the Eucharist" (EE, no. 33). This is also a good opportunity to mention the contribution offered to the Church's apostolic activity by the worthy Pontifical Mission Societies. They are very dear to my heart and I thank them, on behalf of all, for the valid service rendered to new evangelization and the mission "ad gentes." I ask you to support them spiritually and materially so that also through their contribution, the proclamation of the Gospel may reach all the peoples of the earth. With these sentiments, invoking the maternal intercession of Mary, "woman of the Eucharist," I gladly impart to you my Apostolic Blessing.

EUCHARIST

The Eucharistic sacrifice is the source and summit of the Christian life. Therefore, it's incumbent upon us, even in the midst of difficulties, to tap into the superabundant grace Christ makes available to us at every Mass.

Surely we must be properly disposed to receive so great a sacrament. At minimum, we should first go to Confession if we're aware of having committed a serious sin (cf. Catechism, no. 1385). But to maximize the efficacy of the Eucharist in our own lives, I'd suggest that we strive to enter into Mass with the following disposition:

Gratitude- The Eucharist is the greatest gift Our Lord has left to His Church. In our parish we have access to the Bread from heaven that gives us eternal life (cf. Jn.6:54). The "shadows" *of* liturgical abuse should not distract us from the more fundamental reality that Our Lord and God is freely giving Himself to us here and now. This reality should fill us not only with gratitude, but with what the Holy Father calls "Eucharistic awe."

MIRACLE of MIRACLES

The great genius of the Catholic Mass is that, through all the signs and symbols, the Church wishes to communicate that it is the Risen Christ with the marks of the sacred wounds in His body who becomes present. The teaching of transubstantiation states that when one asks, "What is it?" of the Eucharist after the words of institution have been said over the elements of bread and wine, one must answer, "The whole reality of the body, blood, soul, and divinity of Christ."

This means that the change which occurs in the Eucharist is unique. In fact, the medieval theologians used to call it the "*miraculum miraculorum*" (the miracle of miracles). In all other changes, the properties change when the being changes. In the Eucharist, the properties (taste, color, shape, molecular structure) remain and yet are the vehicle of the change. These are called the *accidents* (not in the sense of an unforeseen event, but in the sense of something which must exist in another thing). The whole being of the bread and wine (what they are) also called the *substance* (a being which can exist in its own right) change into the body, blood, soul, and divinity of the Lord.

Christ from heaven becomes present on the altar and since His soul is there, the accepted sacrifice of His will with all the loving obedience by which He reversed original sin becomes present too. This is given to us in order to transform us into one like Him. This is the Real Presence with capital letters. "This presence is called 'real' not in an exclusive sense, as if the other kinds of presence were not real, but 'par excellence,' because it is a substantial presence by which Christ, the God-man, whole and entire becomes present." 1

REAL PRESENCE

The other presences of Christ must be distinguished from the Real Presence. Christ is present in creation, in a sunset, and in a tree because as God He causes them, but not as though He were a part of the *being* of the sunset and the tree. God brings them into being, is the model which each thing imitates and the purpose they have for acting. He is not a created thing like them and He is certainly not a part of their *matter* because God is *infinite being* and it is not possible for God to be something He is not.

Christ is in my neighbor by image since all men have a soul. If my neighbor is in the state of grace, Christ is present in him as a quality, but I do not genuflect and adore my neighbor. Christ is present in His own flesh by the grace of the union of the Person of the Word with His human nature in the womb of Mary, and this can never be lost. He is present in the Church because by analogy He is the head of His Mystical Body as we refer to someone who is the head of the body politic, but this is a moral guidance. He is present in the other sacraments because they have the power to bring grace. He is present in the Eucharist by *substance*. This is a unique presence and related to His presence as the Person of the Word in His flesh.

Every Mass, then, involves the presence of Christ from heaven and the application of His sacrifice to the living and the dead. "For even though a priest should offer Mass in private, that Mass is not something private.... [F]or the salvation of the entire world she [the Church] applies the single. boundless. redemptive power of the Sacrifice of the Cross."2 Each priest must realize that he is not unifying the congregation. He is acting in each Mass in the person of Jesus Christ. All the saints and angels are present adoring Christ, no matter how many people are physically at Mass. It is more than a breach of courtesy, then, for a priest to violate the ritual or get colloquial or "folksy." As Lady Abbess says in the book In This House of Brede when one of the Benedictine nuns tells her that her singing of the liturgy has made it beautiful, "Oh no, it is beautiful. That is the beauty of the liturgy. It wipes out self."

UNBLOODY OFFERING

Catholics are often accused of detracting from the one, eternal sacrifice of Christ on the Cross. Nothing could be further from the truth. The fruits of that sacrifice, the loving obedience by which Christ atoned for original sin, is applied to the whole world through the daily offering of the Mass. The priest is the same, the victim is the same, only the manner of offering differs. This is an unbloody offering for the living and the dead.

When Vatican II recommended active participation, it did not mean everyone had to sing, even those who could not carry a tune, or that the Mass should be filled with constant activity. What they meant was that one who attended must offer himself or herself morally with Christ and experience the transformation of life which turns quite ordinary people into transmitters of Christ's grace to the world. It is important to remember that the sacred is not distinct from the profane as good to evil, but as eternal reality underlying the commonplace. The Mass emphasizes that God's point of view supports and guides ours. In offering ourselves with Christ at the Mass in an ascending movement, we receive Him who condescends to our altars. We are associated with His

sacrifice and our whole temperament is changed to reflect the way God looks at the world.

When Jacob had his dream in Genesis, he saw a ladder in which angels ascended and descended to God. He poured oil on the stone on which he had rested his head and this was the sight of the first temple, Bethel. Jesus alluded to this when he met Bartholomew, saying that he would see the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man (cf. Jn. 1:51). In the Mass, our hearts ascend to God with Christ and descend back to the transformation of ourselves and our world, for this is truly a *terribilis locus*, an awesome place. "How awesome is this place! This is none other than the house of God and this is the gate of heaven" (Gen. 28:17).

He loves you always, even when you don't feel worthy, when you are not accepted by others, even yourself, sometimes. Jesus is the one who always accepts you.

Only believe. You are precious to Jesus.

Bring all you are suffering to His feet, open your heart to be loved by Jesus as you are. He will do the rest.

DO THIS in REMEMBRANACE of ME?

A five year study of churches in the United States was just concluded by the Hartford Institute for Religious Research. This was the most extensive research ever done in this country on Church attendance. The figures were revealing.

The average non-Catholic church has less than 300 participants. Less than one in eight have more than 300. Regarding the 18,000 Catholic parishes, however, the average attendance is 2,800. As for daily attendance, only Catholic churches have any.

What explains the difference? The noted convert to Catholicism, Doctor Scott Hahn, stresses the immense following that the Mass has for Catholics.

But don't non-Catholics use the same Bible as we do? Yes, but as Hahn explains, when he taught scripture in Protestant seminaries, he and his fellow professors completely omitted any reference to Christ's establishment of the Mass at the Last Supper

Sadly, the Mass was completely omitted in non-Catholic services after the Reformation. In countries like England and Ireland, priests were shot on sight by the police.

Mass and Holy Communion

The Mass is the very center and heart of Catholicism, and always has been. As Christ told us: "*He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood aides in me, and I in him*" (John 6:36). By receiving Holy Communion we increase our union with Our Lord.

The Mass is the renewal of the Holy Sacrifice of the Cross. It is at Mass that we are given special graces that were won for us in Christ's passion and death.

It is by participating in the Mass that we carry out Christ's command to celebrate the memorial of His sacrifice, as He becomes present on the altar after the priest invokes the words of consecration.

Before Christ consecrated bread and wine at the Last Supper, He had insisted that this bread contains eternal life for those who receive it, and commented: "I am the living bread which came down from heaven. If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever, and the bread which I give for the life of the world is my flesh" (Jn 6:51-52).

Every time we receive Holy Communion, Christ offers us His continuing, lasting presence.

Eternal Happiness

Receiving the Holy Eucharist should be done in the realization that we will be happy with Him forever. It is this Bread that provides the sustenance for eternal life. As Saint Ignatius of Antioch wrote more than 1900 years ago: "Every time this mystery is celebrated, the work of our redemption is carried on, as we break the bread that makes us live forever in Jesus Christ."

In his beautiful exhortation, The Church in America Pope John Paul II noted: "The Eucharist is the outstanding moment of encounter with the living Christ.

"It is the source and summit of the Church's life, an invitation to unity as expressed in Our Lord's command: *'Love one another as I have loved you*"" (John 13:34).

The Holy Father's words greatly encourage us to renew our commitment to thank God for the magnificent, miraculous gift of Christ's presence in the Eucharist. It is a gift of infinite love!

Why are Catholic parish churches nearly ten times fuller every Sunday than non-Catholic churches? Christ told us when he said: "*By their fruits you shall know them*" (Mt 12:33).

As Christ taught us, nothing can compare with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and nothing else so unites us to Heaven.

THE ANGELUS

That Muslims are not afraid of praying in public is a good point. Unfortunately, Catholics have forgotten that we, too, also used to pray the Angelus three times a day, to honor the greatest intervention of God in History –the incarnation.

We used to stop working as 12 noon and at 6 p.m. to pause for a moment, collect our thoughts, place ourselves in God's presence and utter the beautiful prayer of thanksgiving, the Angelus.

Many centuries ago, after the Church had decided that Christmas would be celebrated on December25, She also chose the day of March 25 for the Incarnation, exactly nine months prior to Jesus' birth.

Between those dates was the time in which Our Blessed Mother carried the Word of God within Her sacred womb, thus fulfilling the Old Testament figure of the Ark of the Covenant, which carried the word of God in stone. Mary carried the Word of God made flesh.

It was at the Incarnation when "The Word was made flesh and dwelt among us" (Jn 1:14). Then the Archangel, Saint Gabriel, brought to the Blessed Virgin Mary, the great news that God would become Man, and that she was called to be the Mother of that God-Man. She was going to give birth to God in human flesh!

Have you noticed how the Morning Star, which is the same as the Evening Star, commonly known as the planet Venus, both precedes and follows the sun? It is the symbol of Our Lady. She shone in the darkness of human history before the birth of Her Son, her Divine Son. You can still see it at dawn.

While He was shining in His preaching mission, She disappears. That is the zenith. After He leaves us and goes back to the Father, She appears again, gradually, as the last ray of hope to us poor sinners at the end of our lives, which is the twilight. See how the Sun, such a big luminary in God's Creation, used to be used as a reminder for our prayers?

The Angelus, 3 Times a Day

(Dawn :) at 6 a.m. (or when you first wake up) we give thanks to God as our Creator and praise the masterpiece of His Creation: Mary, the Beloved Daughter of God the Father, the First Person of the Blessed Trinity. Mary was already in His Mind since the dawn of Creation.

(Zenith at 12 noon, (when the sun is at its zenith) We give thanks to God as our Redeemer, and praise the first one to e redeemed: Mary the Admirable Mother of God the Son, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity. Mary was the chose one who conceived the Word of God made flesh and gave birth to Him. That is how the zenith reminds us of God living in Mary.

(Twilight At 6 p.m. (when the sun is at its twilight) We give thanks to God as our Savior, and praise the greatest one to be save, who is already body and soul in Heaven: Mary, the Faithful Spouse of God the Holy Spirit, the third Person of the Blessed Trinity.

Mary conceived by the Holy Spirit, Who overshadowed her to create the human body and soul of Jesus Christ, True God and True Man, in Her virginal womb. That is how the twilight reminds us of God glorified in Mary.

THE ANGELUS PRAYER:

The Angel of the Lord declared unto Mary

And she conceived of the Holy Spirit

Hail Mary...

And the Word was made flesh (Kneel here)

And dwelt amongst us.

Hail Mary...

Pray for us, Oh Holy Mother of God

That we may e made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Let us pray:

Pour forth, we beseech Thee, Oh Lord, Your grace into our hearts that we to whom the Incarnation of Christ, Your Son, was made known by the message of an angel, may, by His Passion and Cross be brought to the glory of his Resurrection, through the same Christ, Our Lord. Amen.

REFLECTION on the MESSAGE of 8/25/2005

MAKE GOOD USE of EVERY MOMENT

In her preceding messages, Our Lady was telling us: "Live my messages; open your hearts for my messages; live my messages in humility and in love; be open for my messages; with a great joy, I am inviting you to live my messages; I am praying, that the Holy Spirit helps you and increases your faith, so that you can still more accept the messages that I give you here, in this holy place; live my messages and put into practice each word that I give you, let them be precious for you, because they come from Heaven; with me, little children, you are in safety, I wish all to lead you on the way of holiness." This is the goal of Our Lady's apparitions, of Her presence and of each word that She is addressing to us in love.

"God gave you a gift of this time as a time of grace", tells us Mary. We have received everything from God as a gift: life, time and eternity. Often, we have the impression that time is running, that we have wasted our time. People often say: I have no time. And this is why so many live under stress, are tensed, nervous and empty. Each one finds time for what he likes. We deceive ourselves when we say not to have time. If we do not have time for God, this is the sign of our lack of faith, heart and love, not only for God but also for ourselves. Those who really love themselves will find time for God, for prayer, for the encounter with themselves and with God.

We ask ourselves: why do we have to live this strange life with all its difficulties and sufferings, sins and failures, before the door of eternity opens? If God is Love, if He is so good, why didn't He give us everything at the same time? Why such a long time, before arriving at the goal? God created us imperfect, not to make life difficult to us, but to allow us to have share in his Trinitarian life. God does not want that we only receive, but that we learn how to give too. Love is giving and receiving.

God lives outside of time, in the eternal now, in the bliss of happiness where He is missing nothing. From this bliss of happiness, in this time, is coming the Virgin Mary to help us, so that we can arrive where She is. God has not created us perfect, but He gave us possibilities, which we have to develop ourselves. God gave us free will, with which we can reject Him or choose Him.

The meaning of time is in the fact that we can progress and grow. The time, in which we live, can become for us a time of grace if we choose Mary and listen to Her, who is speaking to us. This is our chance for growth. Like Mary, Saint Paul recommends to Ephesians, but to us also: "See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil. Wherefore be ye not unwise, but understanding what the will of the Lord is." (Ep 5,16-17) Saint Paul has written to the Colossians: "Walk in wisdom toward them that are without, redeeming the time." (Col 4,5) We should not waste our time, because it is precious and limited. To make use of it intelligently and to take guard of it, means to redeem it. Each time that we renounce to our selfishness and choose love, we transform our time into eternity, in life, which does not pass. Love alone is eternal and preserves us from corruption. Only the time spent in prayer is a time that is made use of. Only the time used for God and for men - in love - is a redeemed time. Let us help the Virgin Mary to lead us already now towards eternity.

THE UNDERSTANDING HEART of the HUMBLE

Have you already known the situation in which you have the impression that you have not given a good and skilful answer, the best possible answer, to certain important questions? These moments can be frequent. Important questions surprise us and we give answers with which we are not satisfied. We have difficulties to find right words and wise answers.

An episode from the Old Testament is the typical example of how to answer wisely to important questions of life. In the First Book of the Kings, we read that God, in the night, comes to Salomon and says: "Ask what I shall give you." And Solomon answers: "Give thy servant an understanding heart to judge thy people, that I may discern between good and bad." (1 Kings 3,4-10) Solomon gave a wise answer. He aspired to what is essential. He has asked for help to rule the people, which the Lord entrusted to him. Solomon passed his test of maturity what concerns the humility.

Our experience teaches us, that it is difficult for us to admit our powerlessness, our limitations, our ignorance, our fear in front of the challenges. Some think that they are experts in almost all fields of life, that they are universal scientists. They think that they know everything about history, medicine, music, sports, faith, policy, etc. In their company or in conversation with them, we feel ill at ease. Moreover, if such people take hold of power or of titles, it becomes even more complex. One has the impression that they become their own goal. Others do not exist any more, they are not important any more except as tools for exploitation and for accomplishing of individual ambitions.

The desire of Solomon to obtain a perspicacious heart is a model to be followed. In life, many things seem precious and important to us, but most important is to recognize what is really important. Solomon knows it. As a king and a leader, he is asking for help. He does not think that he can do everything, that he knows everything. His answer is reflecting one of the most splendid qualities: that is humility.

We will also be - and daily we are already - in the midst of challenges, important questions and answers. During our spiritual growth, our spiritual pilgrimage, we usually ask questions to God. However, let us not forget that God is asking us questions too. Let us thus ask for a wise heart, full of humility, a heart that is serving, like the heart of Mary. And let us not forget that, alone, we can do nothing, but God with us can really do everything - even what is impossible.

COMMUNIONS and PRIESTS

During the month of *July*, *120,000* received Holy Communion and *4022* priests from this country and abroad signed the register for celebrating Holy Mass in Medjugorje.

VISIT of a BISHOP from INDIA

Monsignor Geevarghese Mar Divannasios Ottathengil (54), Indian catholic bishop of Syro-Malankara rite, bishop of the diocese Bathery from Kerala (India), was on pilgrimage in Medjugorje at the occasion of the 24th anniversary of the apparitions. He came to Medjugorje with a group of 25 pilgrims from Switzerland. On Saturday, June 25, the Anniversary of the Apparitions, he concelebrated the evening Mass, which was presided by Father Branko Rados, the pastor of Medjugorje.

After having finished his studies in Rome, Monsignor Geevarghese went back to India where he was appointed rector of the minor and of the major seminary in his diocese. He was named bishop in 1997. In 2003, during his ad limina visit in Rome, Holy Father said that the syro-malankara Church was one of the fastest growing Churches in the world. The diocese of Bathery exists since 1979. There are about 25.000 Catholics, 98 priests, about 250 religious sisters, 45 seminarians and many vocations. The western relativism is penetrating big cities, but not the countryside, because the religious roots are very strong.

Monsignor Geevarghese gave his testimony about Medjugorje:

"I heard about Medjugorje for the first time about 15-20 years ago, but I was doubting. I was not very much interested in coming here, but a friend of mine, a priest from Switzerland, told me about Medjugorje and about his experience. His attitude as a priest had tremendously changed after Medjugorje. He was praying well, and in his relationship with others, he became very human. He is a real priest now! That made me think: There must be something in Medjugorje?! Roman Gruether told me that Medjugorje was different from other places of pilgrimages, that the natural atmosphere is kept, and that people are really praying here. Last year, I made up my mind to come and see. I came now with a group from Switzerland led by Sylvia Keller.

My experience is corresponding to my expectations. These 3 days are a confirmation. One can feel the family spirit here. People who are involved in the service, even the smallest service, do it with love and with joy. This place gives us also the experience of the universal family. Everyone feels here at home, like in one's mothers house. I met the visionaries; I visited Marija, Ivan and Vicka. I think that they are real visionaries. Medjugorje will be recognized, there is no doubt! Today or tomorrow, maybe little later, it will surely be recognized!

These messages are really needed. Prayer, Holy Mass, penance, confession, fasting, conversion. At any age, they are the fundamentals of spiritual life. Without Jesus, there is no spiritual life. Self-denial, living for God and for others. Often, we are tempted to think that, at the modern age, we are competing with God. But we have to realize that human beings are limited. Catastrophes help us understand our limits. September 11th, or Tsunami... we understand how small we are.

Medjugorje is for our time a real call from God. The people who live here are fortunate. You have a special vocation. You have to keep this universal brotherhood. This is not only for this parish, this region, this diocese... It is for the whole world. You have to promote this universal spirit."

FEAST of SAINT JAMES, PATRON SAINT of the PARISH

On July 25, feast of Saint James the Apostle, the parish of Medjugorje celebrated its patron saint. In the morning, according to the custom, the Eucharistic

celebration began and ended by the singing the litany of All the Saints and a procession with the statue of the Patron Saint, which was carried by the residents of Vasilji. Holy Mass was concelebrated by numerous local and several foreign priests in the little park near the church. It was presided by Father Tomislav Puljic, and concelebrated by the Herzegovinian provincial Father Slavko Soldo, and the pastor of Medjugorje Father Branko Rados. The parishioners prepared themselves for the feast of their patron and of the patron saint of the pilgrims by a tridium.

16th INTERNATIONAL YOUTH PRAYER FESTIVAL

The International Youth Prayer Meeting in Medjugorje took place also this year from August 1 to 6. About 25.000 young people from all over the world gathered together. There were also about 400 priests, who accompanied their young parishioners to this meeting.

The theme of the meeting was, "We came to adore him". During the evening prayer programme, numerous other pilgrims joined young people, and about 30.000 faithful participated in the programme each evening.

Lecturers and witnesses invited young people to come to know Jesus Christ who is a brother for each one of us and the Savior of humanity, and whom young people need so much today, and to adore him. The General Minister of the Franciscans OFM, Father Jose Carballo, assisted at this encounter and spoke to the youth.

This meeting was another exceptional spiritual experience for all young people who participated. This is why we invite them to come next year again to Medjugorje and to renew their fidelity to God, to the Holy Father and to the Church.

The meeting was simultaneously translated into 15 languages.

SOLEMNITY of the ASSUMPTION

Several thousands of local and foreign pilgrims came to Medjugorje for the solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. During the morning, Masses were celebrated in about ten languages. The solemn evening Mass was presided by Father Ljubo Kurtovic, and concelebrated by 34 priests. Also this year, numerous Croatian pilgrims came on bare feet. They were arriving already during the night, after having walked many kilometres.

SEMINARS IN "DOMUS PACIS"

There were 3 "Prayer and Fasting" seminars led by Father Ljubo Kurtovic for pilgrims from Russia and from Croatia and Bosnia-Herzegovina. There was also a seminar of contemplative prayer led by Father Mladen Herceg.

As a preparation for the Feast of the Pentecost, 3 prayer groups from Zagreb made a retreat. Young people from Split wit the Salesian Fathers, young people from Medjugorje, Franciscan Youth Fraternities from Herzegovina also made their retreats. In August, the Art Colony stayed also there.

THE 6TH INTERNATIONAL MEETING for MARRIED COUPLES

The 6th International Meeting for Married Couples will take place in Medjugorje from October 26 to 29, 2005. The theme of the seminar is "Dialog in the Family - How to Educate Children?"

Bring with you: a small FM radio with headphones (for simultaneous translation) and a Bible. The seminar will take place in Medjugorje in the New Hall. Participation per couple: 40 Euro. The number of participants is limited because of the available space in the Hall, so we ask you to send your registration as soon as possible, latest by the end of September. PRAYER COVERING for YOUR LIFE

Father, I pray this prayer in the power of the Holy Spirit and in the name of Jesus.

In the name of Jesus Christ, I bind, rebuke, and make powerless, all division, discord, disunity, strife, anger, wrath, murder, criticism, condemnation, pride, envy, jealousy, gossip, slander, evil speaking, complaining, lying, false teaching, false gifts, false manifestations, lying signs and wonders, poverty, spirit of fear, murmuring spirits, hindering spirits, retaliatory spirits, deceiving spirits, false religious spirits, occult spirits, witchcraft spirits, and spirits of antichrist (Say 3xs .)

In Jesus' name, I break all curses that have been spoken against me. (Say 3xs). I bless those who curse, me, and pray blessings on those who spitefully use me. I bind all spoken judgment against me and judgments I have made against others. I bind the power of negative words from others, and I bind and render useless all prayers not inspired by the Holy spirit, whether psychic, soul force, witchcraft, or counterfeit tongues that have been prayed against me. (Say 3x).

I am your child, Father. With your Holy Spirit guarding me, I can resist the devil' let all fear be removed from me now. No weapon formed against me shall prosper. I put on the whole armor of God (ph 6). In Jesus' name, I take authority over the spiritual evil and darkness that has come my way and send it to the foot of the Cross. (Say 3xs). Let me walk in your love, Lord. The Holy Spirit leads and guides me today. I need your help to discern between the righteous and the wicked.

Lord Jesus, in your name and authority, I take authority over the evil one and all his demons, and those people who are influenced by them. (Say 3x). I ask for the spiritual gifts to know and identify where evil is lurking. I call upon your power to dispel and send the many forms of darkness back to the great abyss. Satan, you are bound from my life, my mind, my body, my home, my property, and my finances.

EARTHEN VESSELS



So full of life it could no longer contain it, the earth has released the life it was silently bearing, generously showering us in an abundance of colors, scents and freshness. But where were these colors hidden: a myriad of hues of varying intensity now scattered in fields and along roadsides. balconies beautifying and gardens? Where were they lain,

the petals of this' rose now unfolding so elegantly? How could the dry branches of the wisteria vine hide this glory of mauve clusters now sweetening the air and enlightening hearts?

Spring is here, in all its beauty, and though we might often take it all for granted, one only needs to look beyond a little further to see the mystery that each time reveals new secrets. **Nature is the best book in which to see God's face.**

Each season bears a different expression of His face; conducted by Wisdom all things are brought to maturation, in perfect harmony with each other. Everything is punctual and responds with obedience to the impulses of time, mysteriously synchronized to the laws which every being bears within itself; they are the laws which regulate growth and bring all creatures into the fullness of life.

I look out the window of the chapel in my convent and my heart is delighted as I see the thousands of red poppies inflaming the side of the mountain and the golden field of growing ears of grain. My gaze lowers, closer .to home, and admires the intricate weaving of branches, the architecture of-the-leaves and of the wings of birds: all so admirable, so perfect...

It is a dawn at the end of May, and from the open window next to the Tabernacle I see the sun rising, and as though it were a-play of mirrors I see two *suns* reflecting each other, both of them sources of life, light and warmth: one the creature, the Other its Creator.

It is precisely in this space which separates them that the soul must seek every response to so much beauty and perfection. It isn't just a matter of science or art, but of love which flows out from God's heart and is manifested in us; in His creation. Here, in front of the- Eucharist, the questions are transformed. Into silence, admiration and gratitude, and quieted with rays of clarity. In this God here before me, mysteriously hidden in a fragment of Bread, every existence is recapitulated in Him: from Him they depart and to Him they return because every birth and every death, every form and every substance is contained in Him. In this space, the blue sky out there beyond my window is impressed in my soul, bringing cheer, serenity, and comfort.

As I write I am ever more enveloped by the sun that has dispersed the darkness that was. As I pray, Eucharistic Jesus fills that senseless void that I felt when I awoke. I don't need to do anything, just stay here and surrender myself to Him. And while in this part of the world people-are waking, I allow God to take care of the world that I bear within me: my past and my present, those who love me and those who ask for support, the facts of yesterday and the plans for today. It all appears immobile, yet it is all in motion, moved by the invisible life which unceasingly gushes from the bosom of the Most Holy Trinity in Whom all is generated and all is linked.

In a few days it will be Pentecost. The air is already laden with patient expectation and anxious impatience, in the certainty that the Holy Spirit will make spring blossom in us, extracting from every soul that potential of life and beauty that we all : bear within ourselves and which often lies dormant.

Just as the earth is enriched by fruits and flowers, aromas and flavors, we too can make our surroundings richer if we allow the Creator Spirit to express Himself in us. Our bodies, like precious caskets, are not always aware of the treasure they contain: "We have this treasure in earthen vessels, "points out Saint Paul, "to show that the transcendent power belongs to God and, not to us" (2 Co 4:7).

The Spirit of God which "*hovered over the waters*" (Gen 1:2) desires continuing His creating action in us and through us. Almost as though we were wind

instruments He desires playing a new song to the world, and on each of us a different tune is played, but the breath is only one and belongs to I the Lord. It is He Who animates and: harmonizes us to make our lives and the communion between us become a vibrant symphony. When we are inwardly open to the Life which flows through our beings to fill us, it surprises us to see so much I abundance and variety and we ask ourselves: where in me was all this beauty hidden?

I thank You, Heavenly Father for Your Love. I thank You, Holy Spirit for empowering me to be aggressive against Satan and evil spirits. I thank You, Jesus, for Page 18 **Th** setting me free. I thank You, Mary, for interceding for me with the holy angels and the saints.

Lord Jesus, fill me with charity, compassion, faith, gentleness, hope, humility, joy, kindness, light, love, mercy, modesty, patience, peace, purity, security, tranquility, trust, truth, understanding, and wisdom. Help me to walk in Your Light and Truth, illuminated by the Holy Spirit so that together we may praise, honor, and glorify Our Father in time and in eternity. A STORY OF HEALING – AN EXORCISM

In the third week of the month of August in the year 1975, almost a hundred priests experienced at a retreat an Exorcism which may have haunted them ever since and certainly instructed them on the reality of Satan.

The priest who performed the Exorcism with his team had been given Ecclesial permission by the Bishop. The retreat was focused on healing. However, it was an unexpected situation that the healing process and teaching should include a deliverance and exorcism.

During all the time of the Exorcism, conferences were given explaining the spiritual dimensions linked to deliverance. I feel that this retreat was one of the foundation stones in the establishment of ACT (Association of Christian Therapists). I consciously forgive, in the name of my family anyone who was responsible for their deaths or hurts and I beg forgiveness from all those we may have hurt, killed or destroyed for whatever reason. I pray your blessings especially on the person or persons who caused the initial hurt in my immediate family line and I ask you to deliver my whole family from the effects of that pain.

Father most powerful and all-just, I pray in the name of Jesus and in the outpouring of precious blood that all bondages or curses, whitn and against my family be broken especially that of a parent's curse (3x). I pray in a special way for all those who suffered or who still suffer from any types of mental illness, depression, rejection, dysfunction, anxiety false guilt or negativity and for any who suffered or who presently suffer from hereditary illnesses. Be they physical or spiritual, free us and make us whole and new as you did the leper in scripture.

Father most deserving of praise, I thank you for your forgiveness. I praise you for the depths of your love and the outpouring of your gifts. Release in my family all the suppressed and hidden gifts that we may use them to praise and thank you and thus make you more visible in our family and in our community. Finally Father, increase within me the gifts of faith, love and gratitude that I may not only believe that you can hear these petitions but that you will answer them. WHAT IS A PRIEST

MEN of WITNESS

Priests are called to be men of personal prayer who proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ. The heart of the priesthood is the celebration of the Eucharist and the teaching, sanctifying, and leading of those in their spiritual care.

Priests proclaim, celebrate, and live the Death and Resurrection of Jesus. They bear witness that new life and hope are more powerful than sin and death. Priests remind others of the dignity and sanctity of all human life and have a special love for the poor.

MEN for OTHERS

As Jesus made the journey with his disciples on the road to Emmaus, so too, does the priest journey with his people.

Most diocesan priests serve in parishes, ministering to the day-to-day needs of their people. Others serve in specialized ministries and are chaplains in prisons, hospitals, high schools, and colleges, or serve in diocesan administration.

A TRUE DISCIPLE of JESUS

If they claim to be Christian but listen to other voices and follow other ways they are building their spiritual life on sand. It takes discipline to learn and to follow the Lord in order to become a true disciple. So how are we to learn and how are we to be disciplined? How can we know the teachings of Jesus?

Jesus teaches, "A house built on sand will collapse when the wind and the rain come, but a house built on rock will stand. Simon becomes that 'rock' when his name is changed from Simon to Peter. It was to Peter the first Pope to whom He gave the Keys of the Kingdom and the power to bind and loose on earth, when Peter first spoke those infallible words proclaiming Him to be the Christ. Pope Peter was crucified for those teachings.

A few months ago we heard those exciting words. Habemus Papam". "We have a Pope." Joseph Cardinal Ratzinger was our new German Pope. His name like the first Pope was also changed he is to be known as Pope Benedict XVI. The voices of the media referred to him as a Vatican rottweiler but the voices of those sheep that recognize the voice of the Master call him Our German Shepherd. Those who have been disciplined by Christ's teachings are His True Disciples and will gladly follow the True Shepherd, the successor of Saint Peter. So don't be surprised if some are ready with the nails.

RECEIVING THE HOLY EUCHARIST, WELCOMING THE GREAT MYSTERY

The Eucharist allows us to live a never-ending miracle. When the words "this is my Body", "this is the cup of my Blood", are spoken the bread and wine are miraculously transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ.

Certainly it is true that, unlike other extraordinary happenings that are recognized as "miracles", the transformation is neither visibly proven nor verifiable.

And so, although the Eucharist does not offer us "miracles" in the usual sense of the word, it offers us authentic miracles looked at with the eyes of faith: the supernatural transformation of a food and drink that, by virtue of the words of the priest, become the Body and Blood of the Savior.

It is a marvel that deserves to be further examined: it reveals the extraordinary wealth of the Christian Life.

It is clearly and everlasting miracle because Eucharistic celebrations are offered in the Church one after the other each day. Without interruption, and there does not exist a moment of the day when there is not a Consecration. Thousands of Masses are celebrated throughout the world, ceaselessly renewing the presence of the Body and Blood of the Lord.

The Church is continually nourished and strengthened by the Eucharist, in such a way that the life of Jesus must be seen as a continual miracle involving the divine omnipotence in both his greatest and most hidden manifestations: "greatest", because the Eucharist introduces the divine presence every where it is celebrated; hidden", because this presence remains invisible.

There are also more solemn celebrations, deliberately intended to highlight worship, facilitate a better appreciation of its qualities and emphasize its importance in Church witness.

We cannot forget that there are many celebrations that join together a very modest number of faithful and are carried out with great simplicity. The exterior simplicity contrasts with the greatness of the Mystery being celebrated.

In the Eucharistic banquet the distance remains between what appears in bread and wine and what is offered in food and drink. Those who participate in the Eucharist by receiving Holy Communion are invited to cover the distance with an act of faith.

With the multiplication of the loaves, Jesus invited those who were present to believe. He obtained a profession of faith from Peter: "You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe; we are convinced that you are God's Holy One" (Jn: 6:69). This faith alone allows for an intense participation in the Mystery. The permanence of the miracle is more specifically highlighted in worship dedicated to the Eucharistic presence. This presence remains intact following the Consecration and Communion.

The words of Consecration have an effect that is not time-limited. Once it has been made present on the Altar, the Body of Christ remains, without losing anything of itself.

The **PFMC** is not a church, store or travel agency but has aspects of all three. The **PFMC** operates as a non-profit, with 501(c)(3) tax exempt status, religious association and ministry whose volunteers are lay persons professing a belief in Jesus Christ, Our Lord and Savior, as the Only Begotten Son of God the Father, Creator of the Universe.

Most **PFMC** volunteers profess that faith through the apostolic and universal teachings of the Roman Catholic Church. Those volunteers who are practicing Roman Catholics profess allegiance to the Magisterium of the Church founded upon the Rock (Kephas / Cephas or Petros depending on original or translation) of Simon bar Jonah and led by his apostolic successor **Pope John Paul II**.

The *PFMC* was established in the home of **Keith** and **Kathleen Werner** based on pilgrimages to **Medjugorje, Bosnia-Herzegovina**, and other holy places or shrines worthy of pilgrimage. Books, pamphlets, and religious articles brought back from pilgrimages were placed on display for others to view and acquire for themselves based on donations. Our displays and inventory bins are quite extensive.

The **PFMC** is directed and operated by volunteers who monitor the donations made for all activities. These activities include coordination of pilgrimages to holy places and shrines, retreats in local retreat centers or hotels, and days of recollection at the *PFMC* as well as the displays, library, and inventory management described in this article.

Operating for many years on a cash only basis, the **PFMC** now accepts **DISCOVER/PRIVATE ISSUE** (NOVUS), MASTER CARD (CIRRUS) and VISA (PLUS) for all transactions requiring donations to the **PFMC**. This includes for books and religious articles, pilgrimages, retreats, conferences, seminars, "*The PILGRIM*," or any of the various funds. We ask that those who use credit cards assist us with the costs associated with their use, about 3%.

The **PFMC** is NOT a store and does not sell anything. We strongly support the use of Catholic stores wherever they are convenient to our readers. For books, pamphlets, and religious articles, the **PFMC** operates like a church pamphlet or book rack where selections are made and donations offered based on value posted or received. Most of the other outlets are operating on a for profit basis. Your gifts from the **PFMC** may be a tax break for you.

The *PFMC* has items from inventory on display at **Epiphany House**. The inventory management volunteers, currently **Vince** and **Livia Nocella**, are always happy to find something for you.

We need volunteers to help us get the entire inventory available for production of order forms. We eventually want to take pictures and load up a shopping cart program so that Internet users can see our Inventory on-line. If you have inventory or computer skills we would love to have your help.
